Introduction

Based on the administration of the Illinois Youth Survey (2020), this report provides county-level data on a variety of health and social indicators including drug use, bullying, school climate, and much more. The data has been organized into topical sections as noted in the table of contents on the next page. In most cases, only a portion of schools in a county participate in the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS). County reports will only be generated when there are two or more eligible public schools from two or more districts participating at the 8th, 10th or 12th grade level. Eligible public schools are regular public schools, not specialized, that contain at least 10 students at the 8th, 10th or 12th grade level, and thus are part of the pool of schools from which the statewide sample is drawn. There will be NO DATA presented in this report for any grade level with only one district reporting. This is to protect the confidentiality of district-level results.

The IYS is offered to both public and private schools. In order to have the best understanding of how well the results in this report reflect the experiences of the youth in this county, several factors should be considered including: Public School Building Participation, Public School Student Participation, and Private School Student Participation.

Public School Building Participation

In Table 1, the number of eligible public schools (i.e. contain at least 10 students at the 8th, 10th or 12th grade level) is compared with the actual number of IYS participating public schools in the county.

Public School Student Participation

Table 2 provides a comparison between the actual number of students surveyed and the number of all students enrolled in public schools within the county. This percentage can be increased by surveying more schools and students within the county. Again, enrollment totals are based on student enrollment at public schools with at least 10 enrolled students at the 8th, 10th or 12th grade level. Table 2 is based solely on public school students due to the lack of available enrollment information for private schools. There will be NO DATA presented in this report for any grade level with fewer than 10 valid surveys (in the column "N Students Surveyed"). This is to protect the confidentiality of your students.

Note that the data presented in this report includes both public and private schools that participated in this county. If schools that serve youth in specialized settings like charter schools, alternative schools, etc. participated in the IYS, these students are represented in the survey results but are not included in data summaries presented in Table 2 or Table 3 above.

Organization of the Report (Data Tables and Charts)

Tables can be helpful when you are looking for a summary of responses for particular survey questions, for example, the percentage of 8th grade youth who report using prescription pain killers to get high. Some tables may contain a mean score (an average of all the responses), a median score (the middle point of all responses given) or an “N” (number of students who responded to that question). Tables can also be useful when you need specific data to support a grant or report. If you see an “**N/A**” (**Not Applicable**) noted in a table, this indicates that the question was **not asked at that grade level**. If you see an “**N/R**” (**Not Reported**) noted in a table, this indicates, unless otherwise specified, that at least 90% of students skipped the question for no known reason, making the results too biased to report. For Tables that are “among users” only grade levels with “at least one user” will display; grade levels with “0” users will not show.

Summary charts can be helpful to view multiple questions in one place (e.g., use of different drugs to determine which is the most used) and to compare your results with the scientific sample of Illinois students who participated in the 2018 IYS. State level results from the 2020 IYS will not be available until late fall. IYS state level norms from 2018 are a good benchmark for immediate decision-making because state estimates stay relatively stable across two IYS administration years. To locate the starting page of the Summary Charts, refer to the Table of Contents on the next page. For Charts that are “among users” only grade levels with “at least 10 users” will display.

Keep in mind that the IYS 8th grade form does not include all questions asked on the IYS high school form. For that reason, responses to some questions do not appear in the tables and charts for some grade levels. If you would like to determine what section includes responses to a specific survey item or verify if a question was asked at a specific grade level, please refer to the Site Report Appendix on our website <http://iys.cprd.illinois.edu/results>. When looking at percentages, keep in mind that 0% is a rounded number and does not mean "0" people affected.

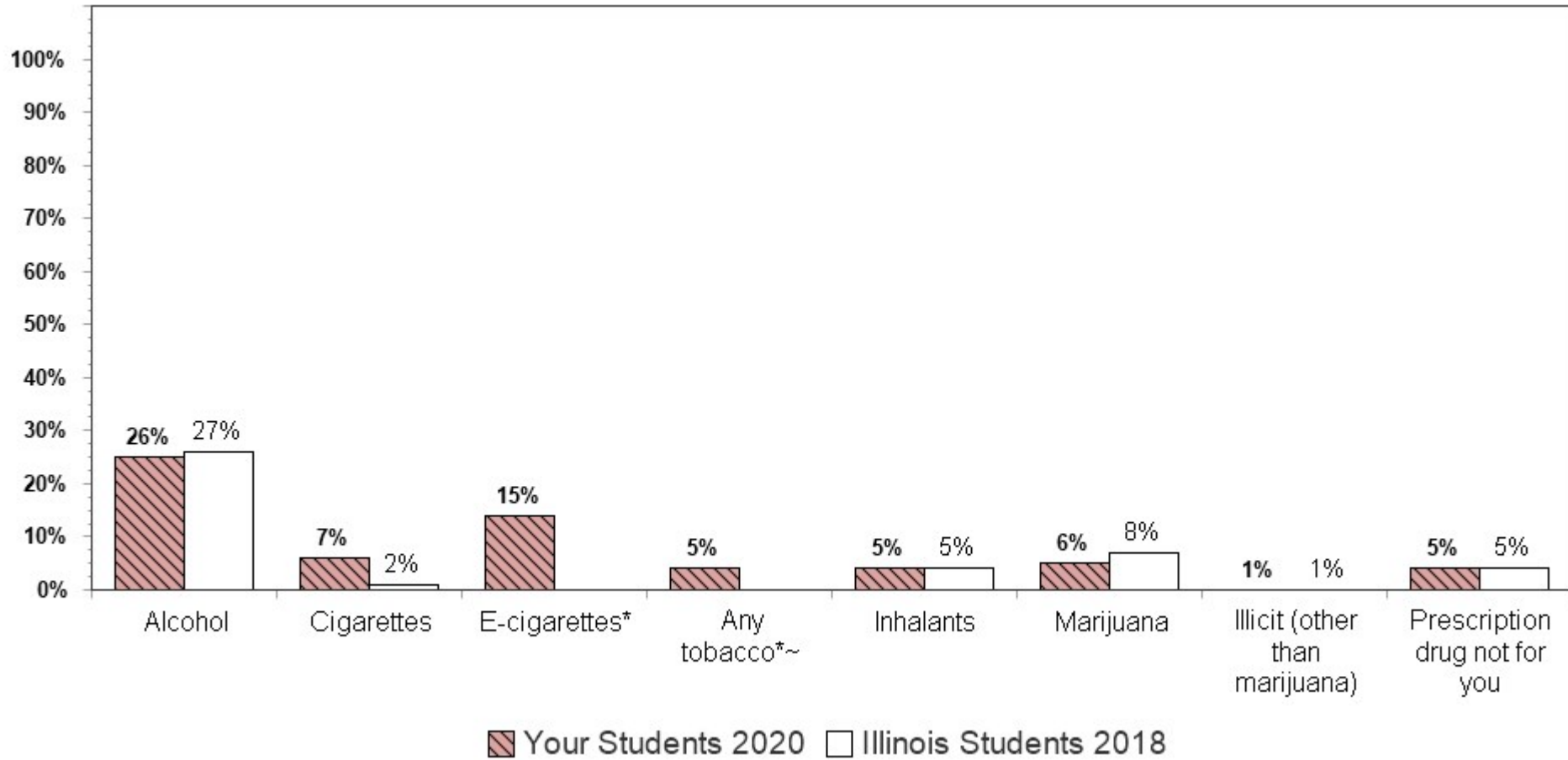

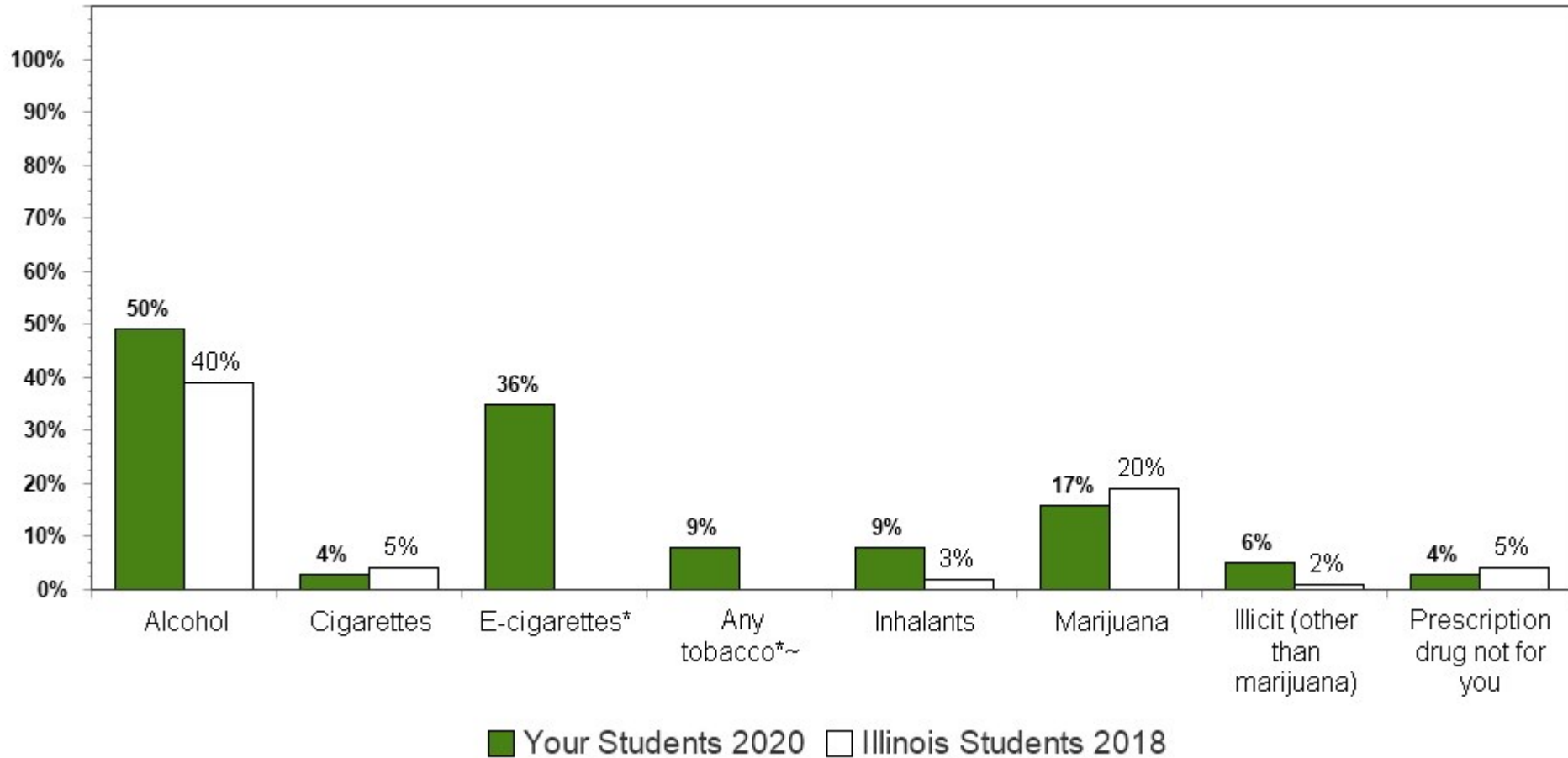
Substance Use in the Past Year Among 8th Grade Youth

