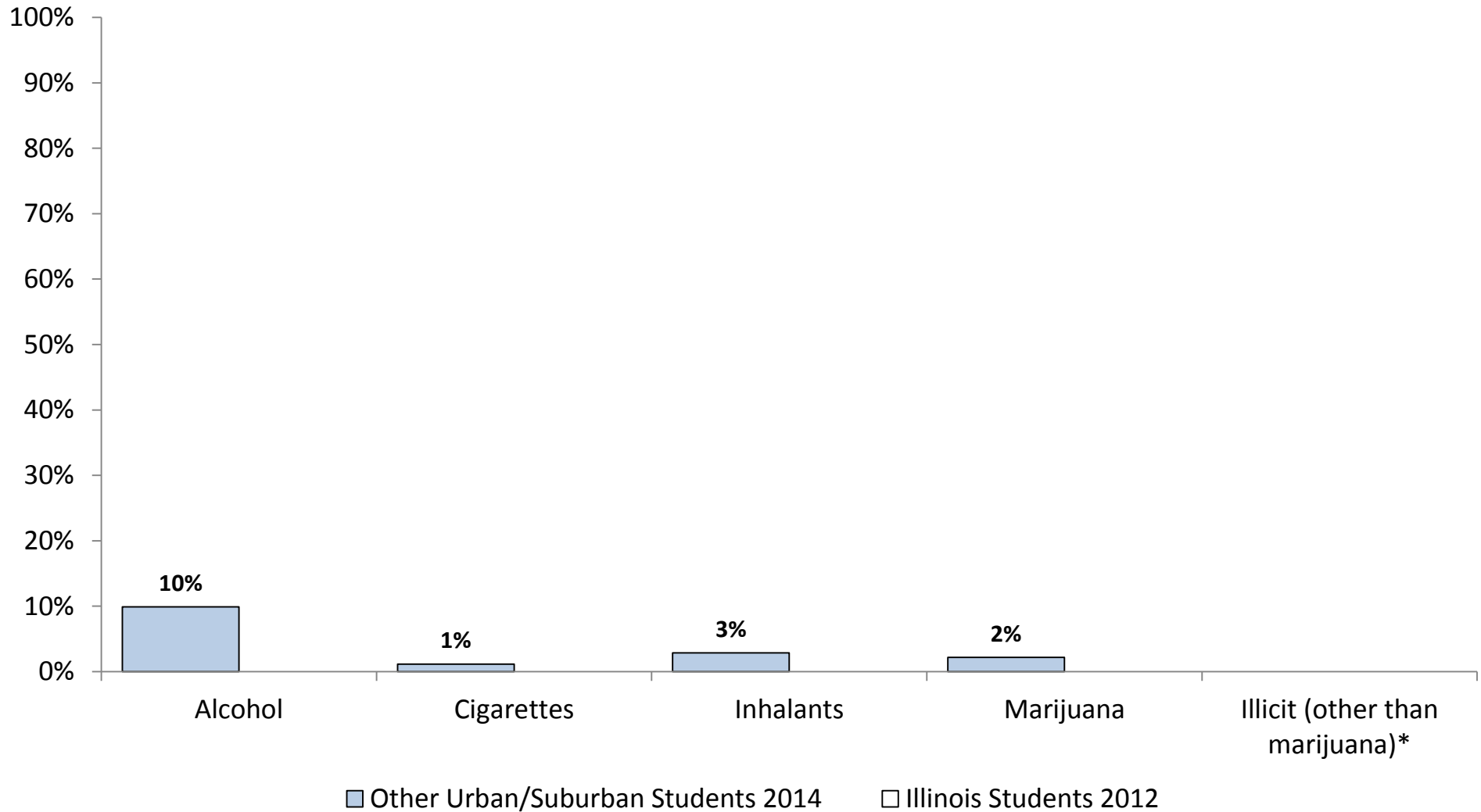

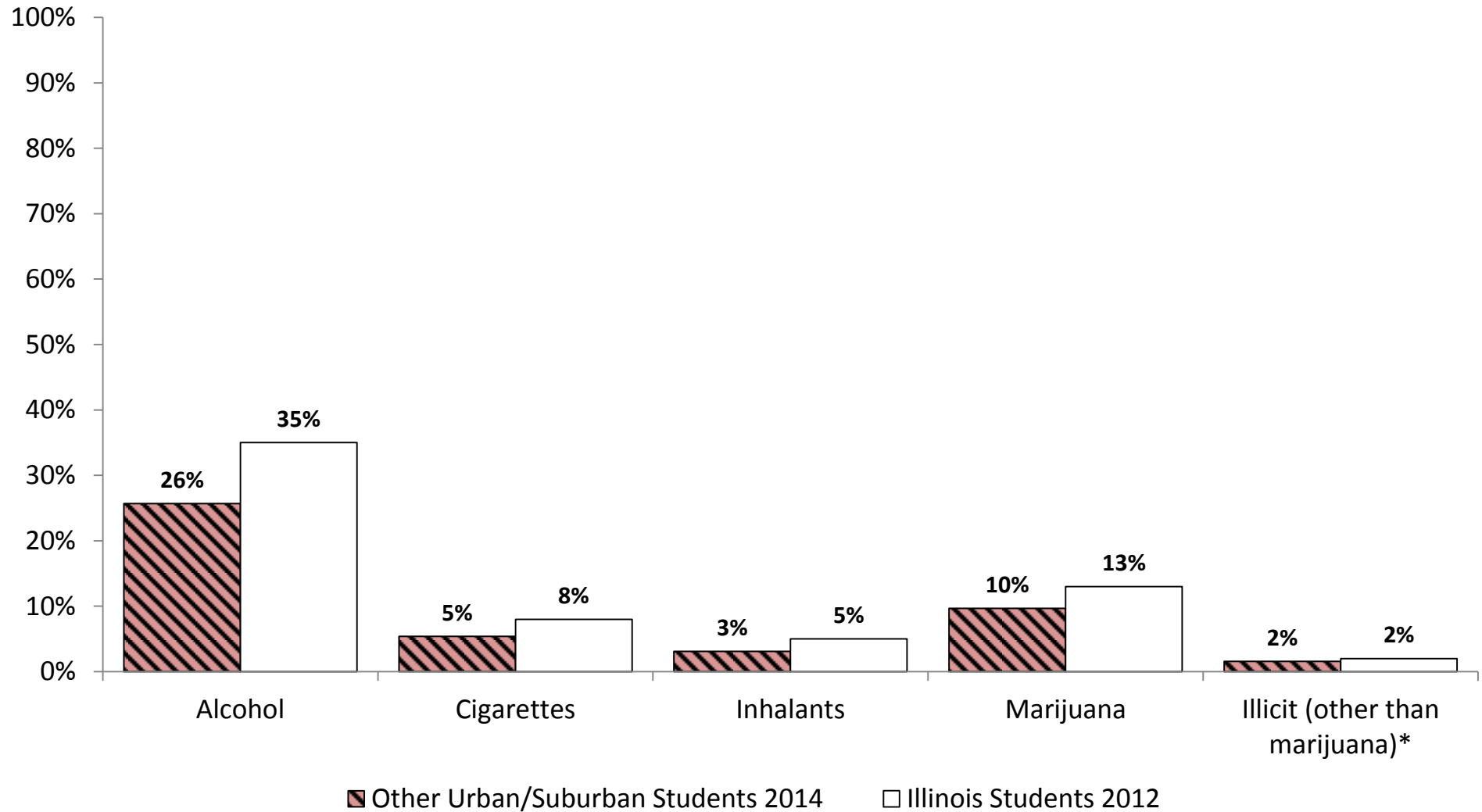

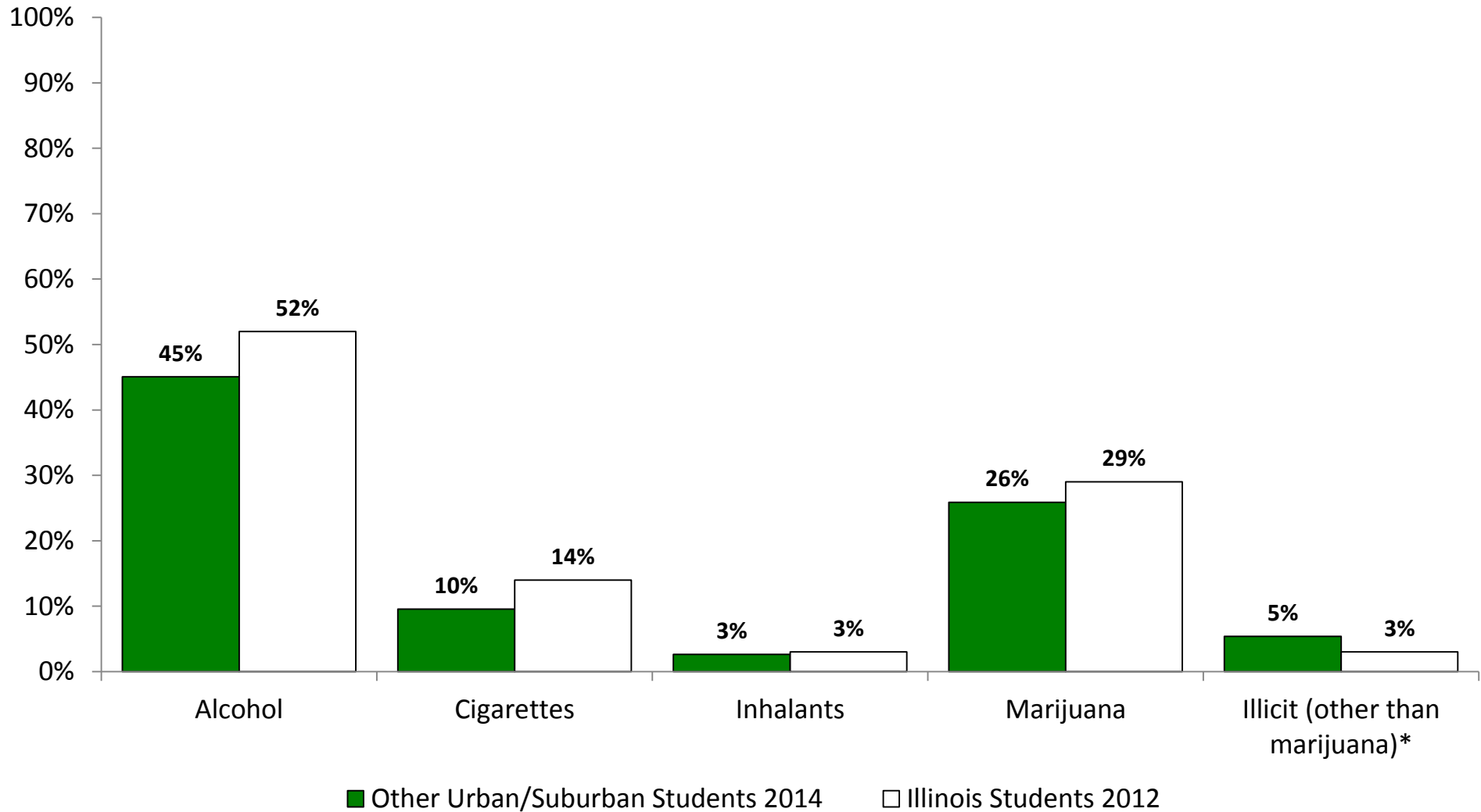
Among 8th Grade Youth

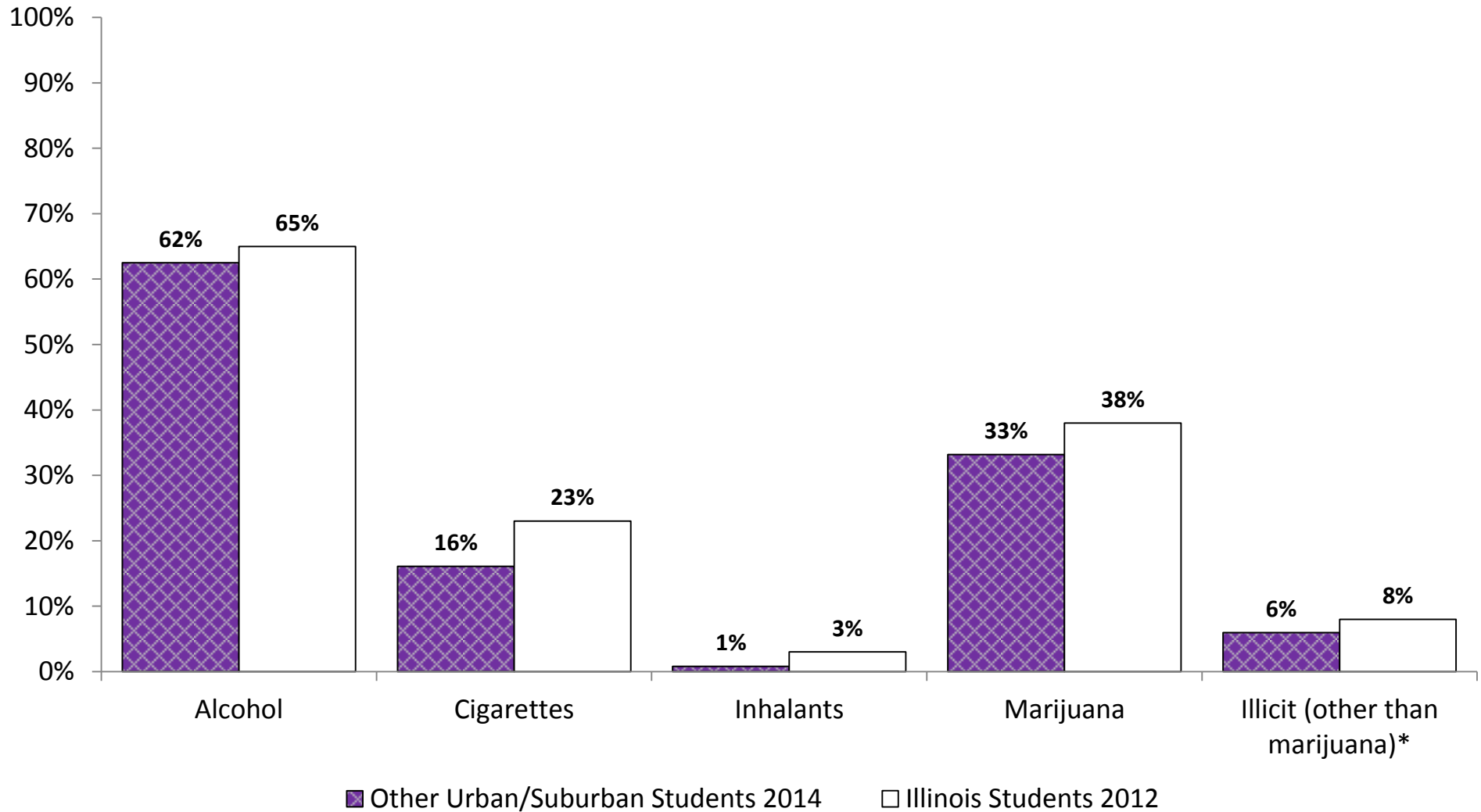
Among 10th Grade Youth

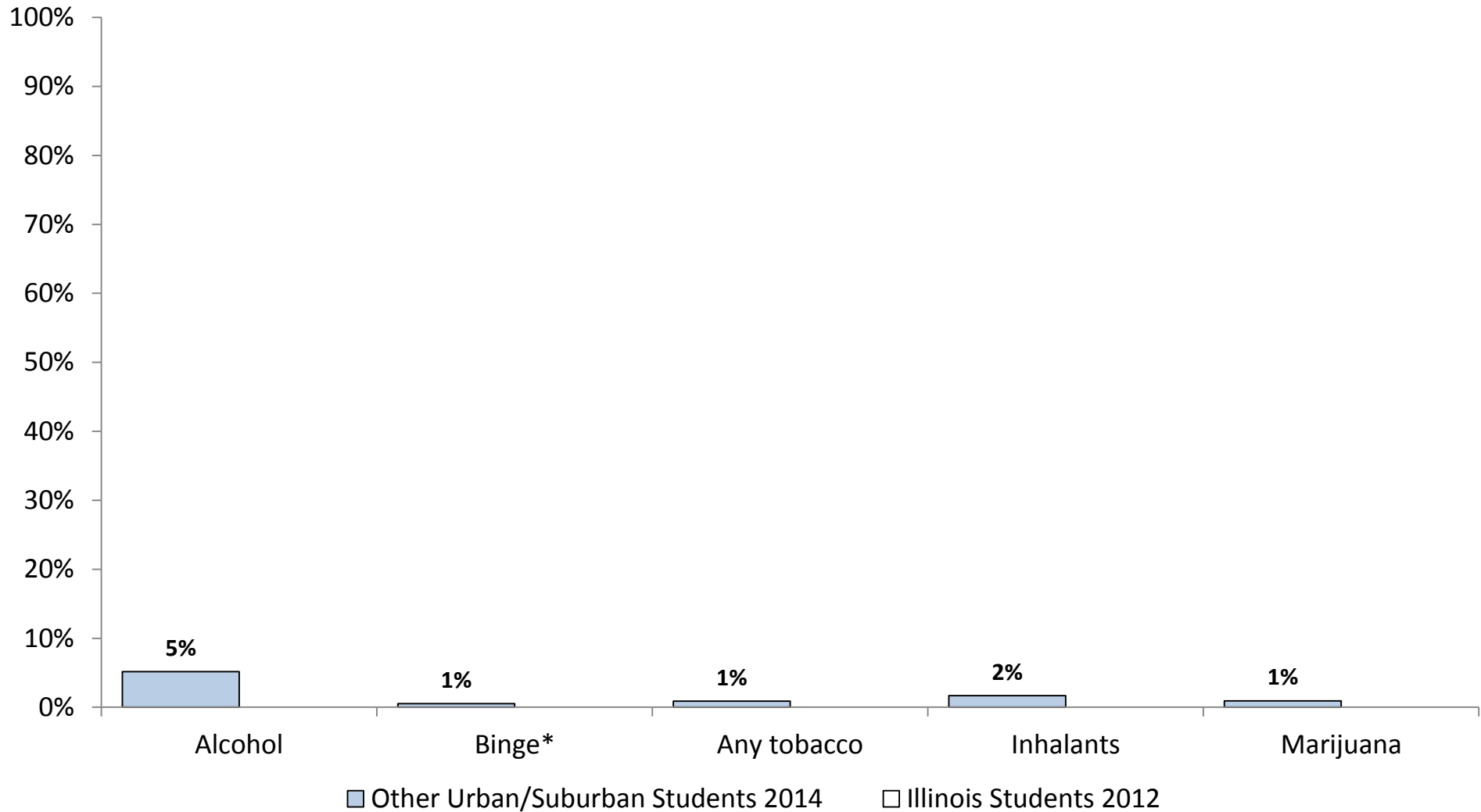
Substance Use in the Past Year

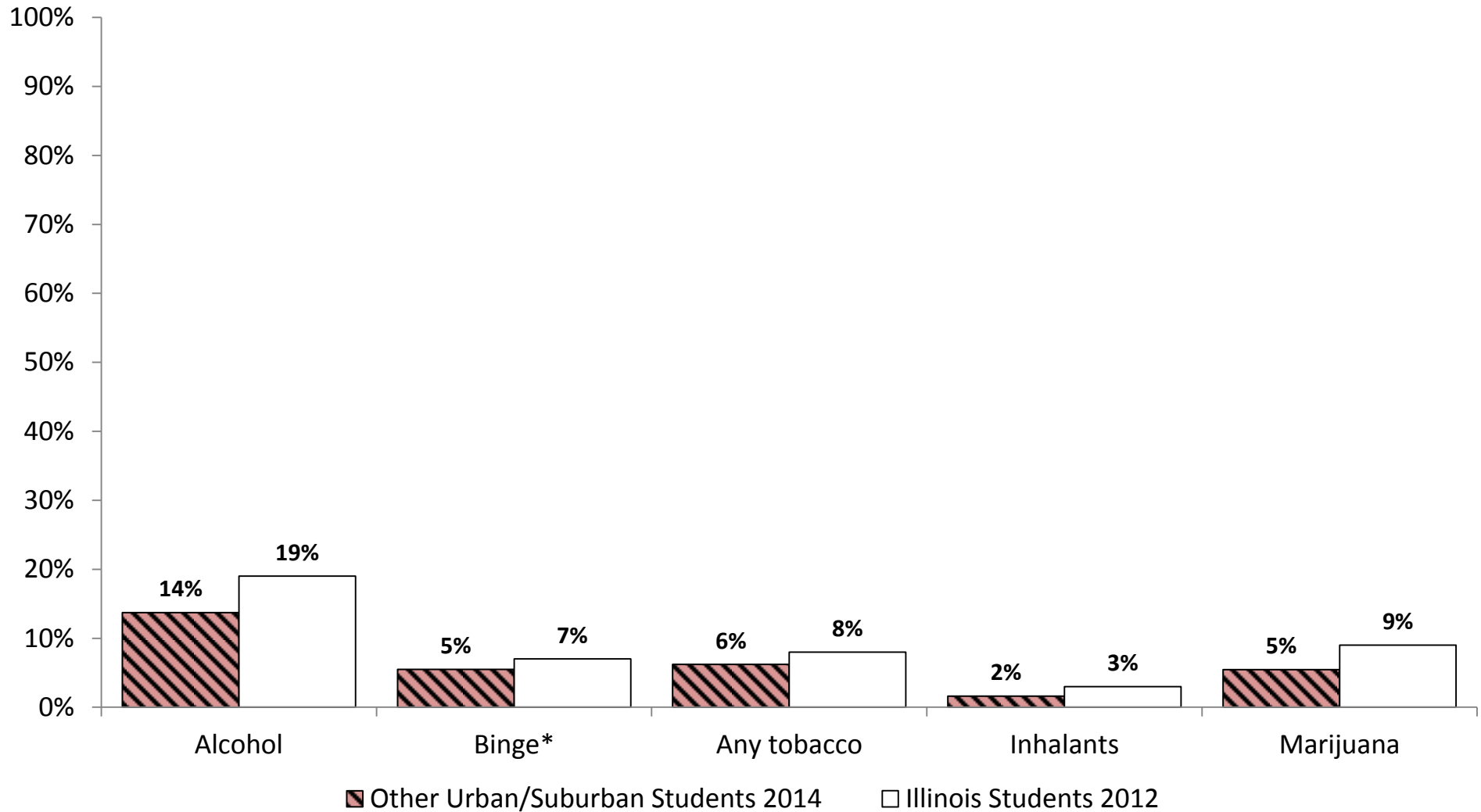
Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 6th Grade Youth