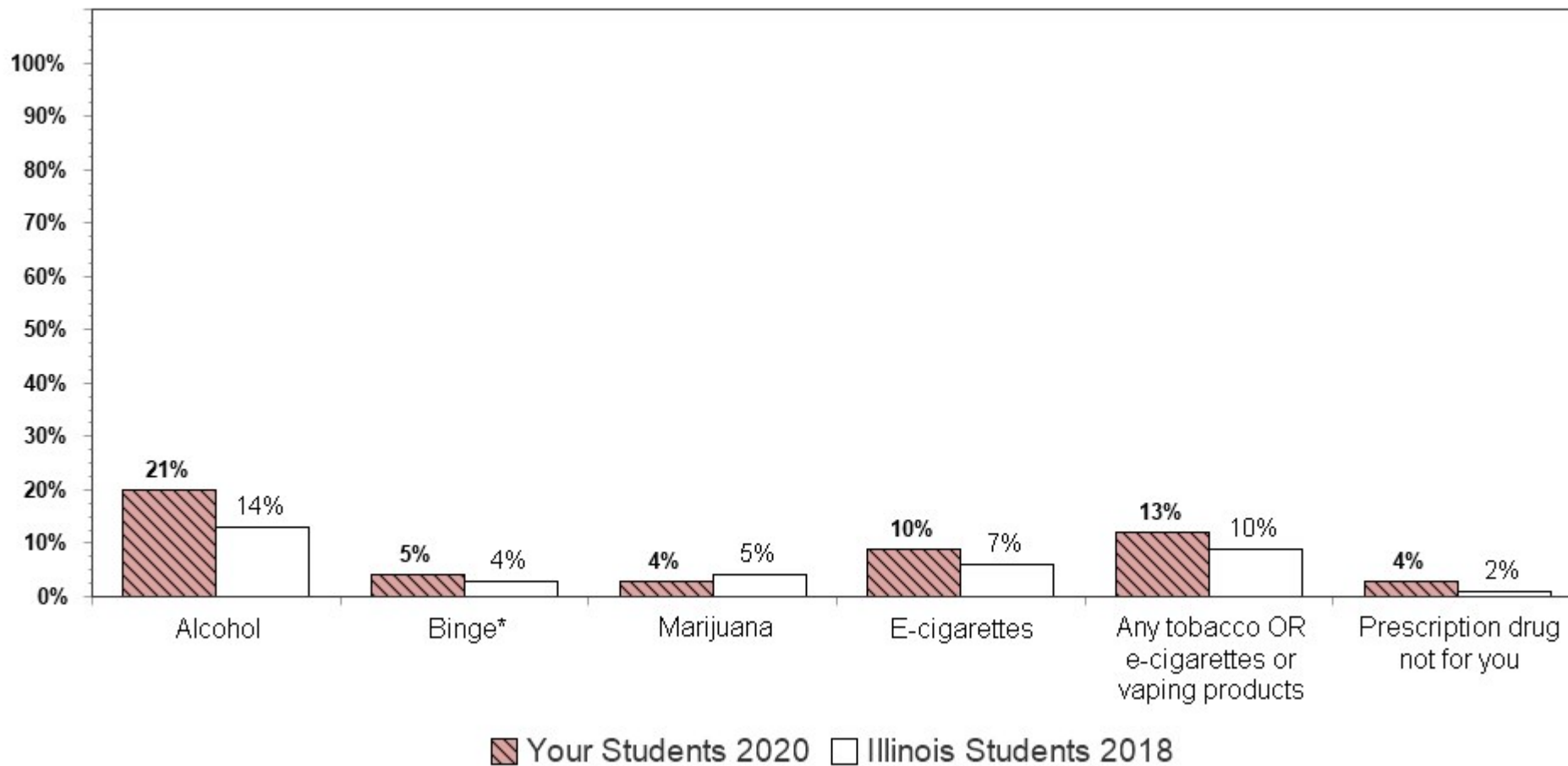
Substance Use in the Past Year Among 10th Grade Youth

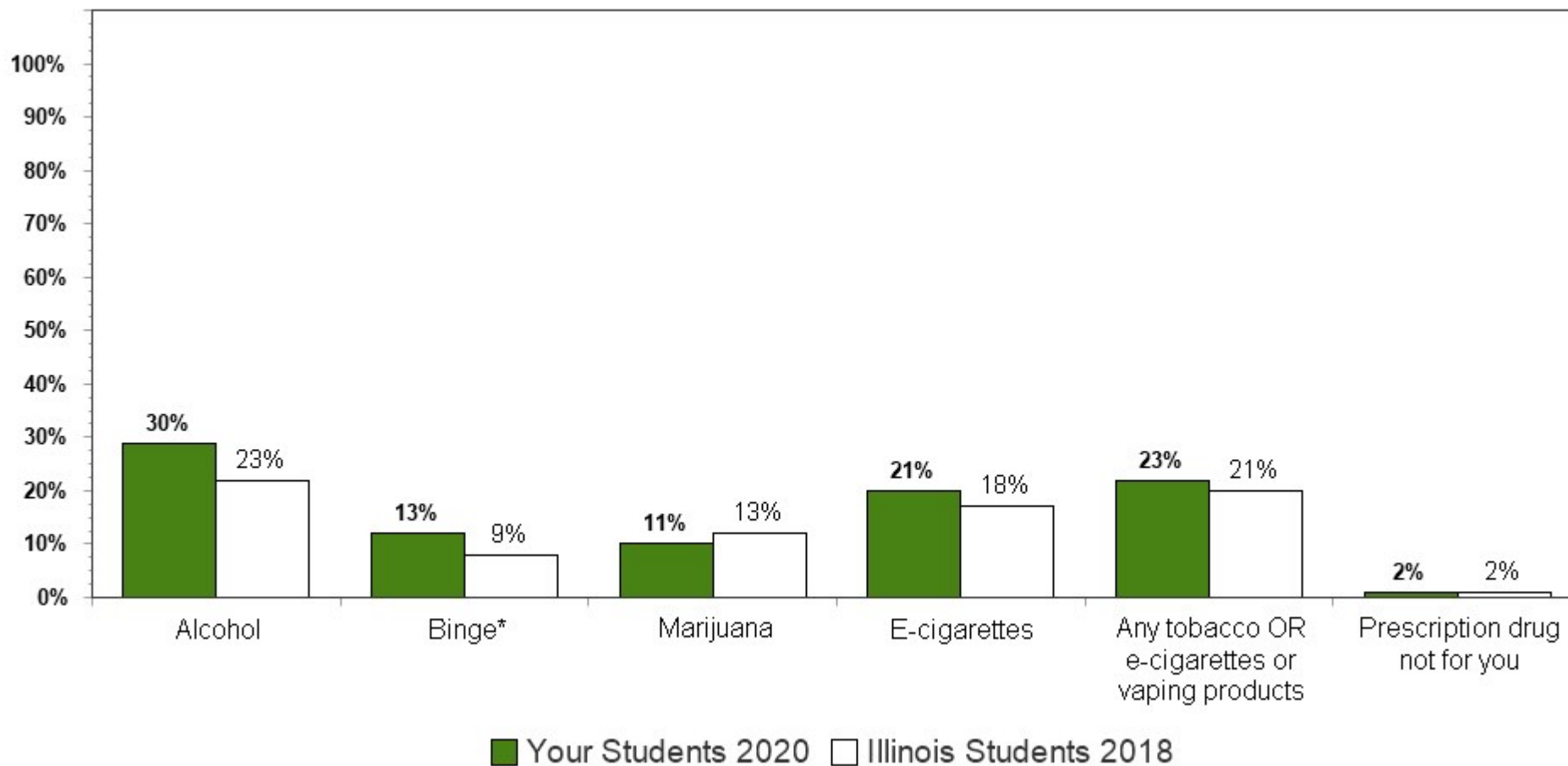
Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 8th Grade Youth

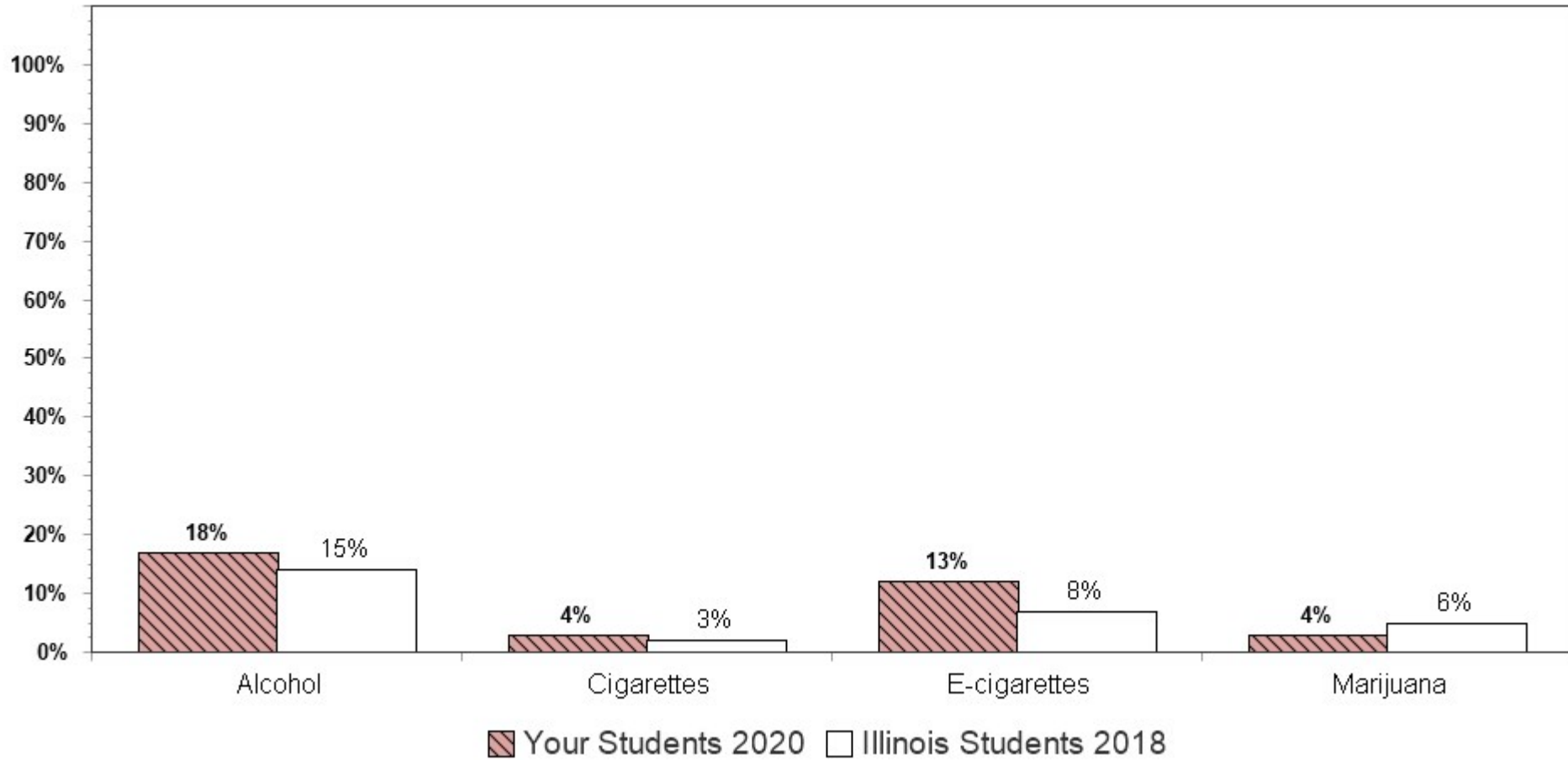
Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 10th Grade Youth