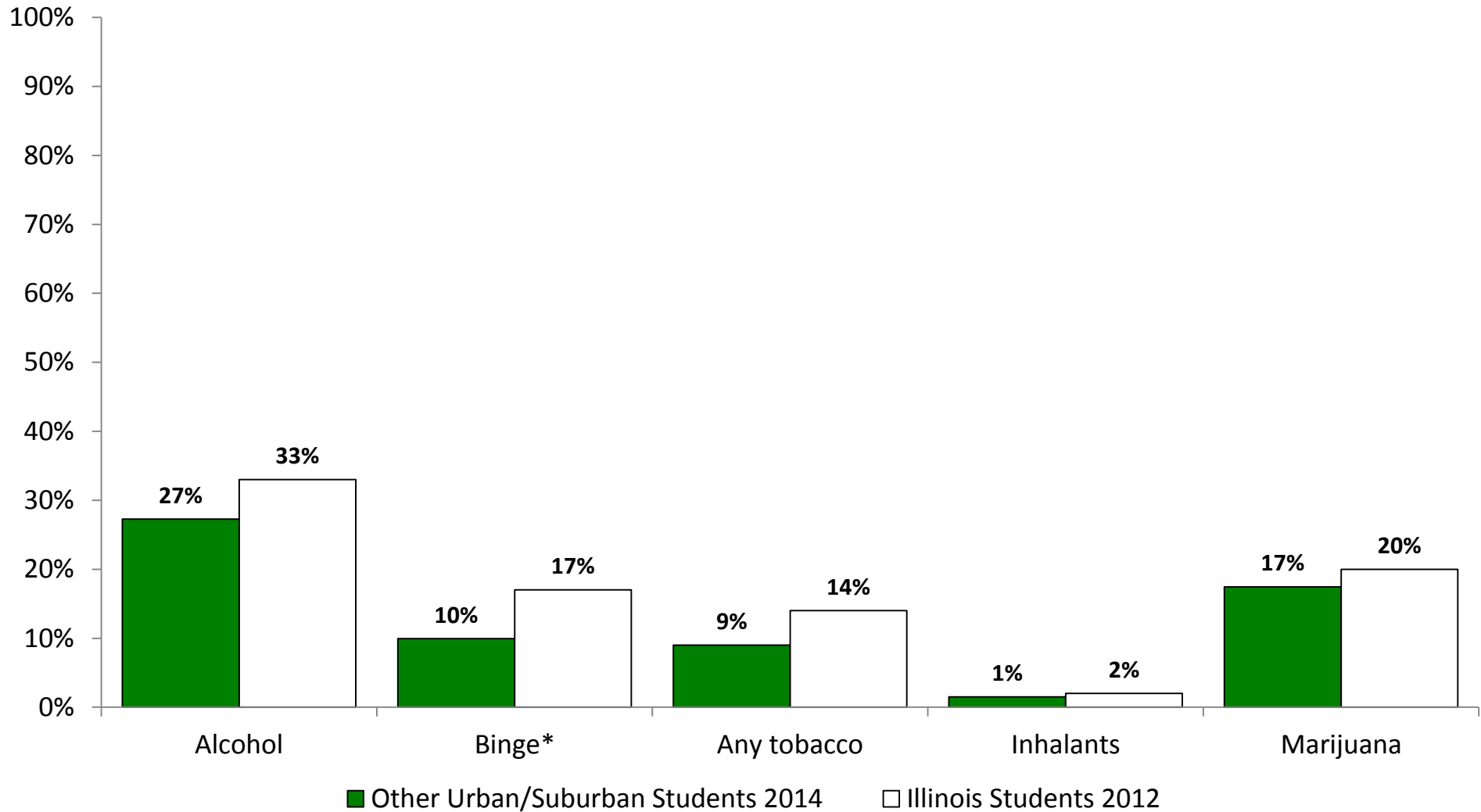
Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 8th Grade Youth