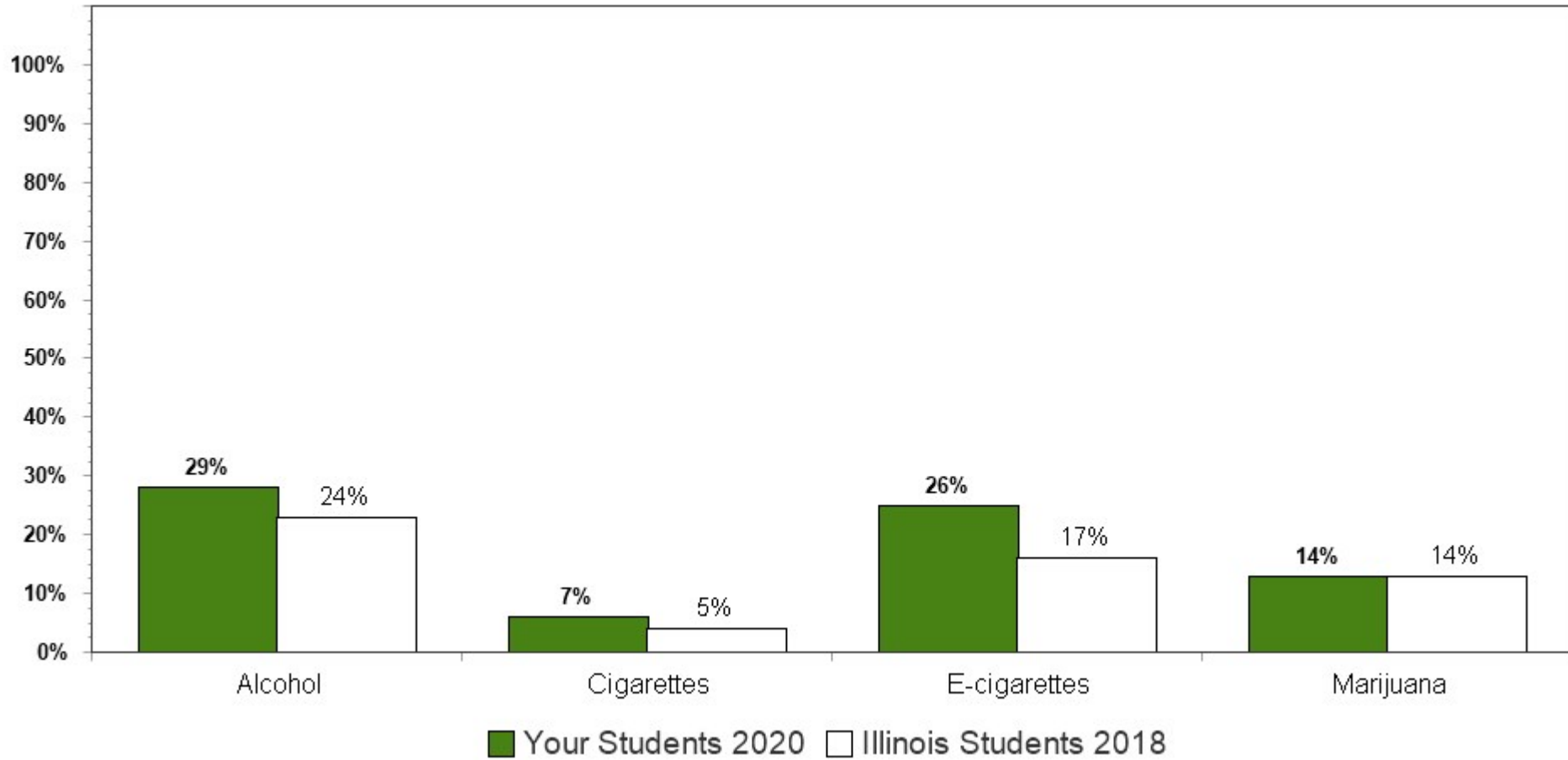

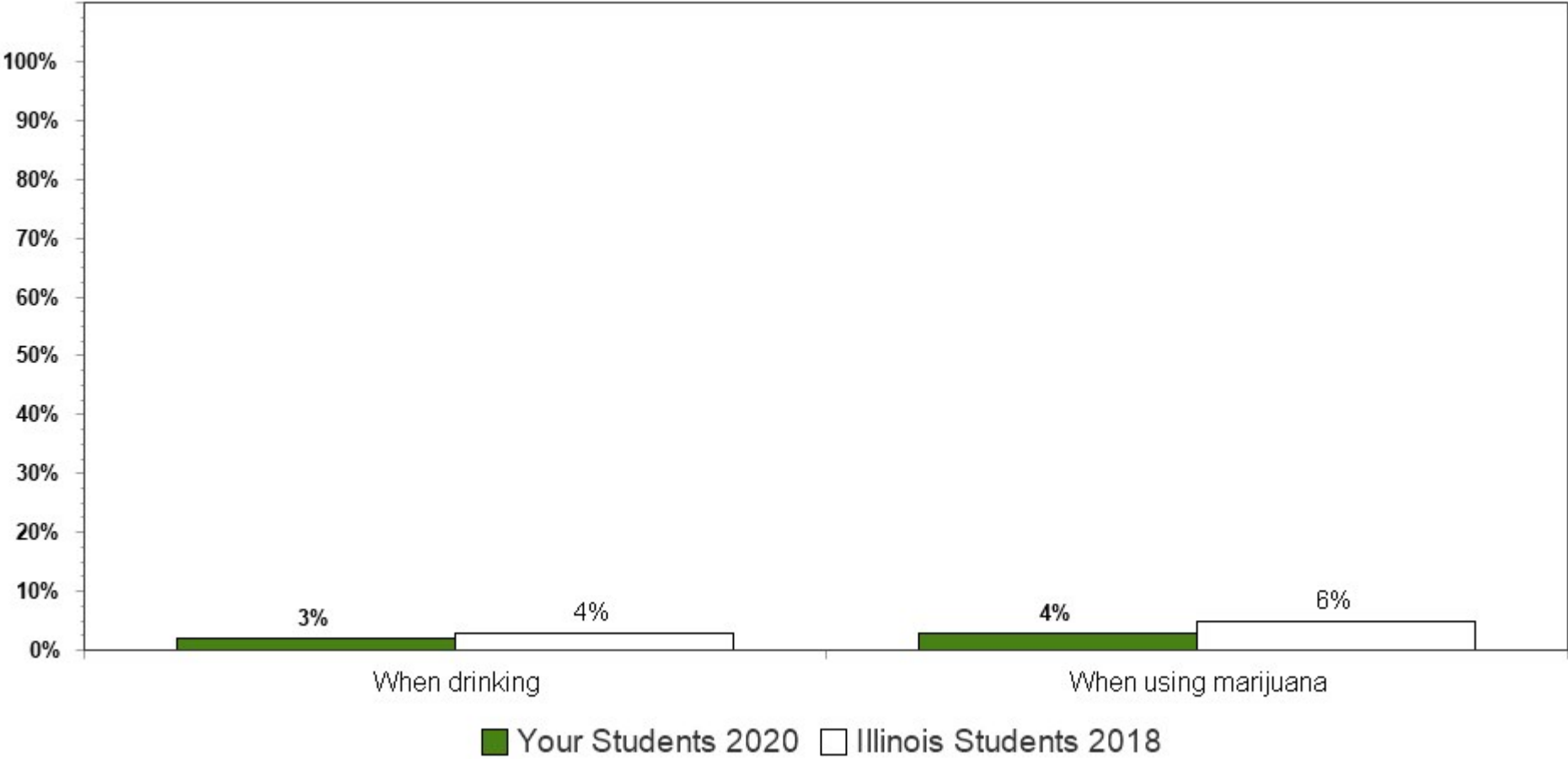
First Use (New Users) in the Past 12 Months Among 8th Grade Youth



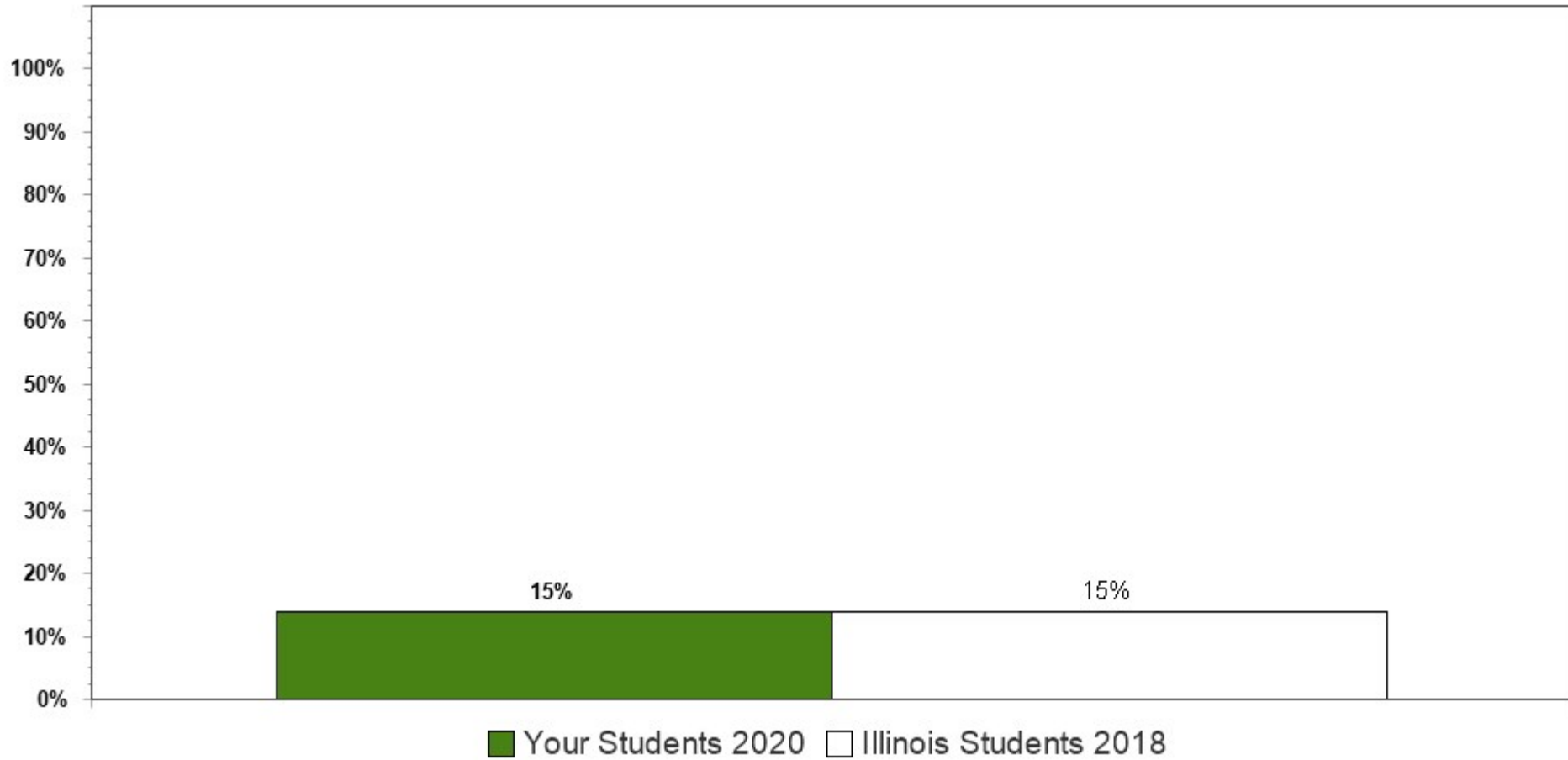
First Use (New Users) in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth



Driving Under the Influence in the Past Year Among 10th Grade Youth

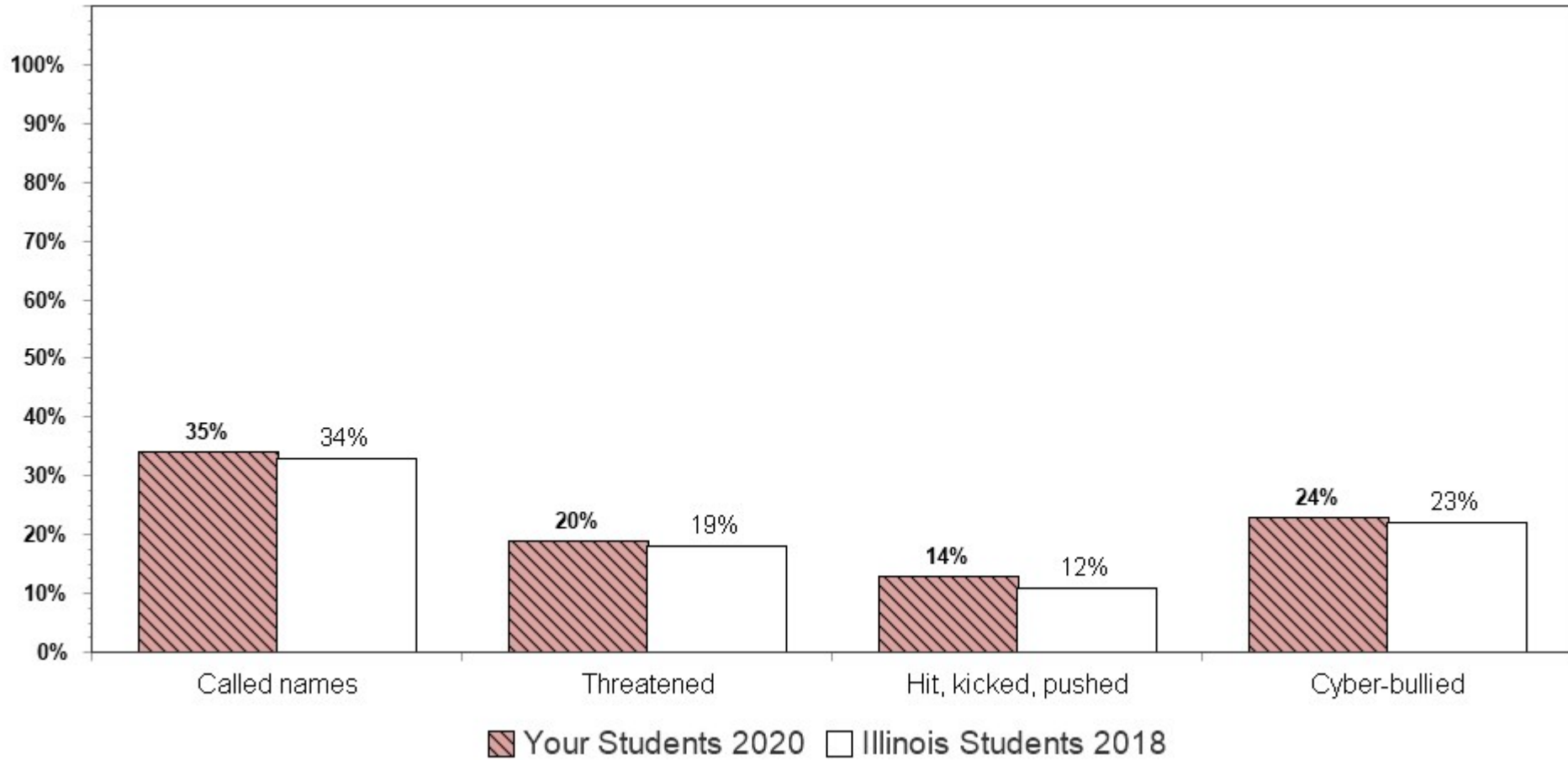


High School Students Who Experienced 2 or More Consequences* Among 10th Grade Youth

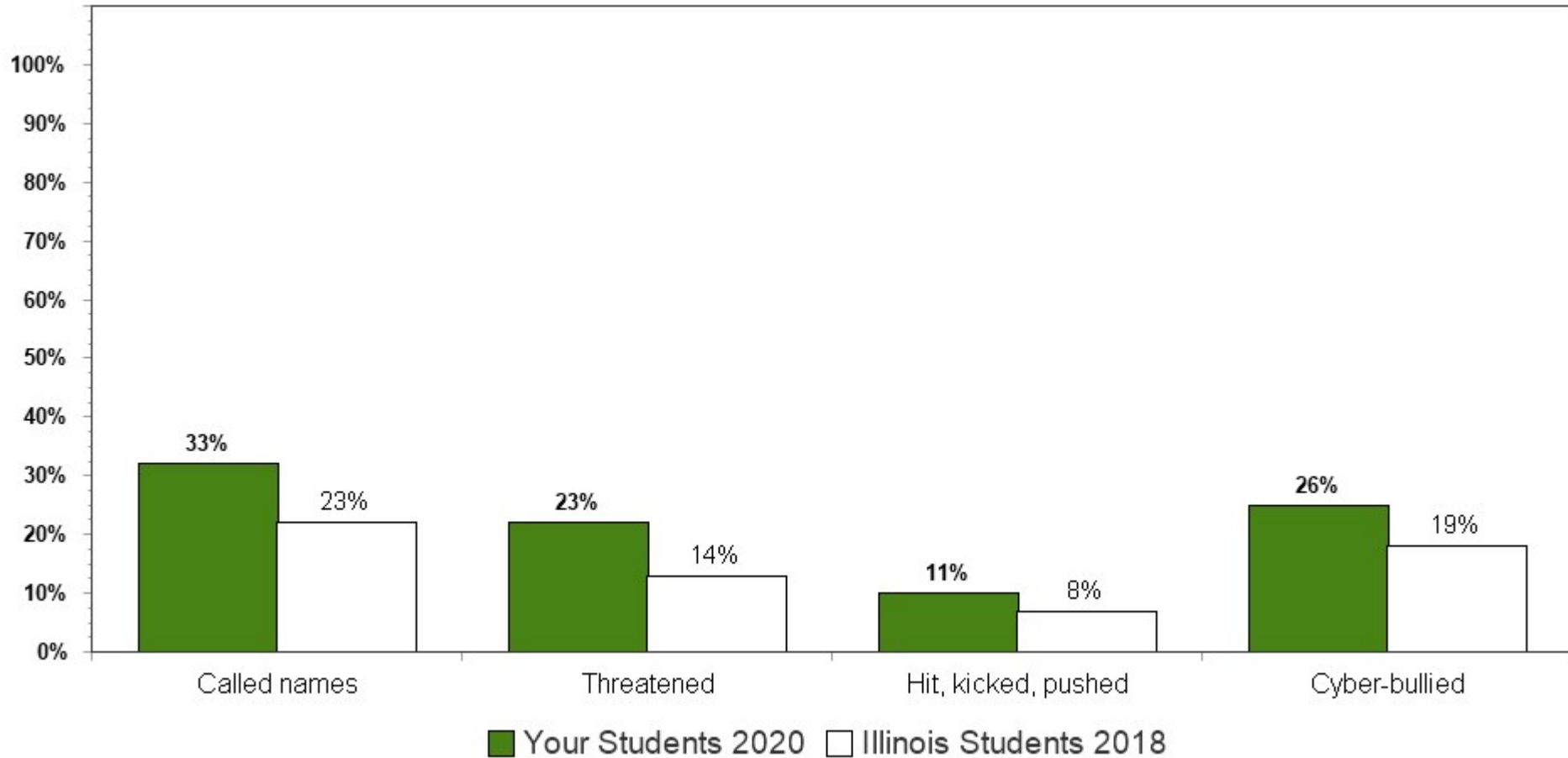

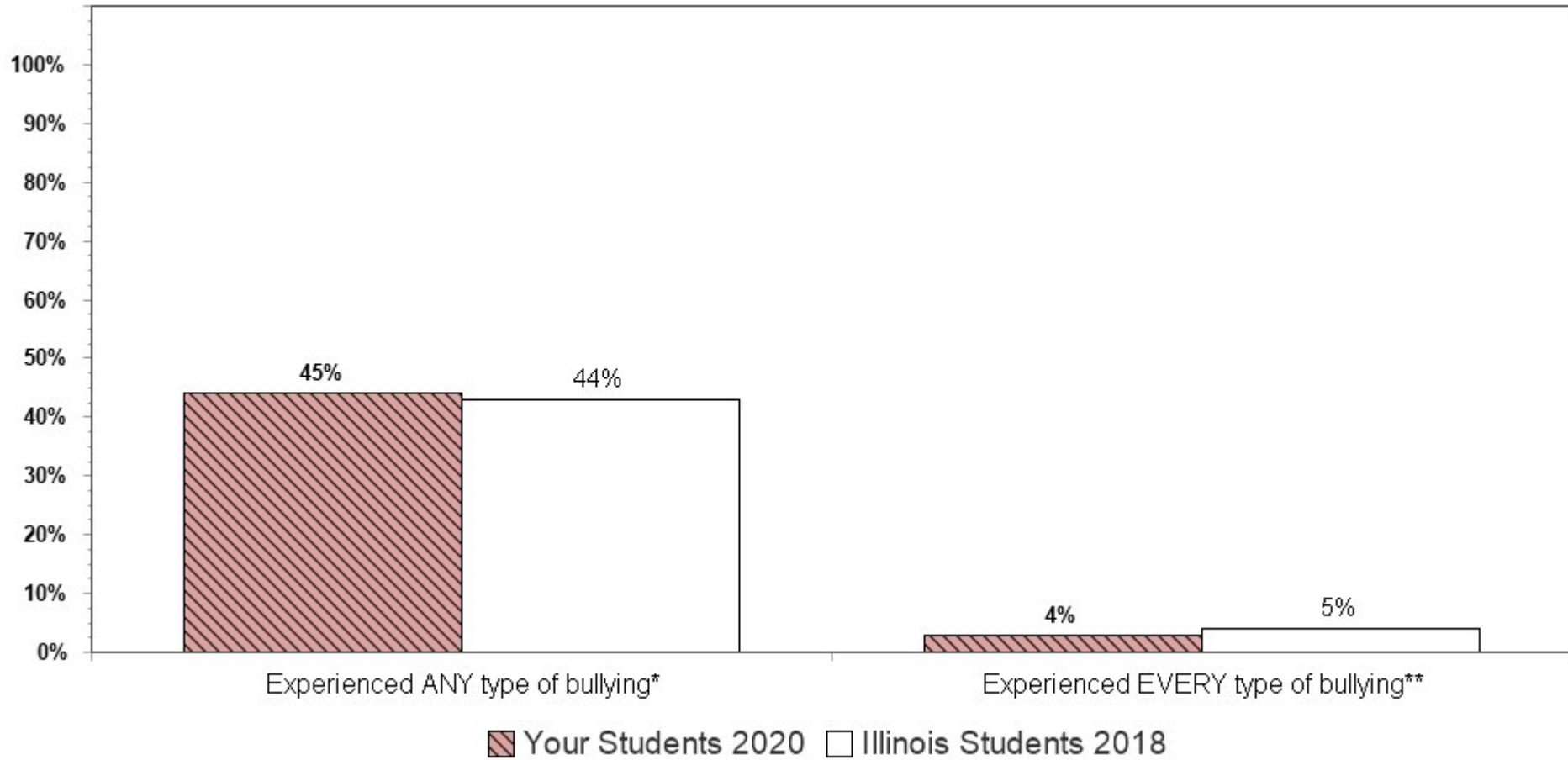
Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 8th Grade Youth



Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth



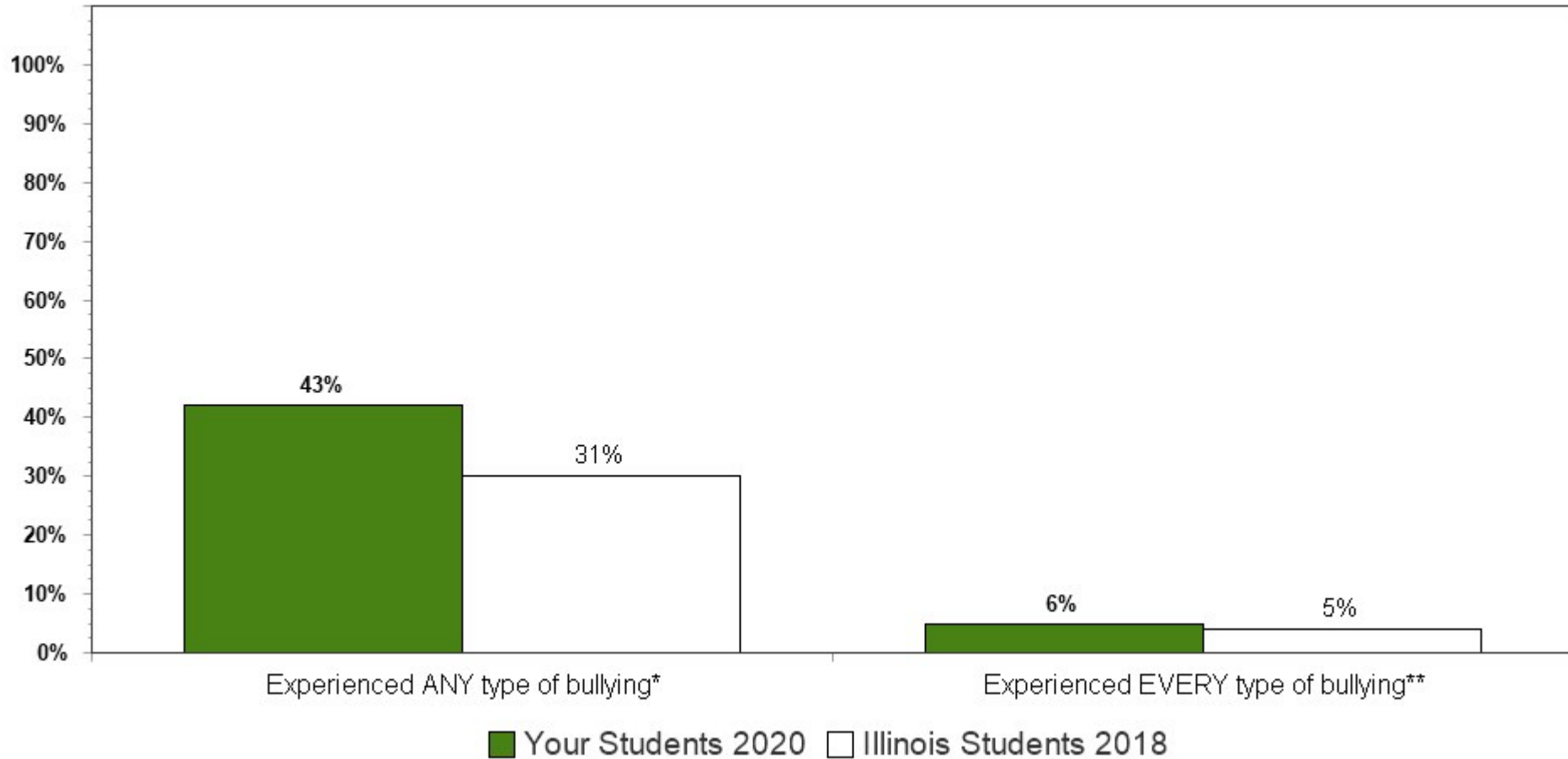
Extent of Bullying in the Past 12 Months Among 8th Grade Youth