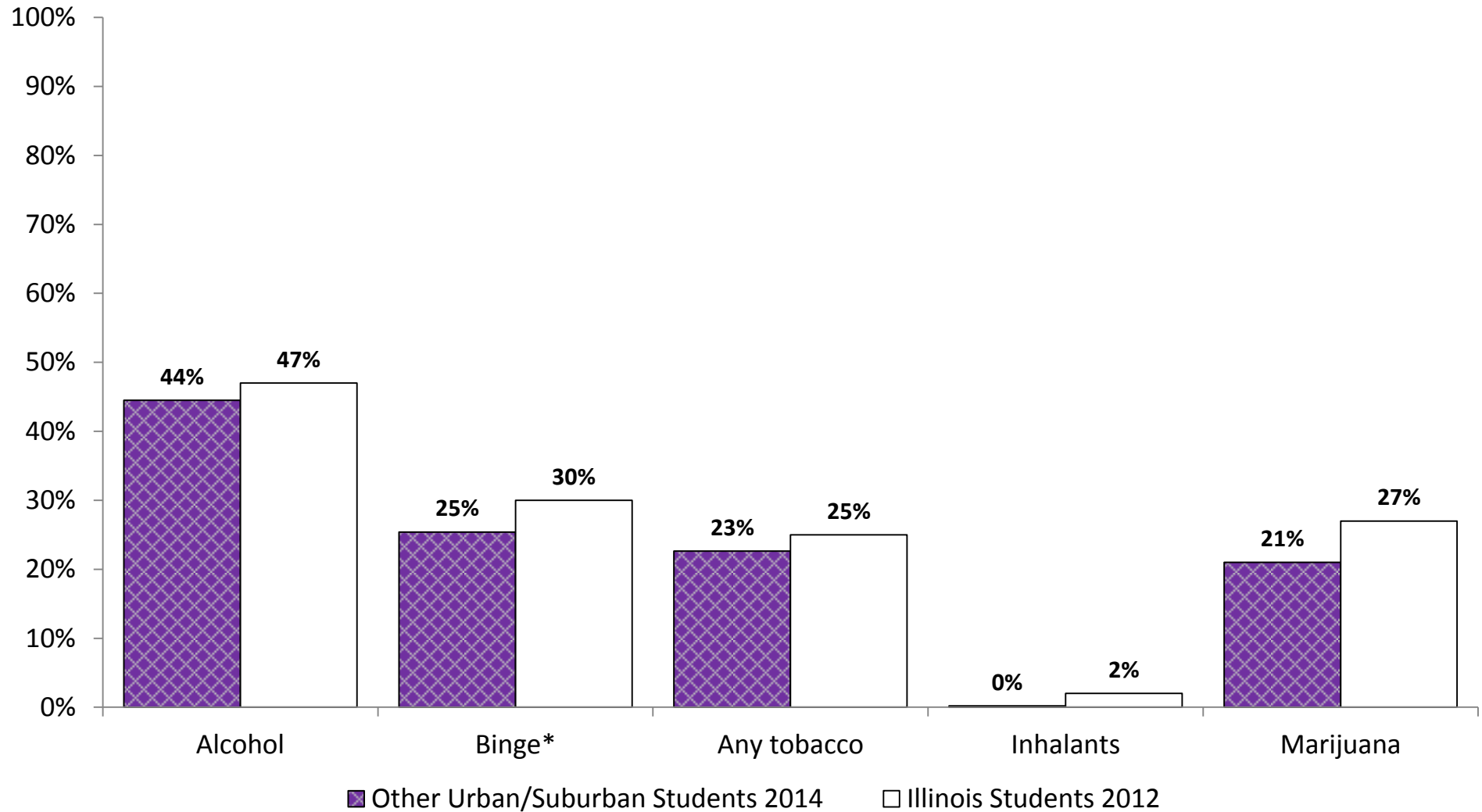

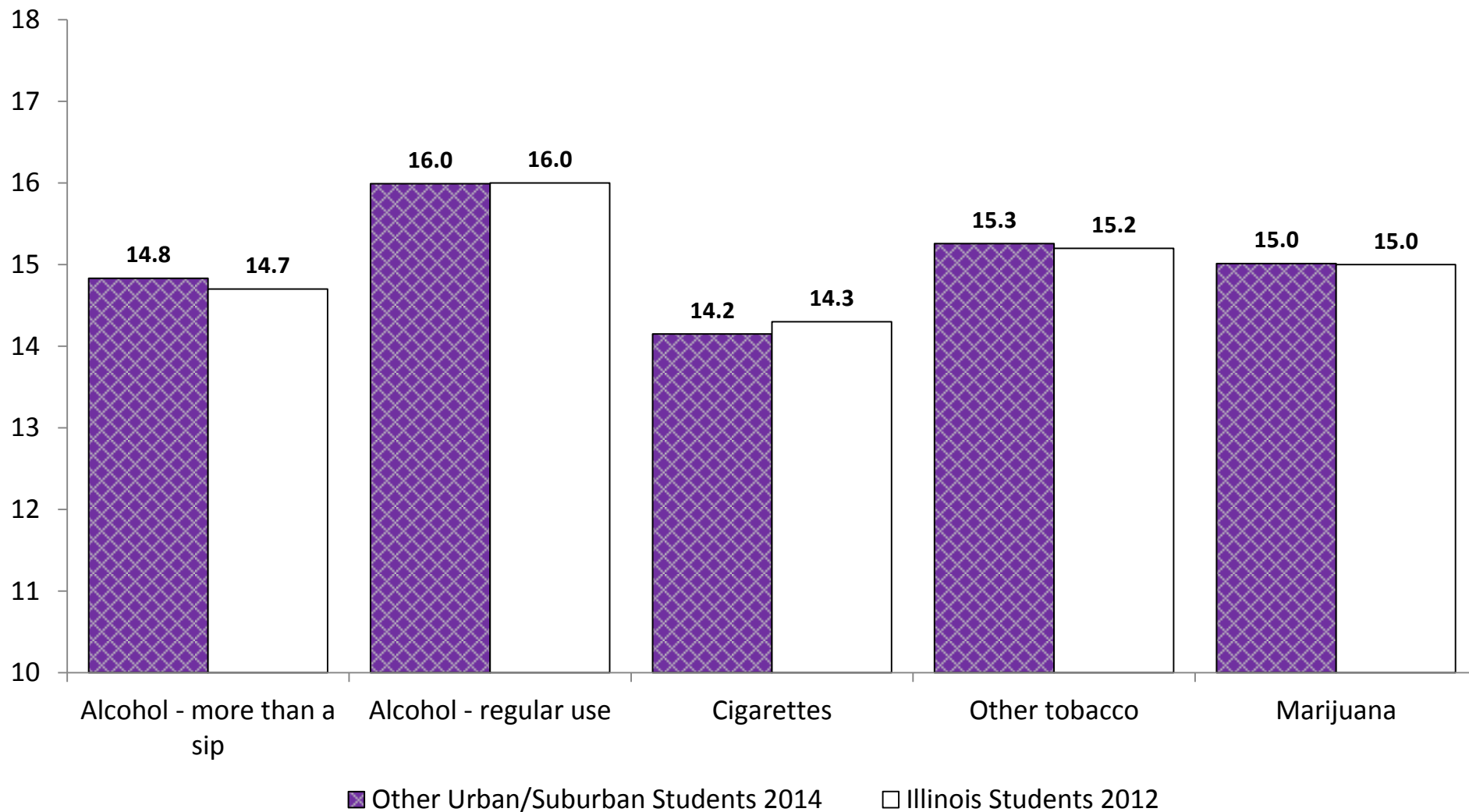

Average Age of First Use

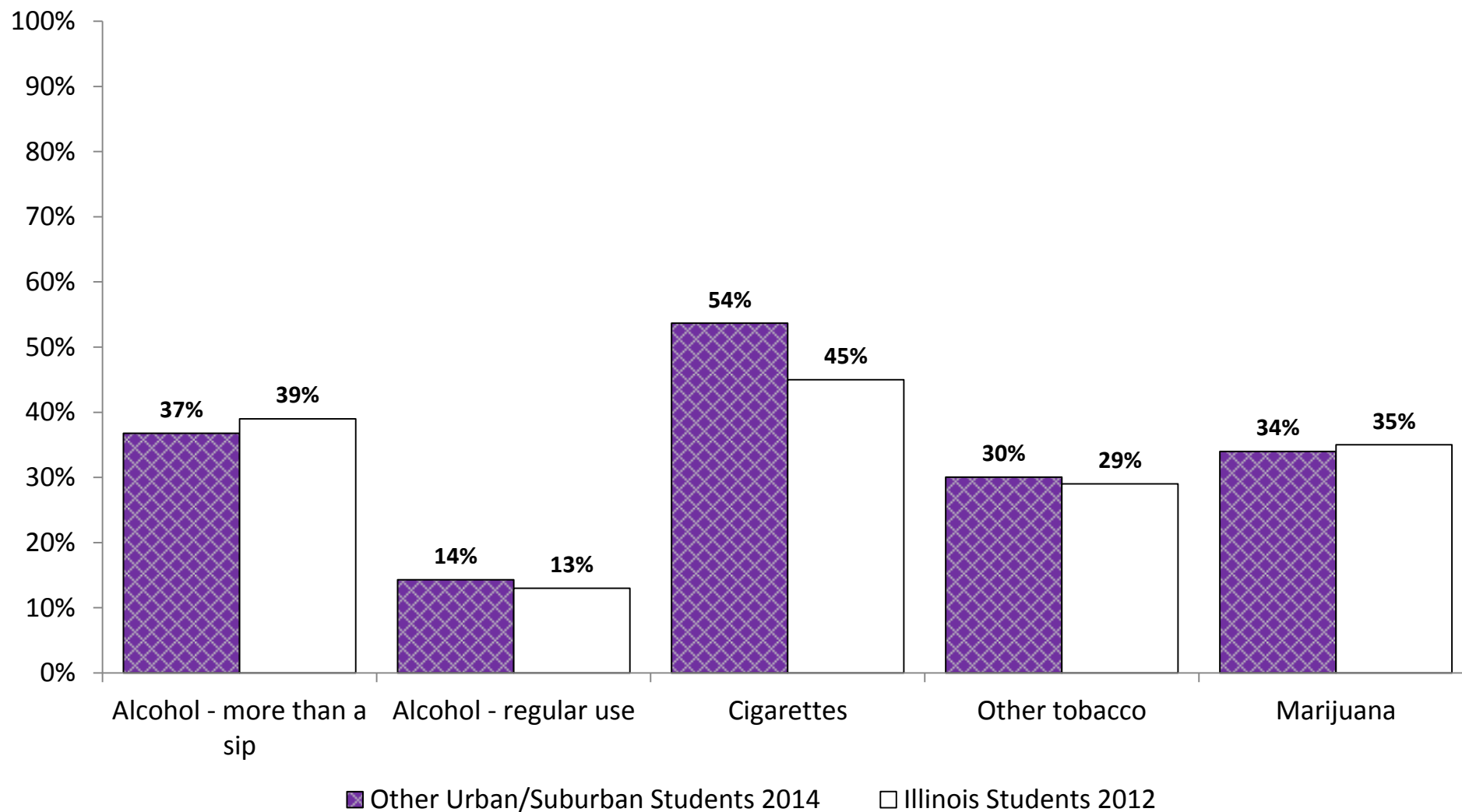