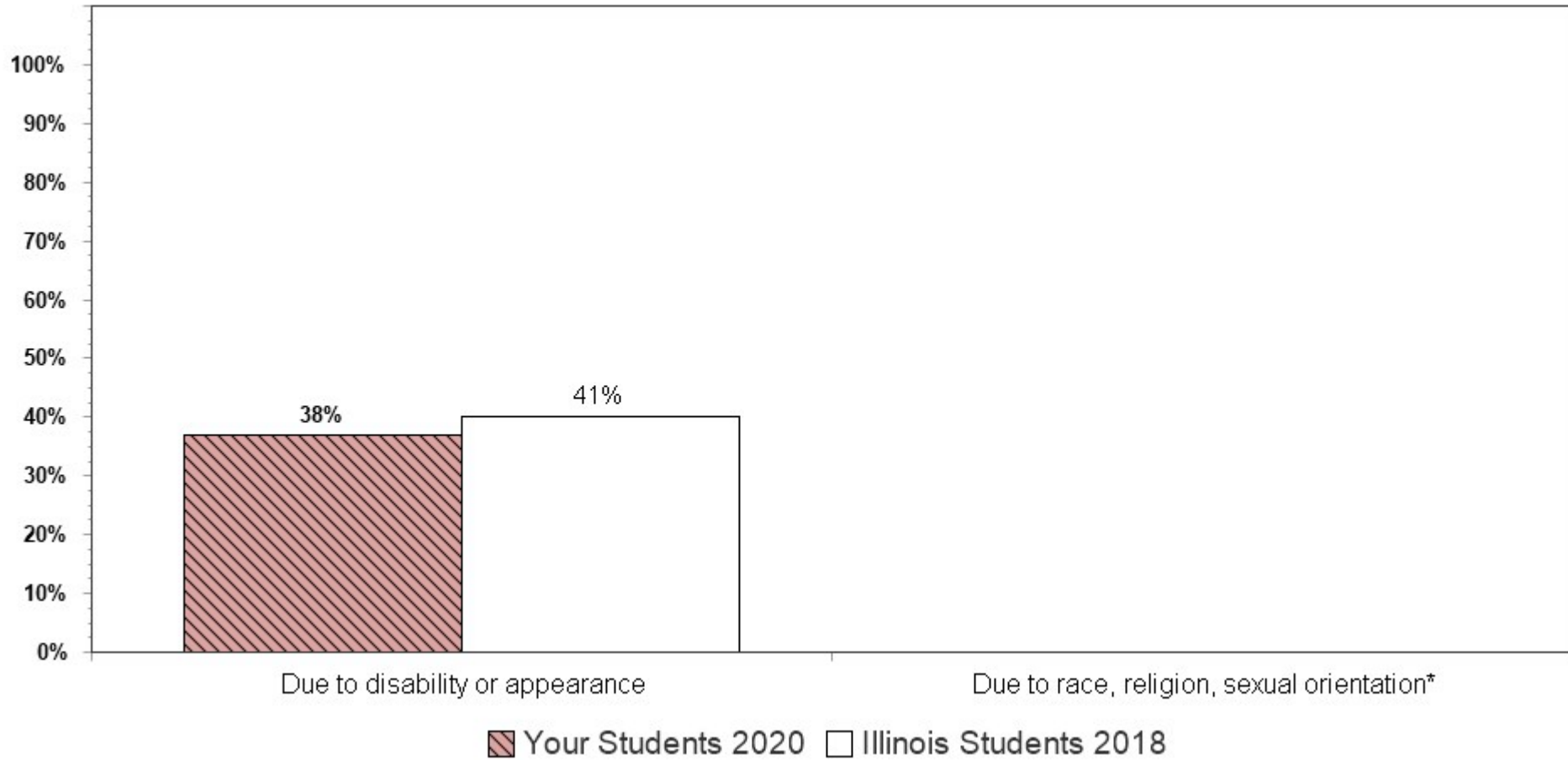
Extent of Bullying in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth

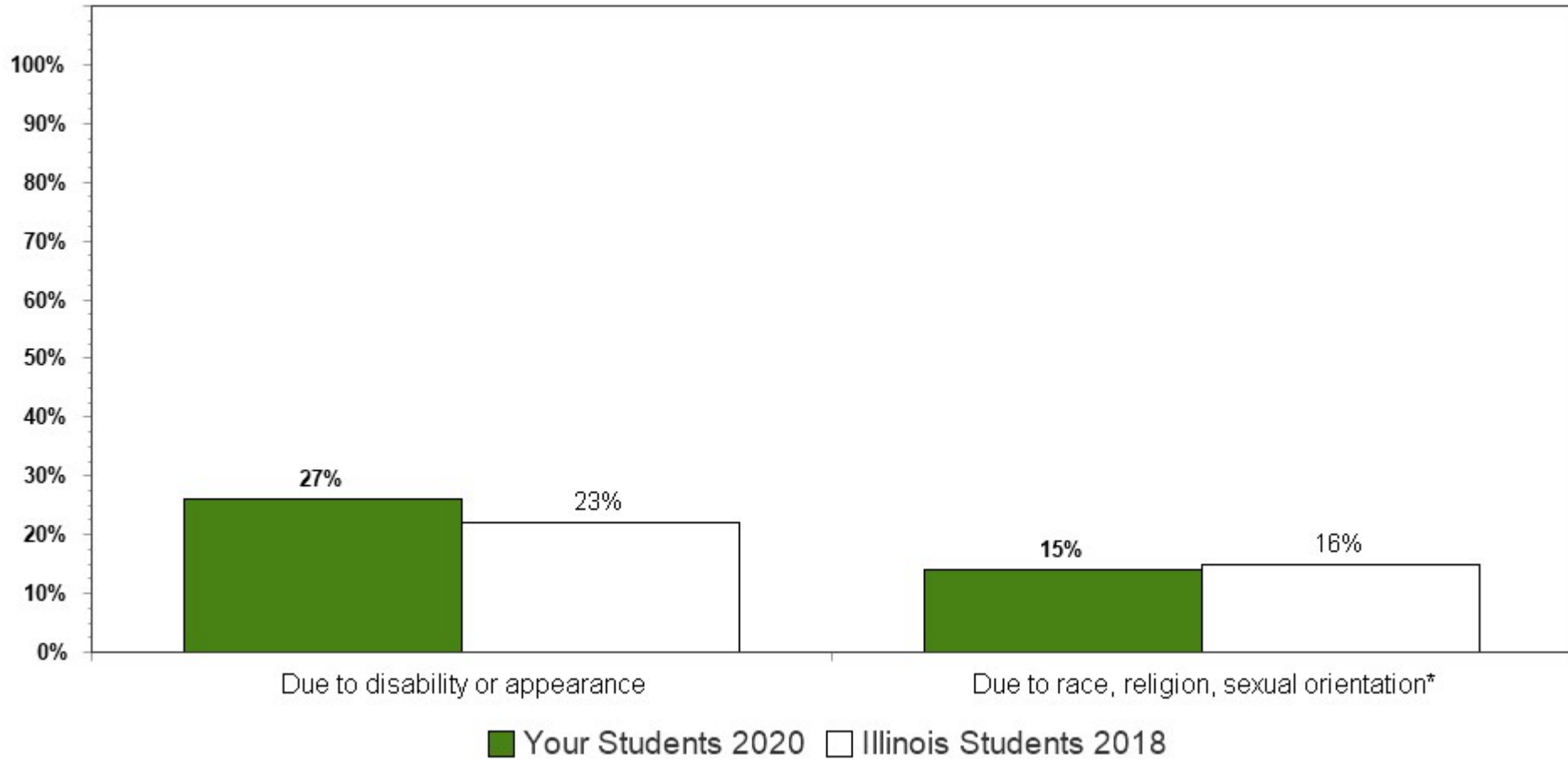

Bias-Based Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 8th Grade Youth



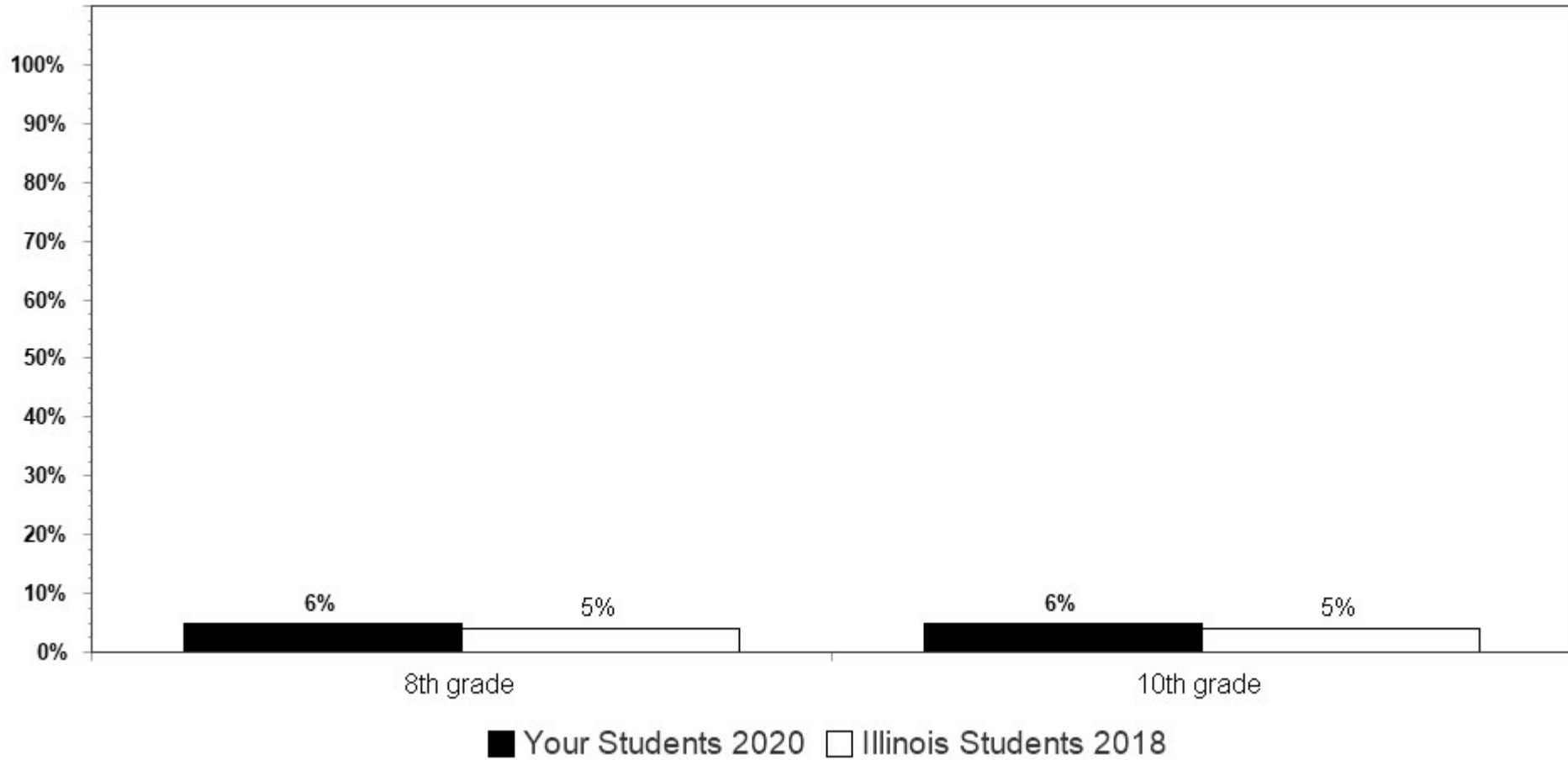

Bias-Based Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth



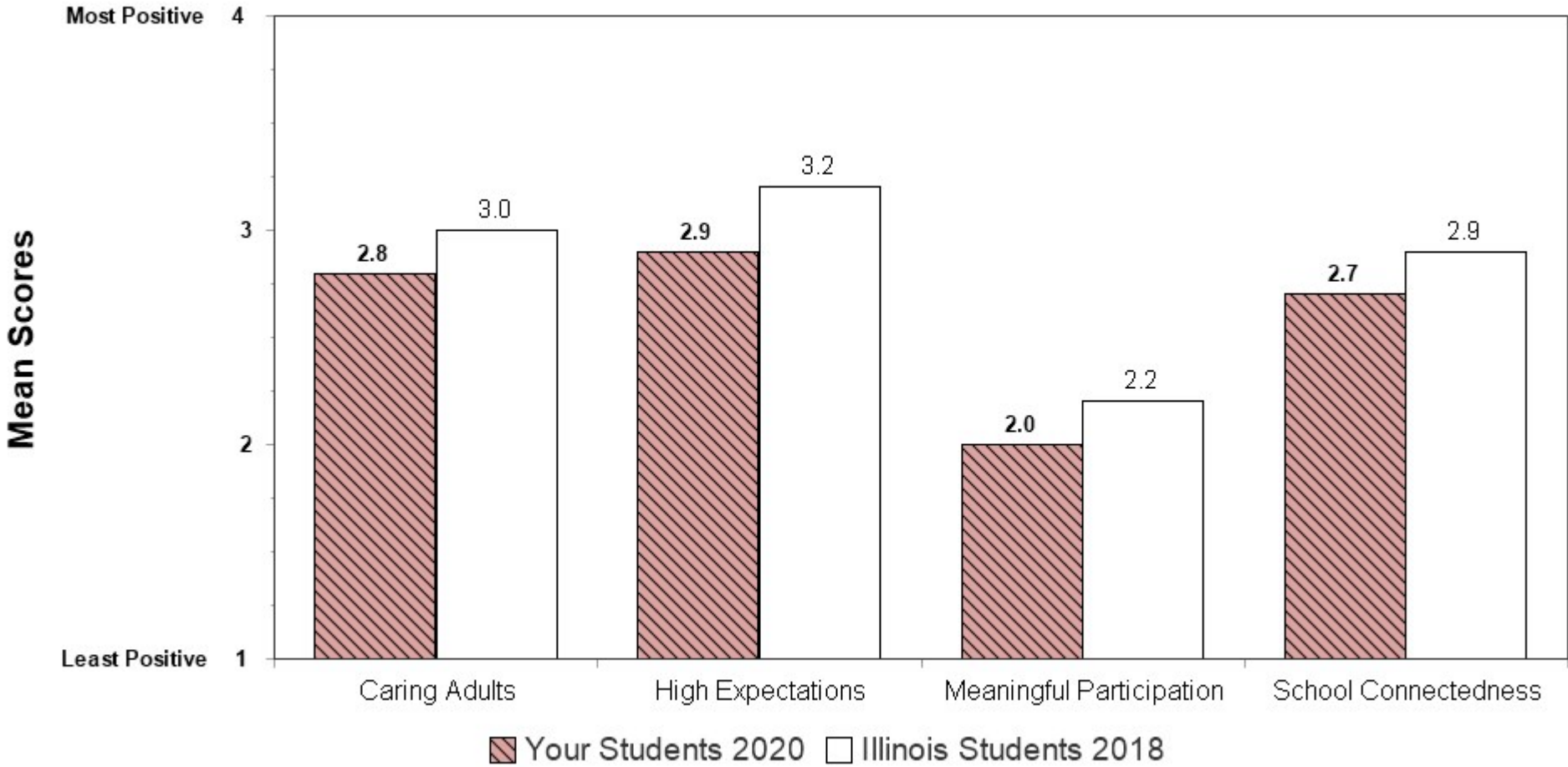

Dating Violence* in the Past 12 Months By Grade

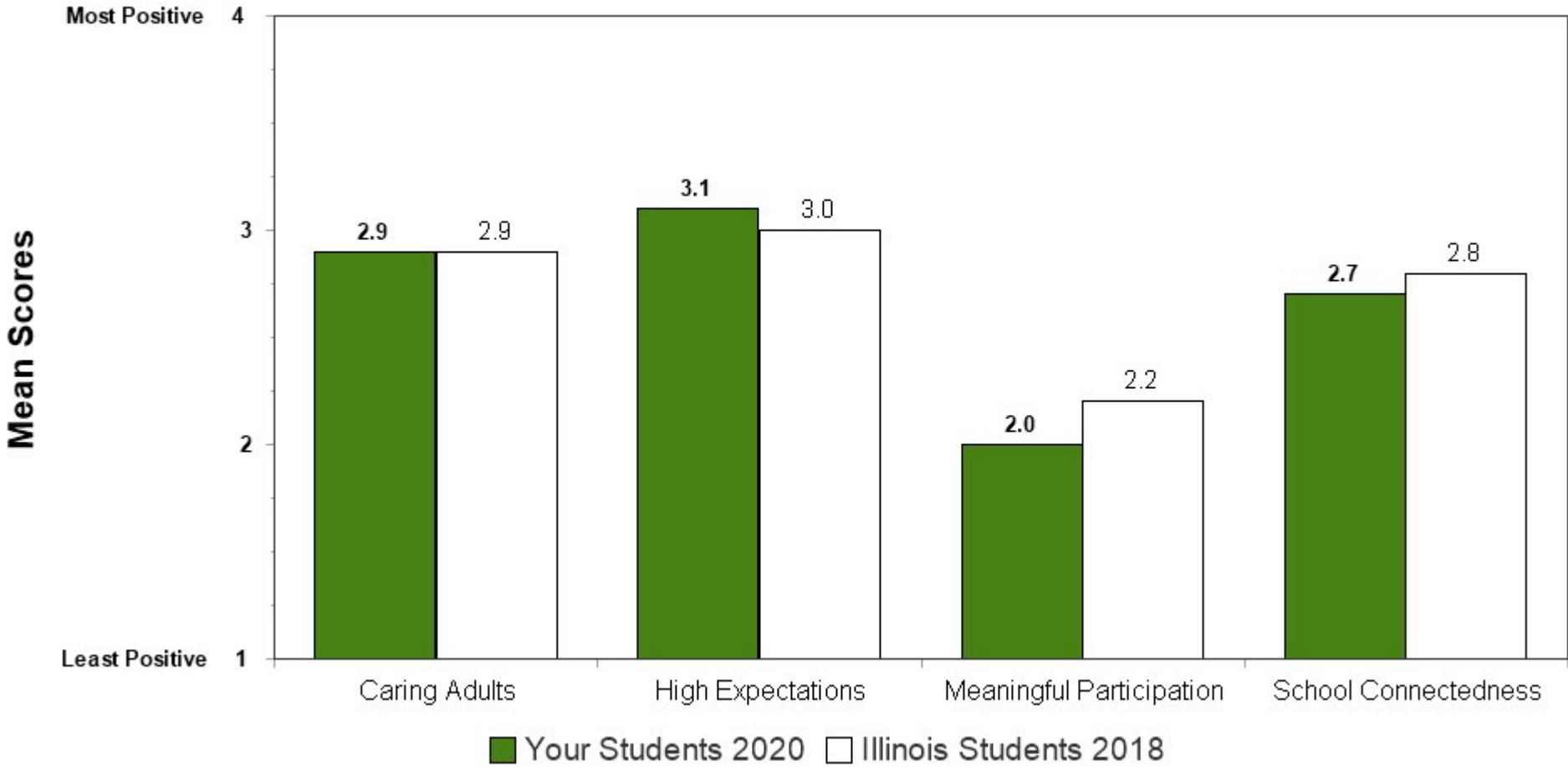

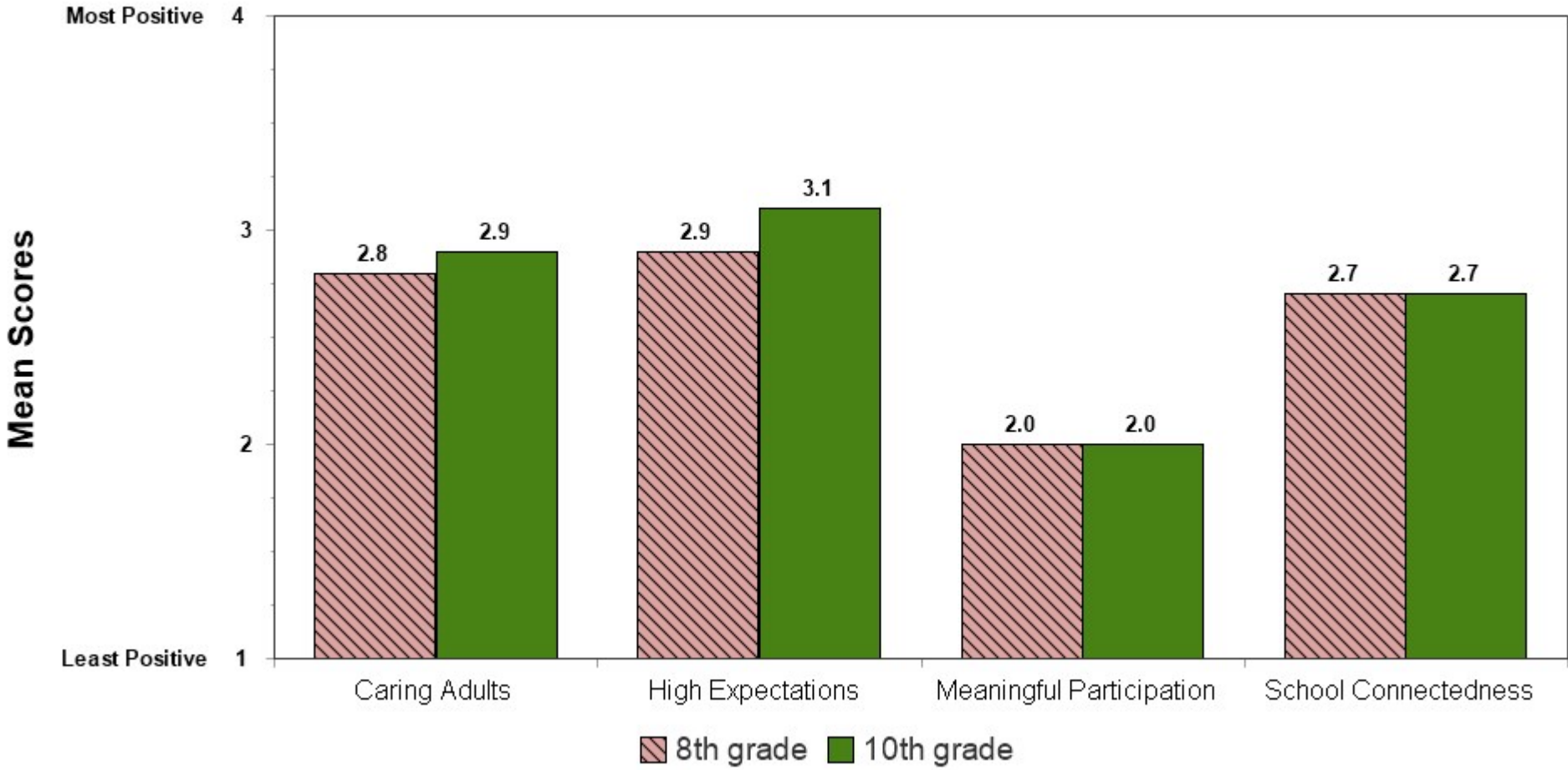
Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 8th Grade Youth