First Use Before Age 15

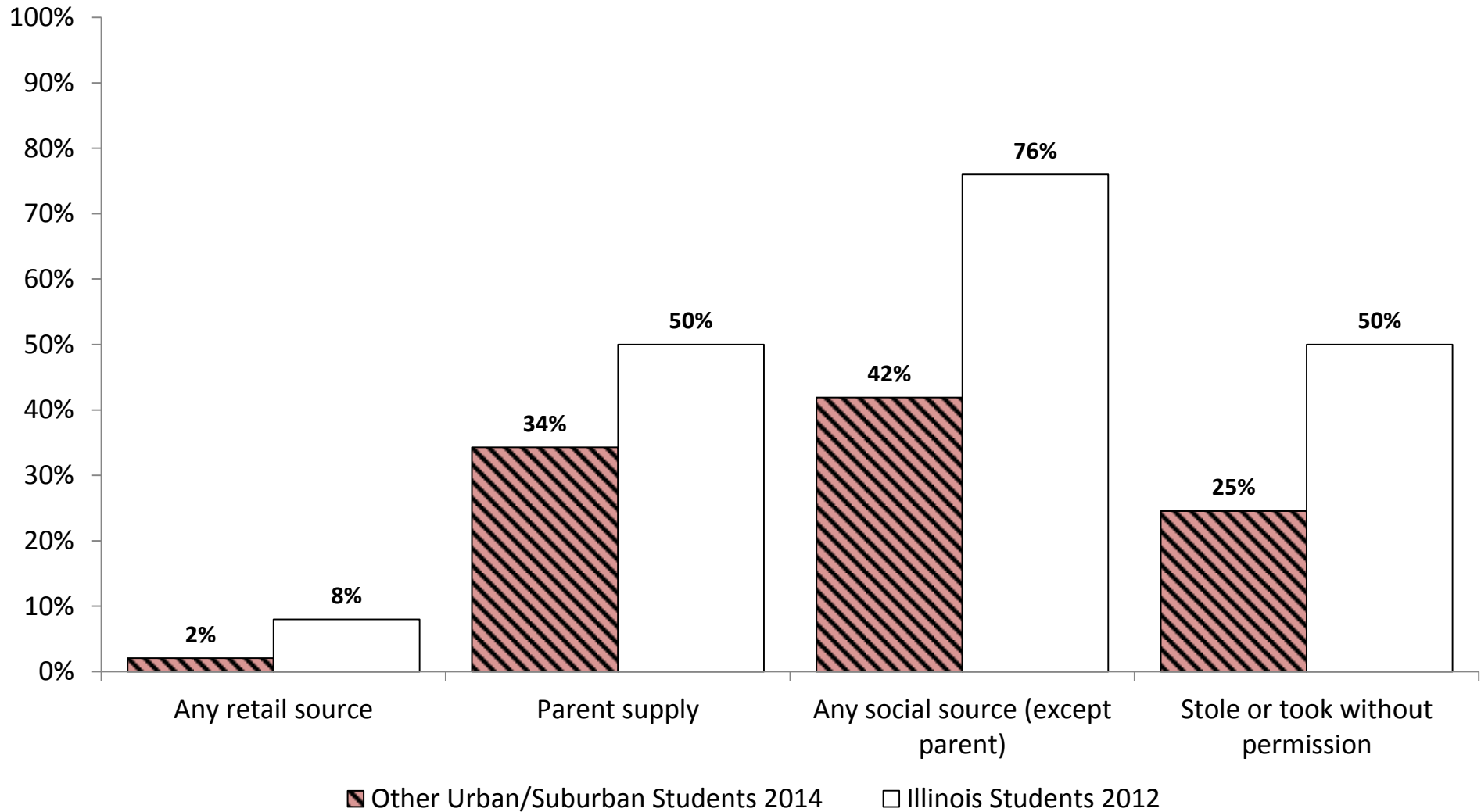

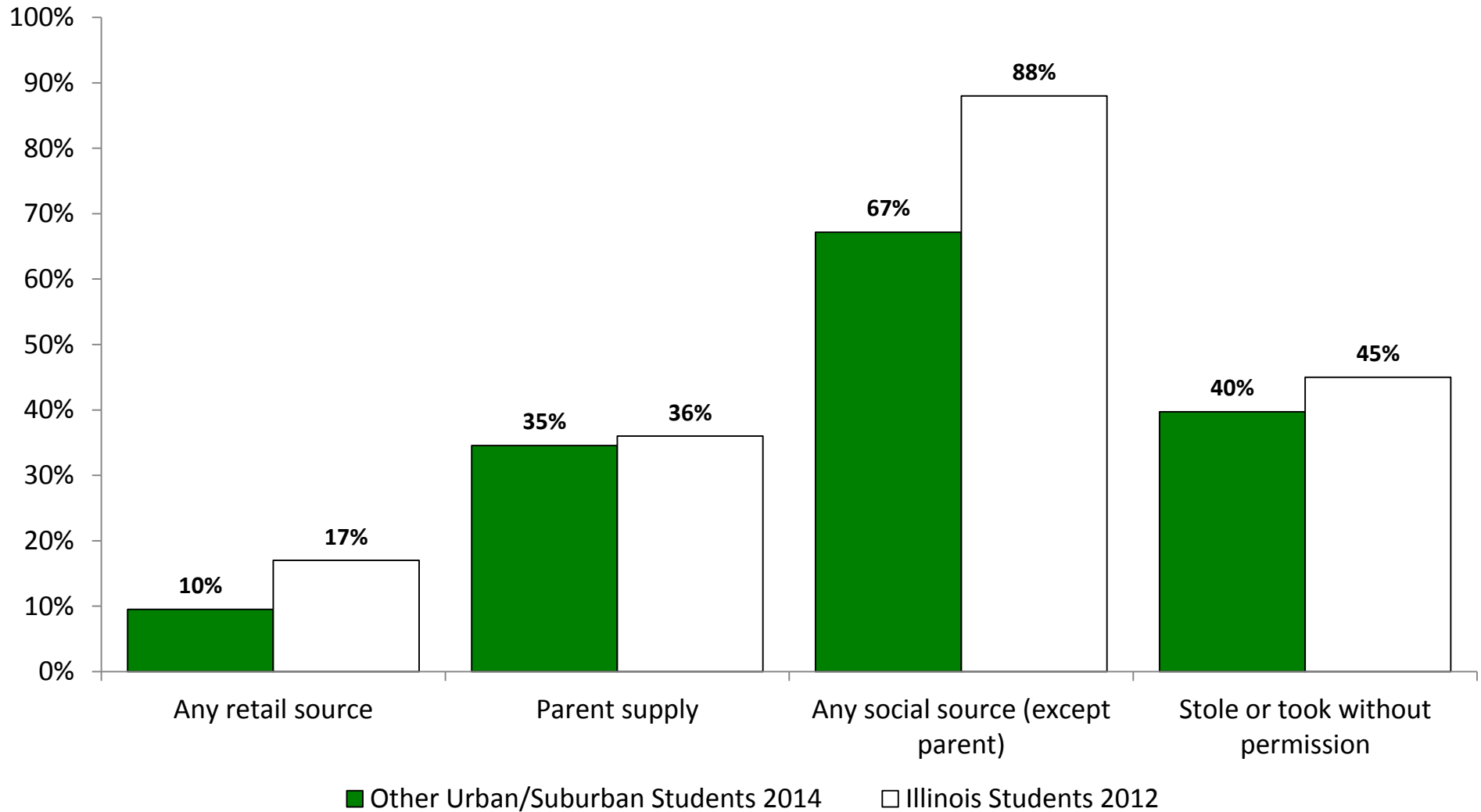

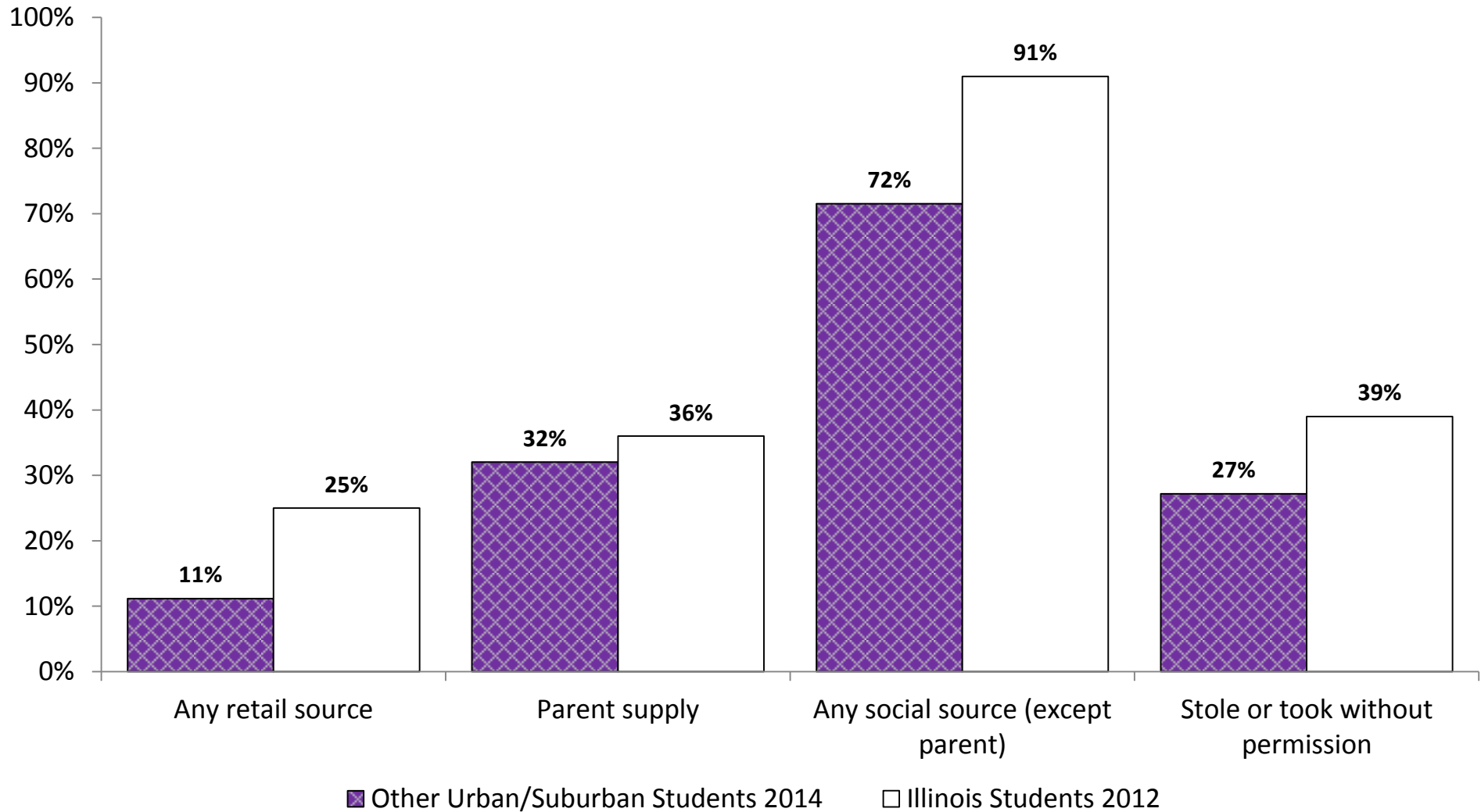