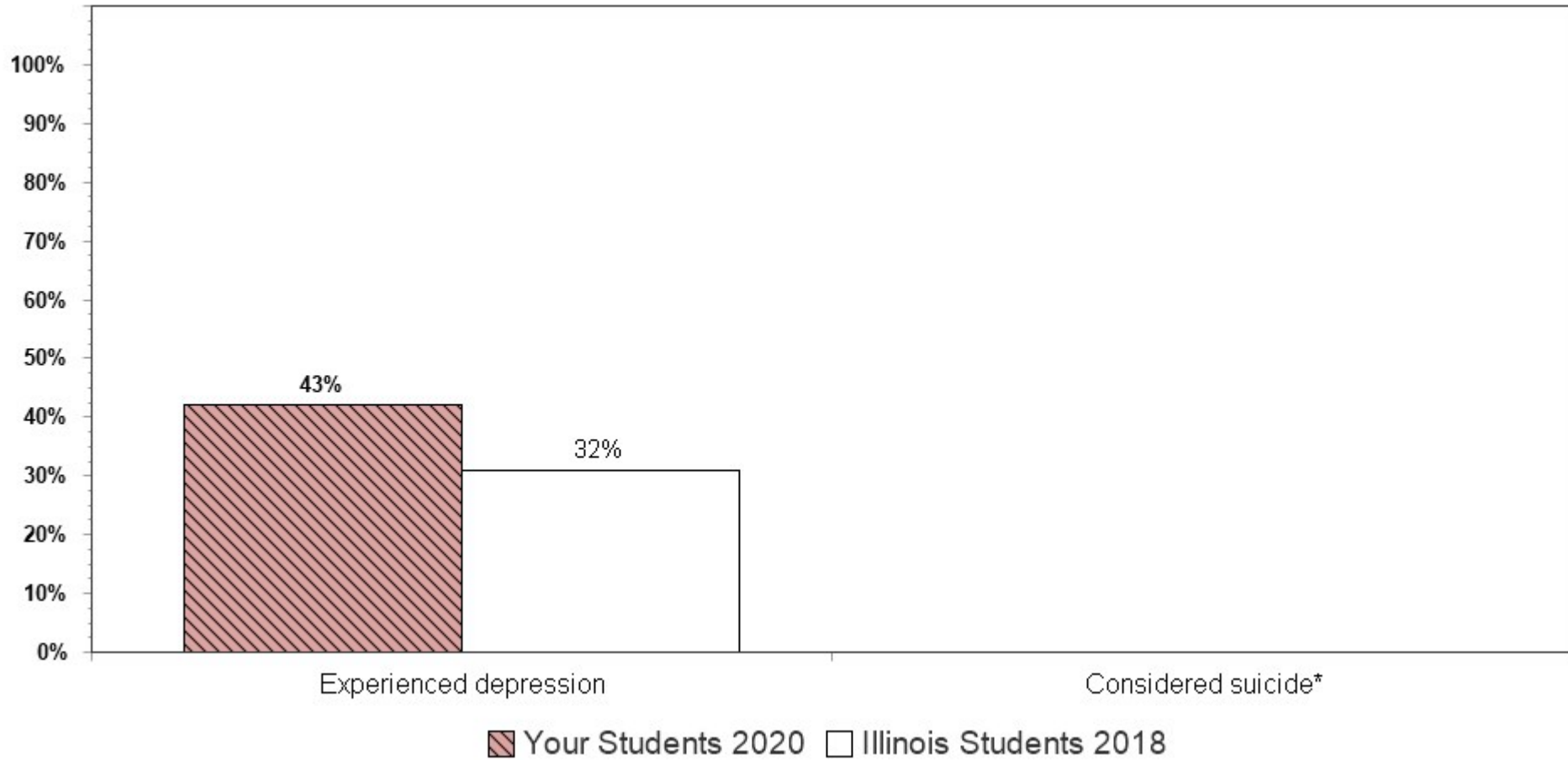
Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 10th Grade Youth



Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores By Grade

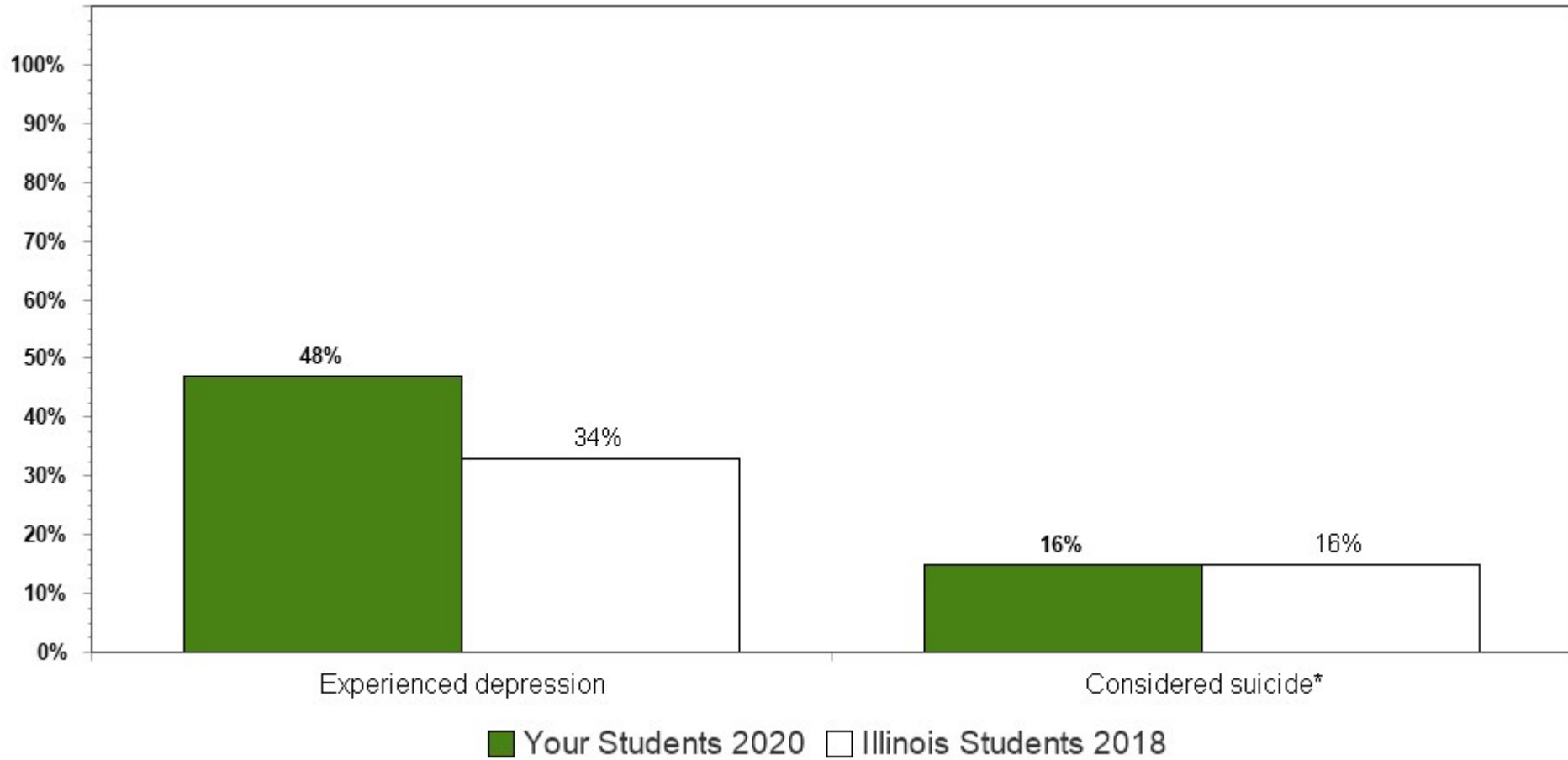


Mental Health Concerns in the Past 12 Months Among 8th Grade Youth



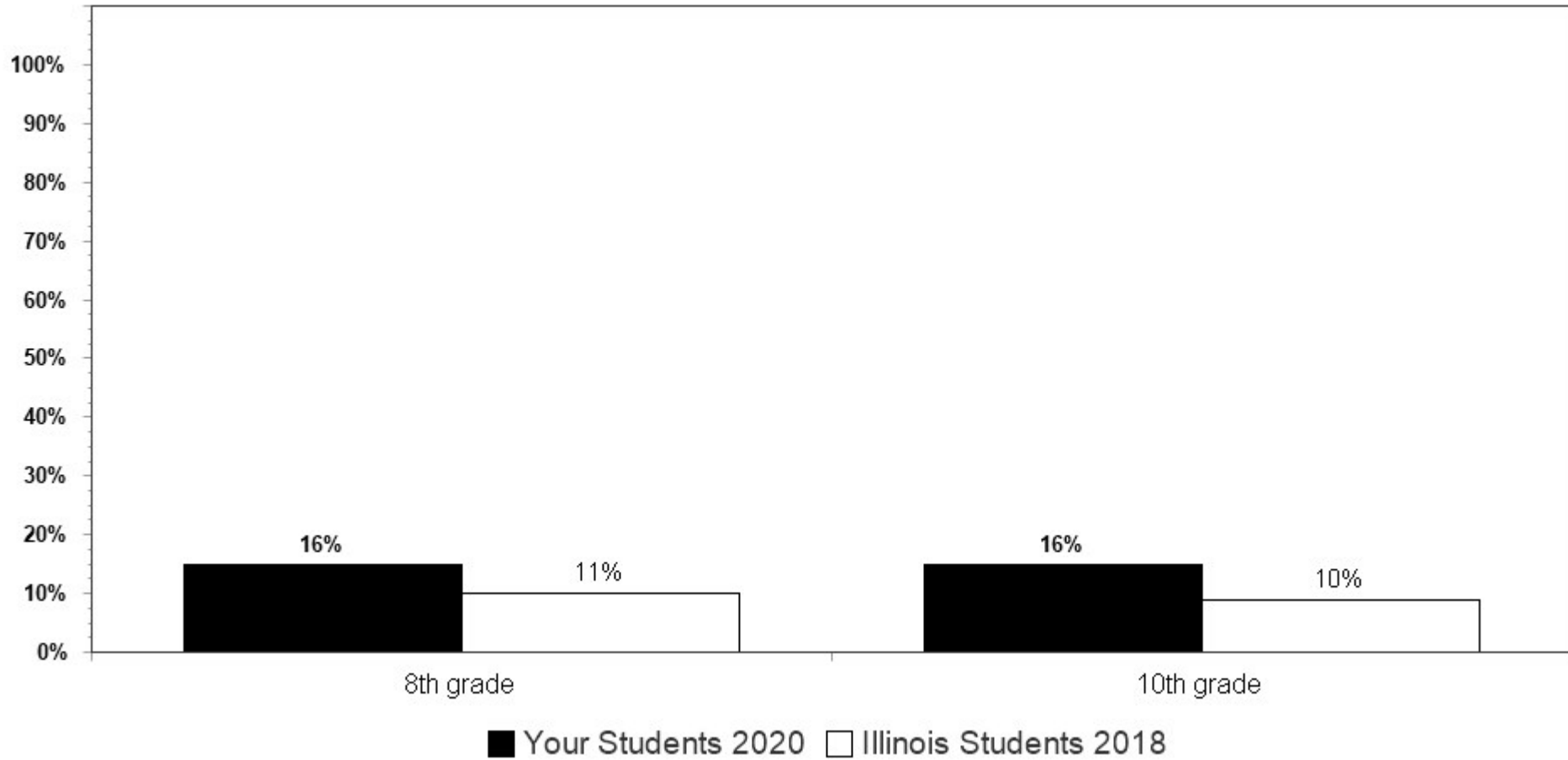

Mental Health Concerns in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth



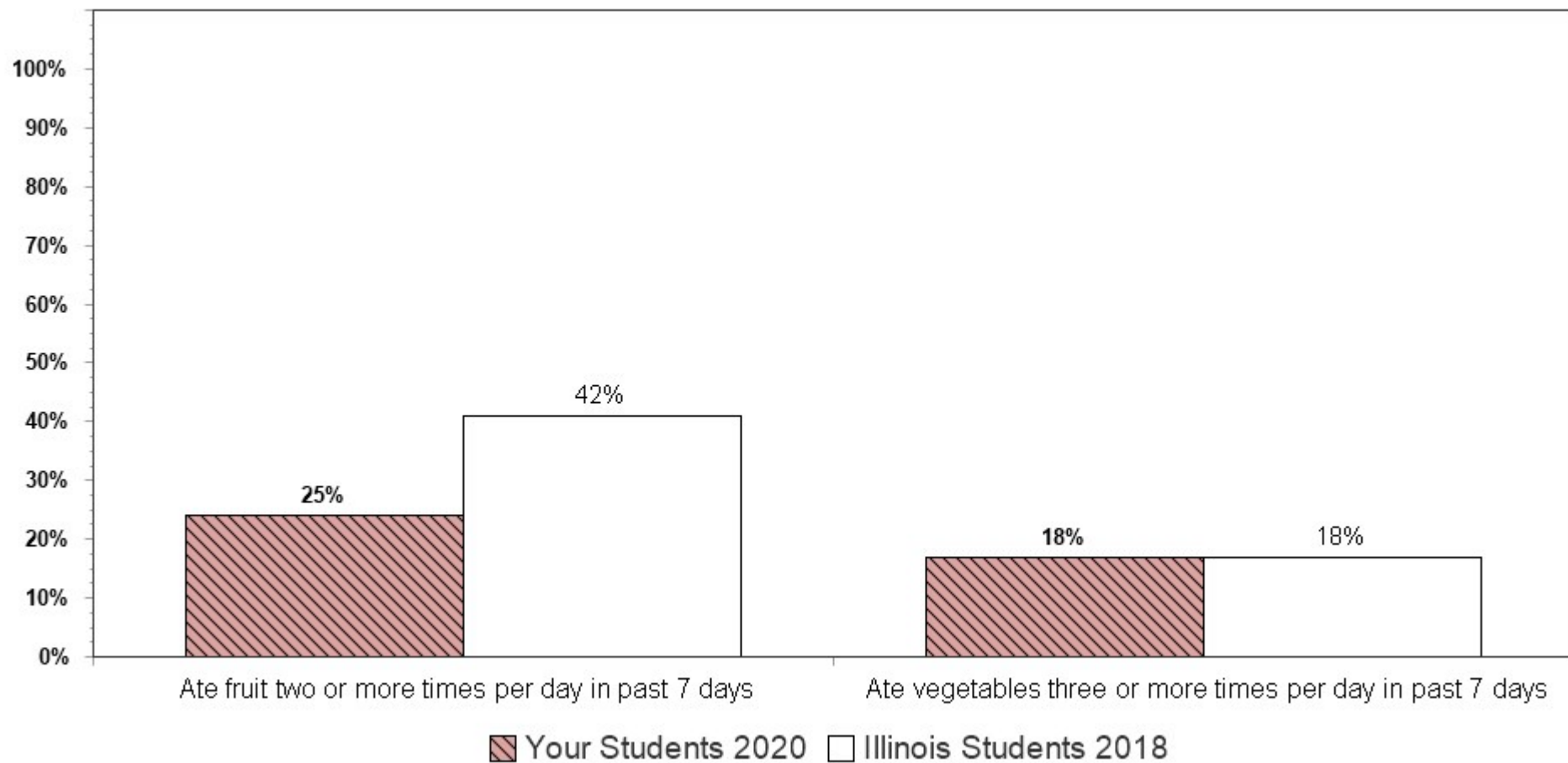

Prevalence of Obesity* According to BMI By Grade

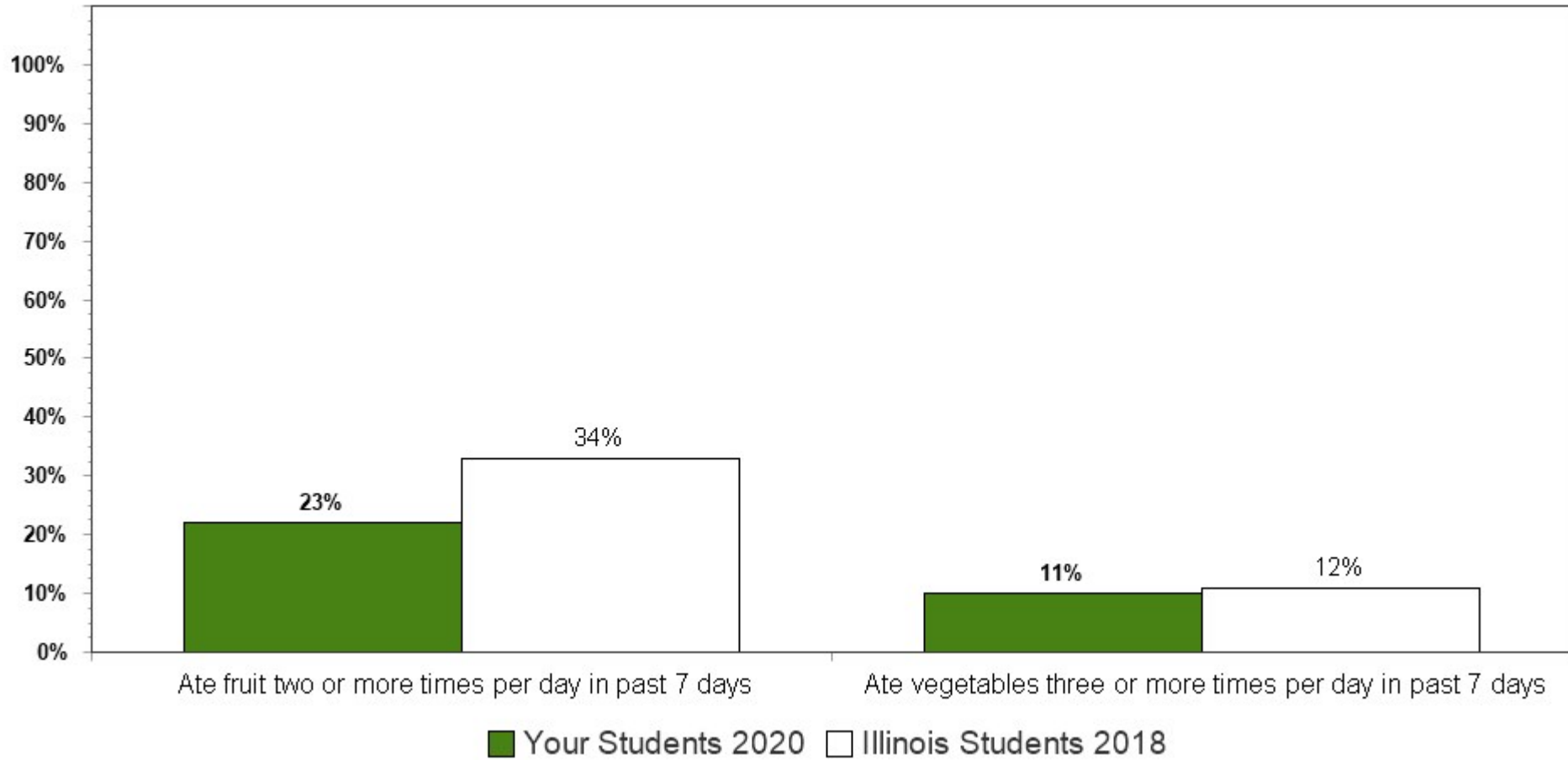

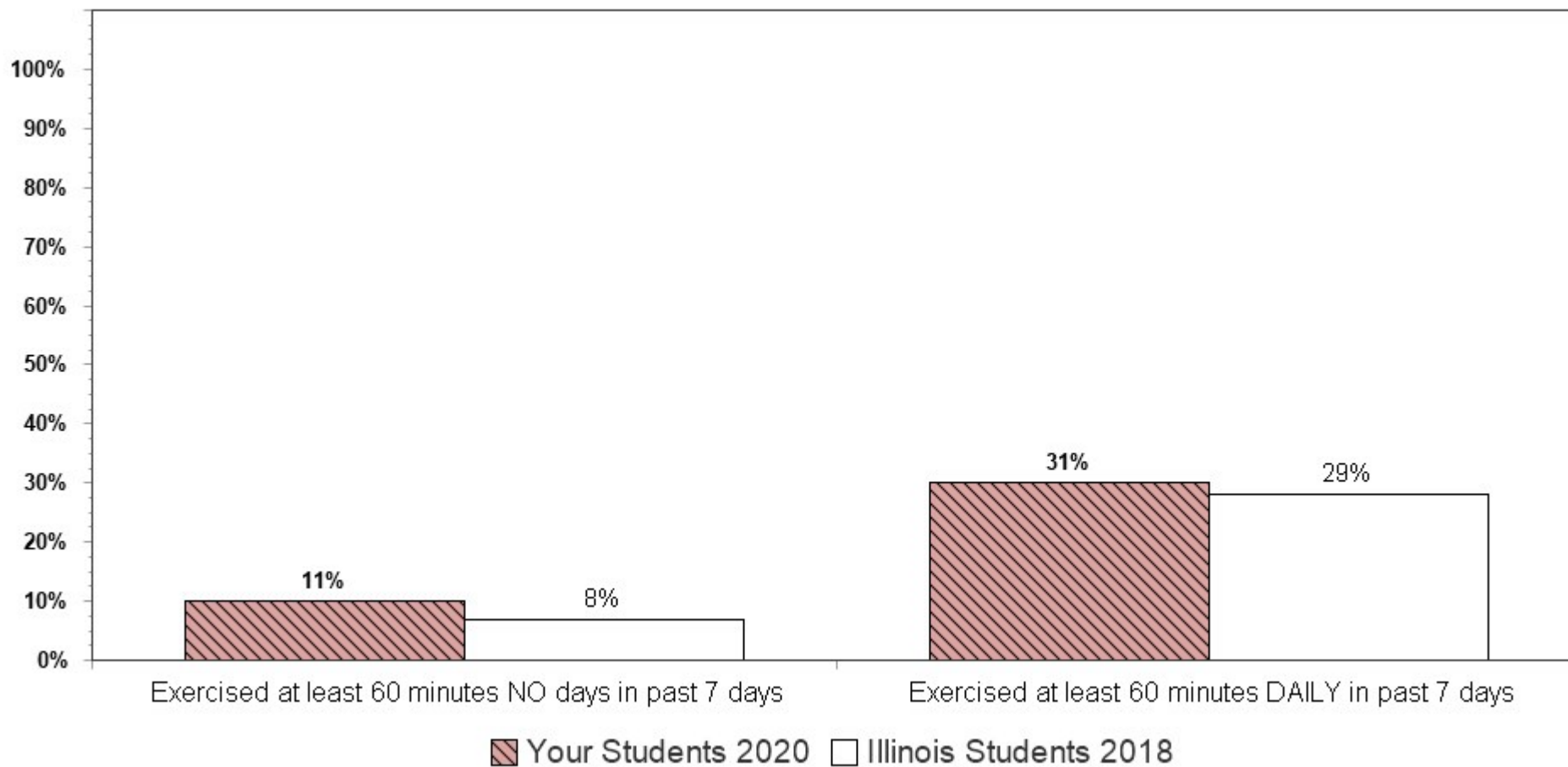
Nutrition Behavior Among 8th Grade Youth