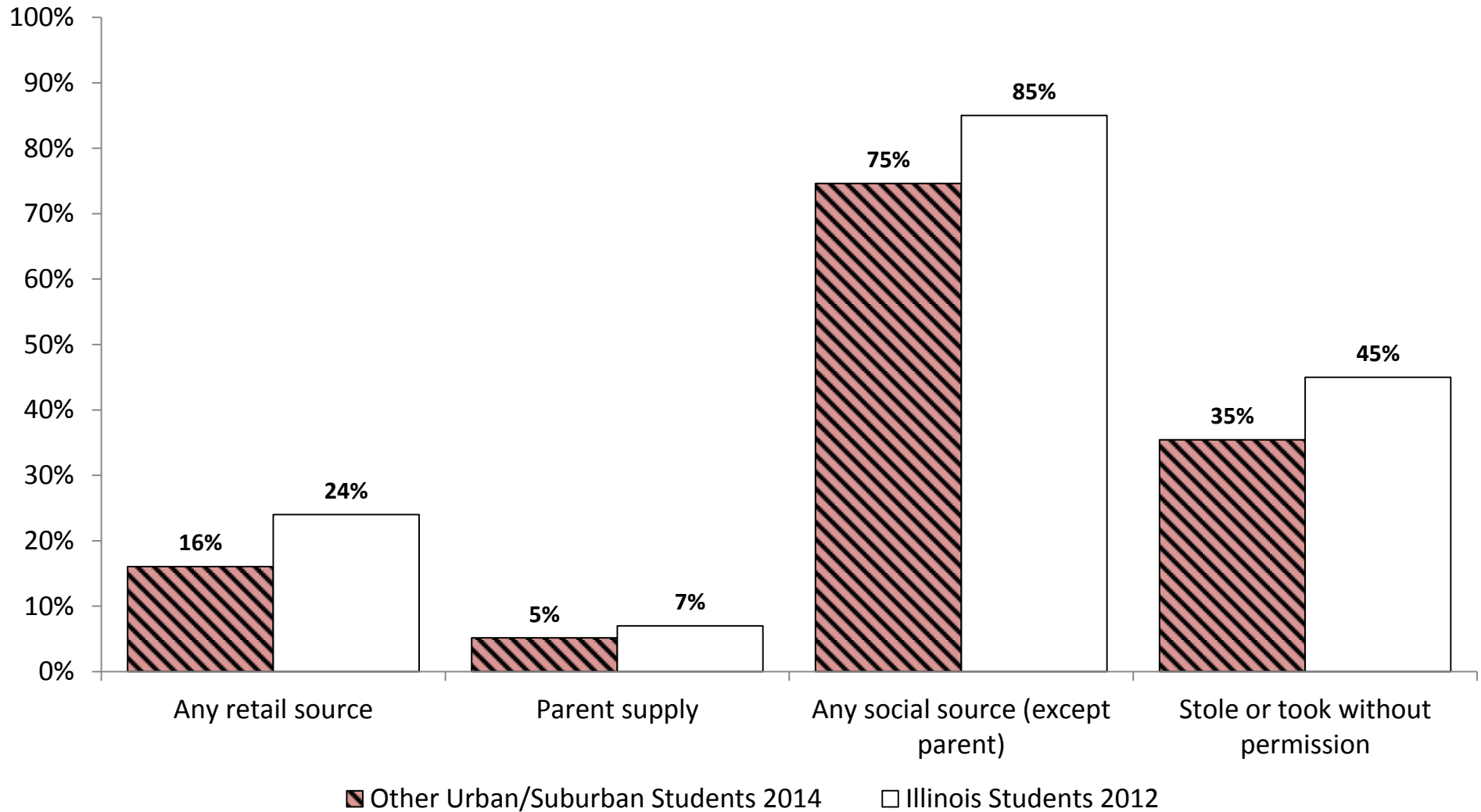

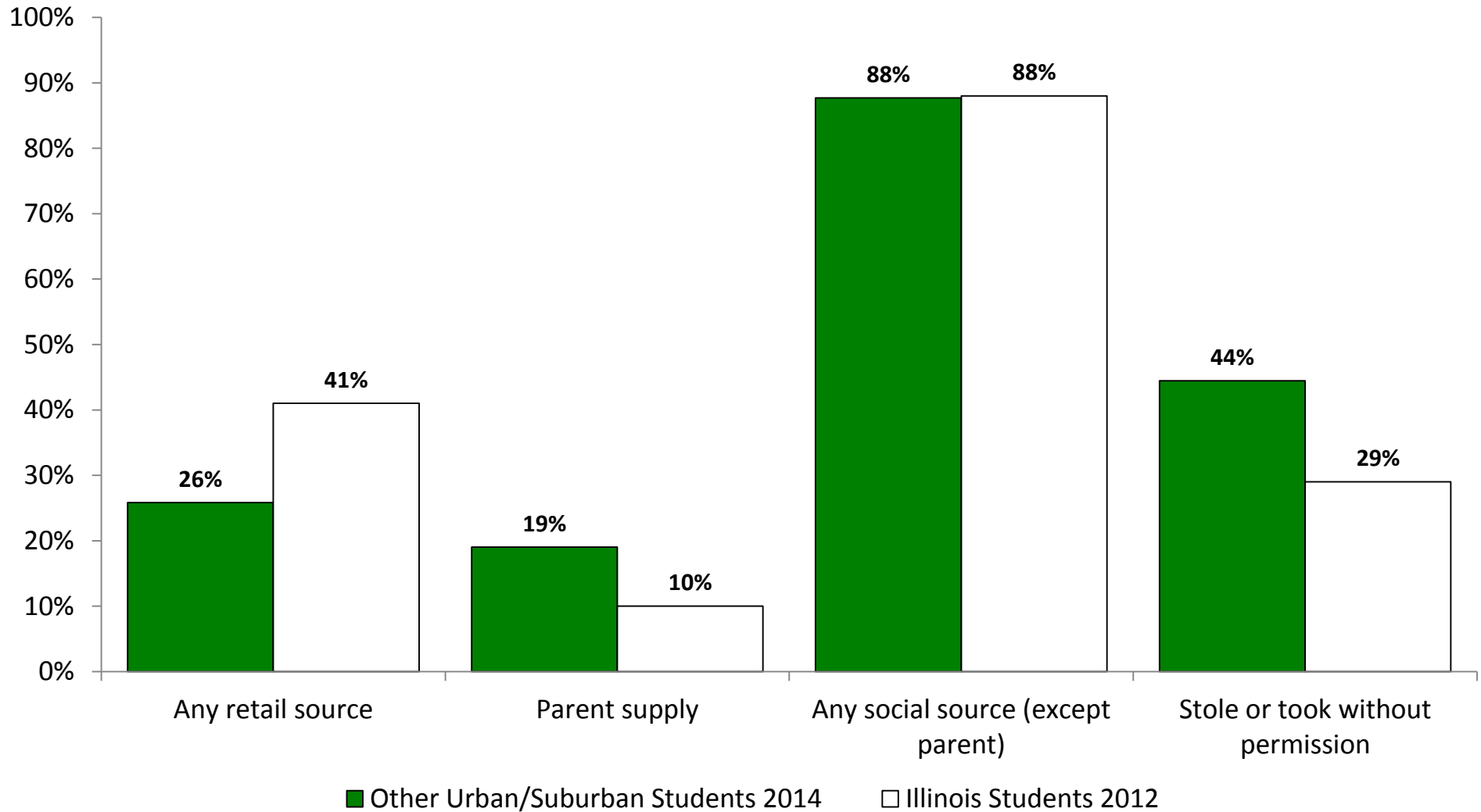

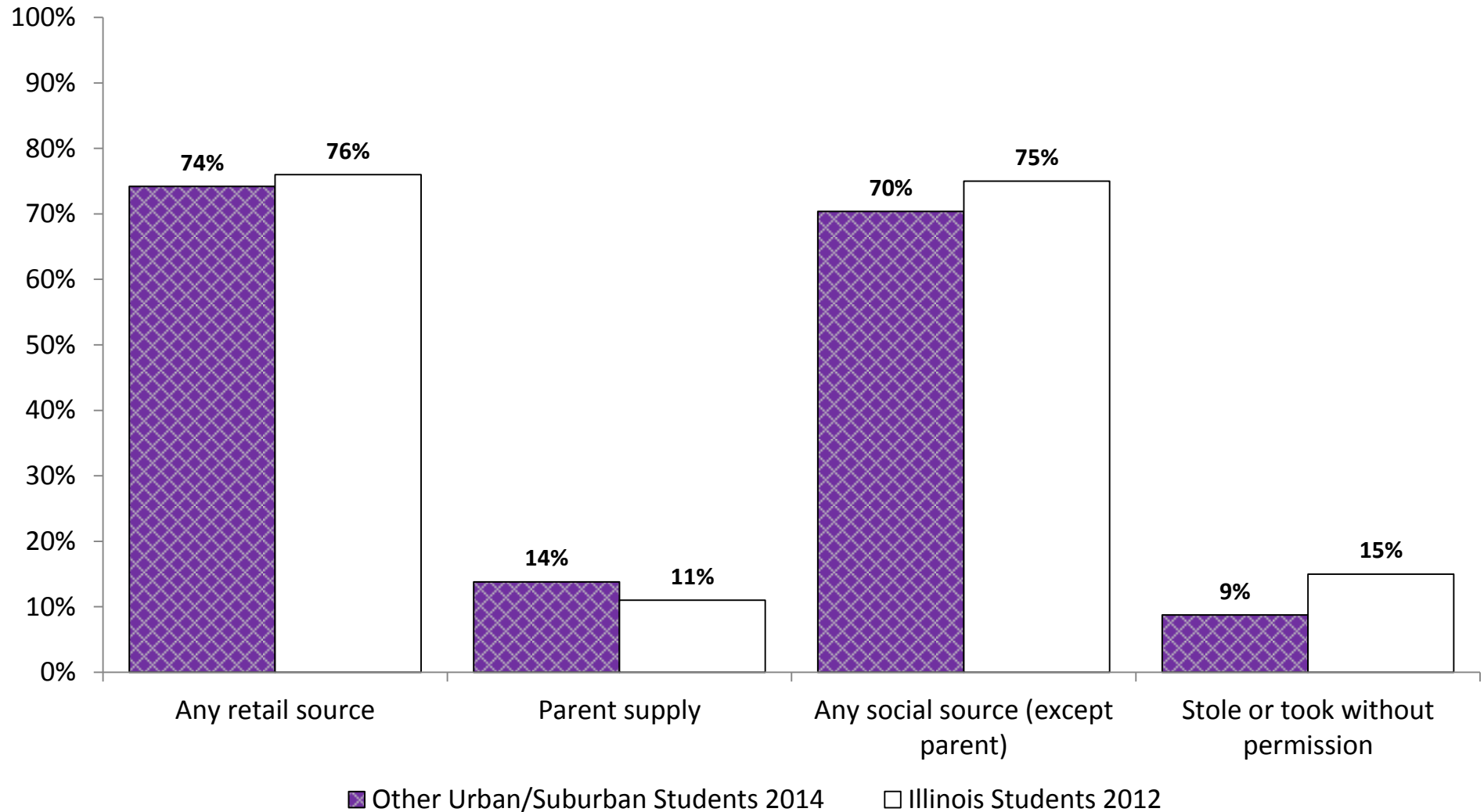

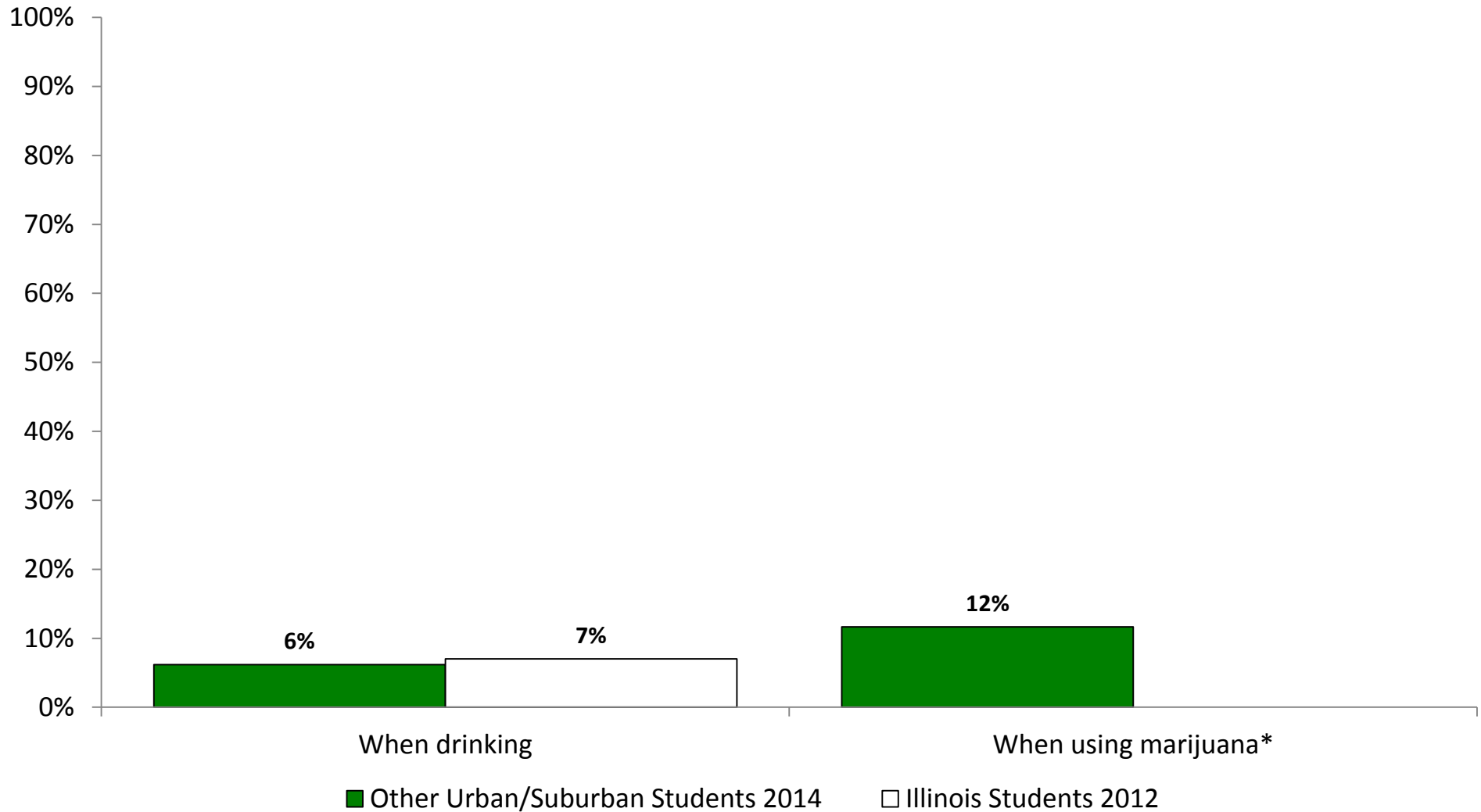

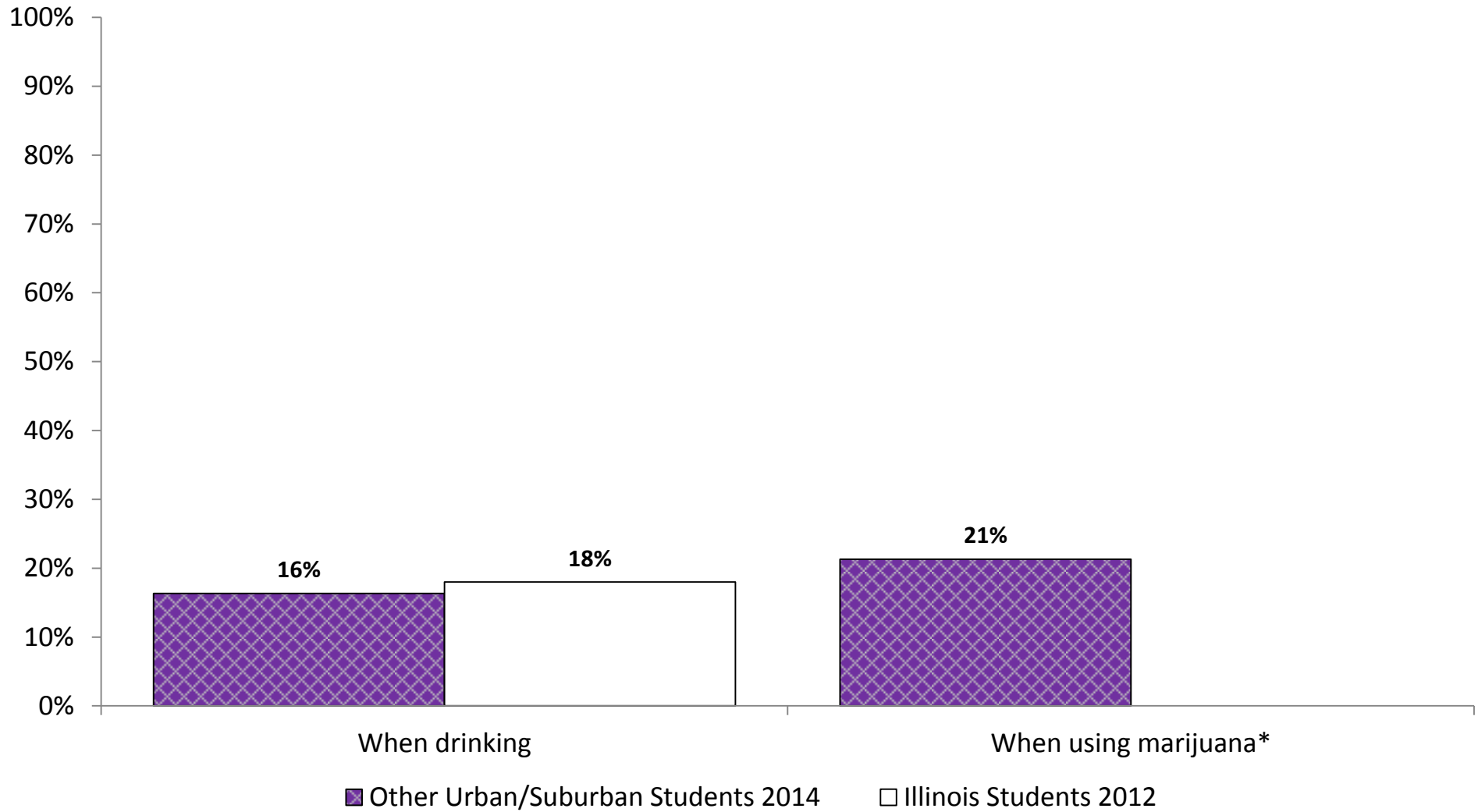

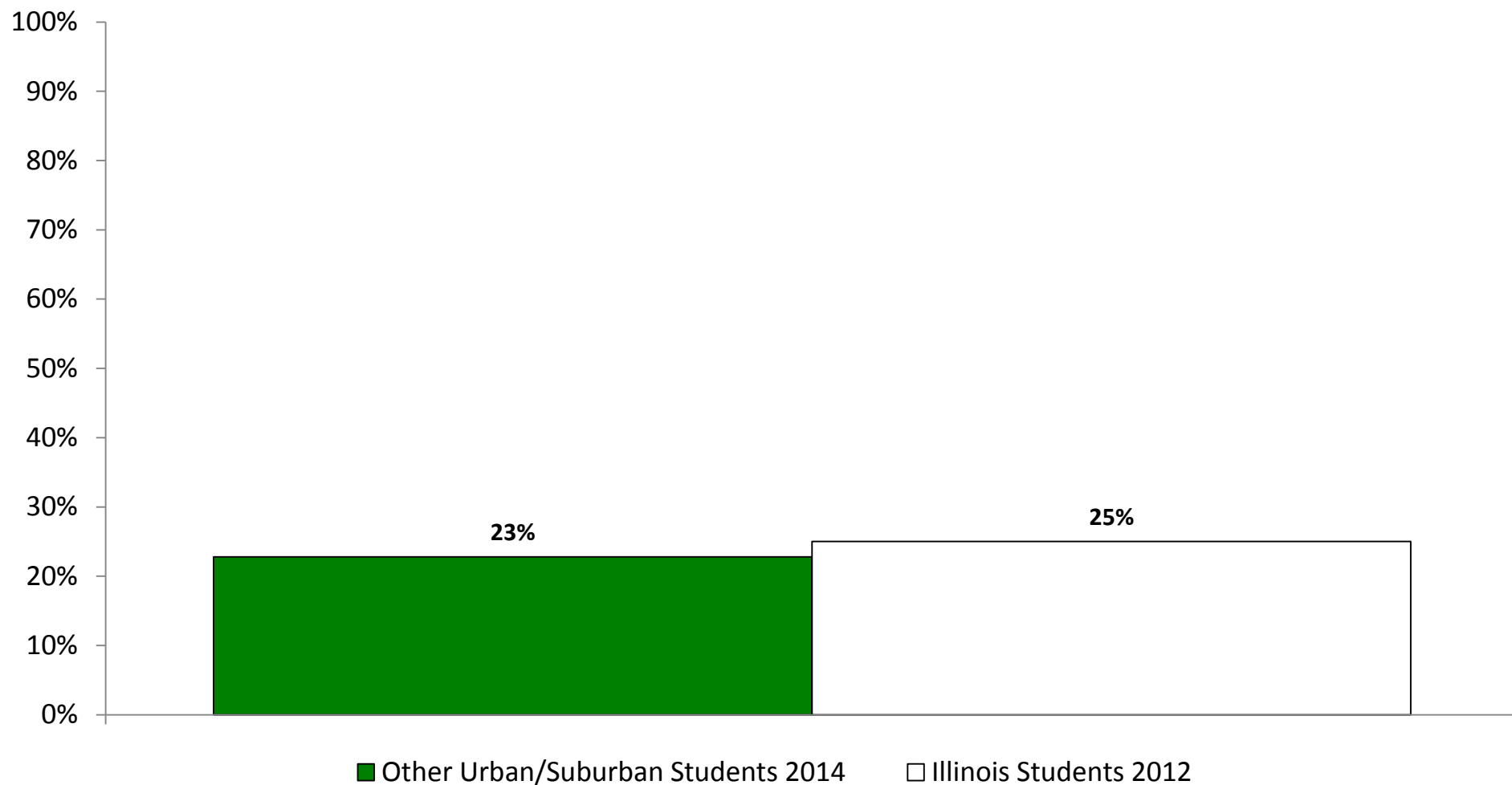

High School Students Who May Benefit from an Individual Substance Abuse Assessment*

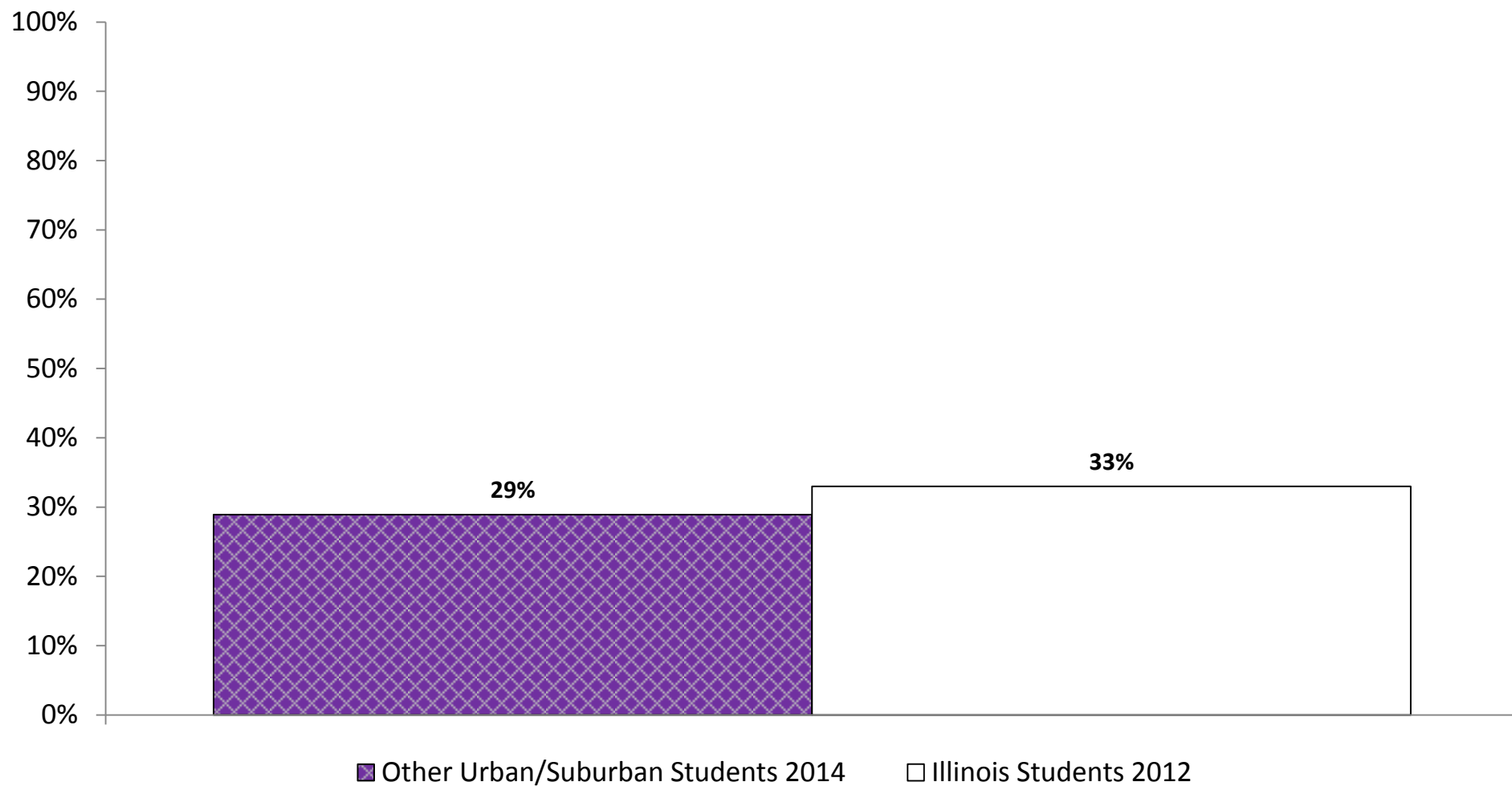

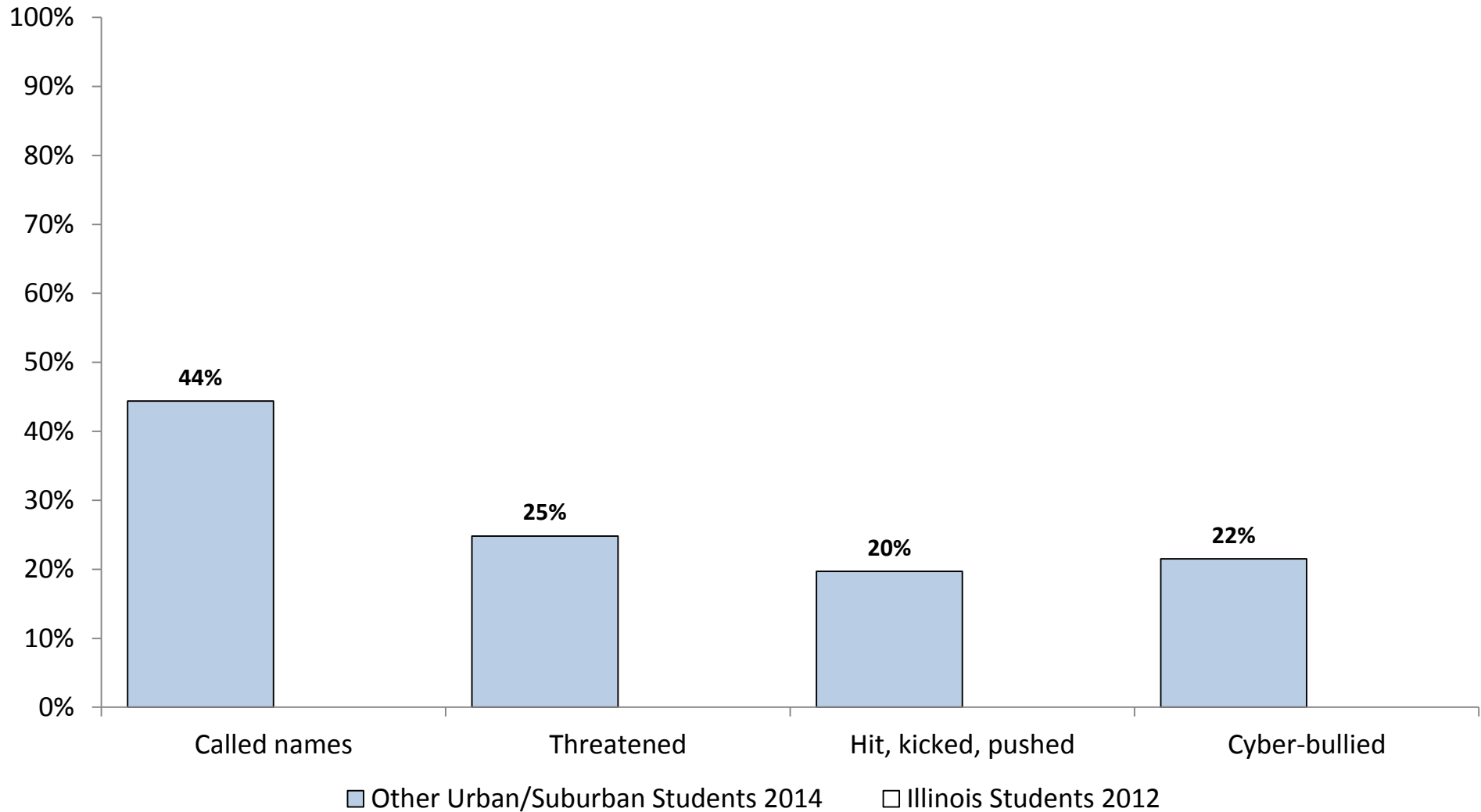

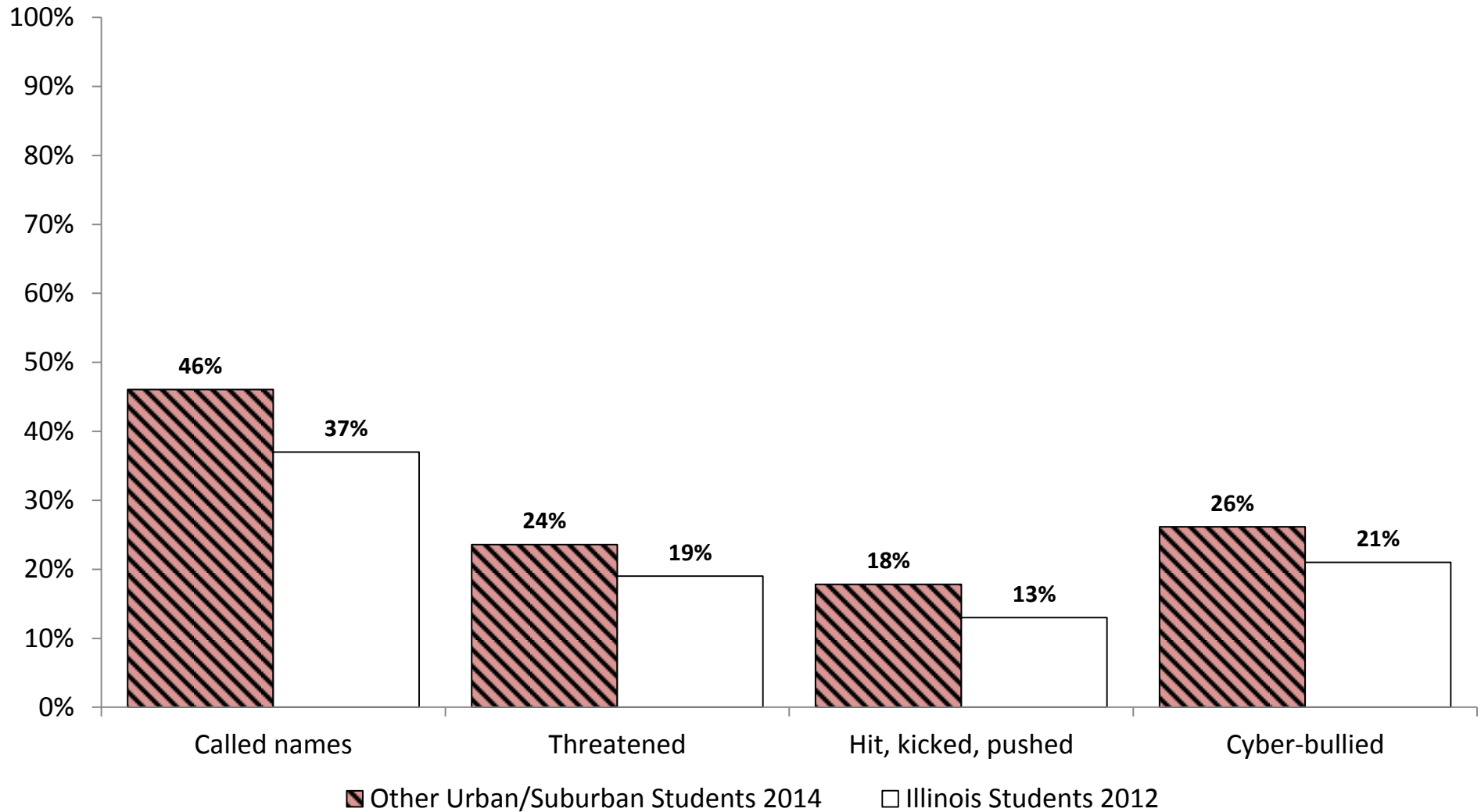

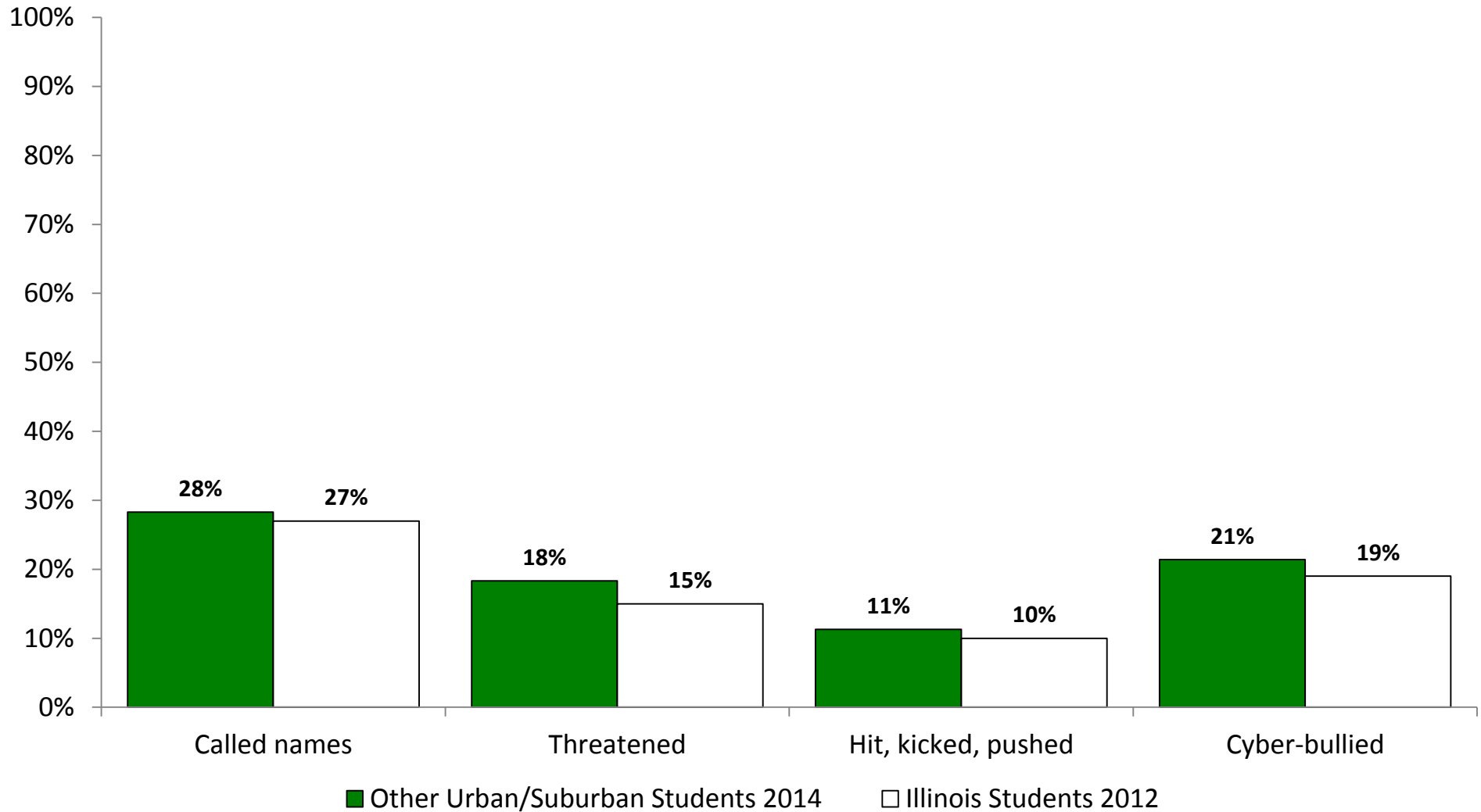
Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months

Among 8th Grade Youth



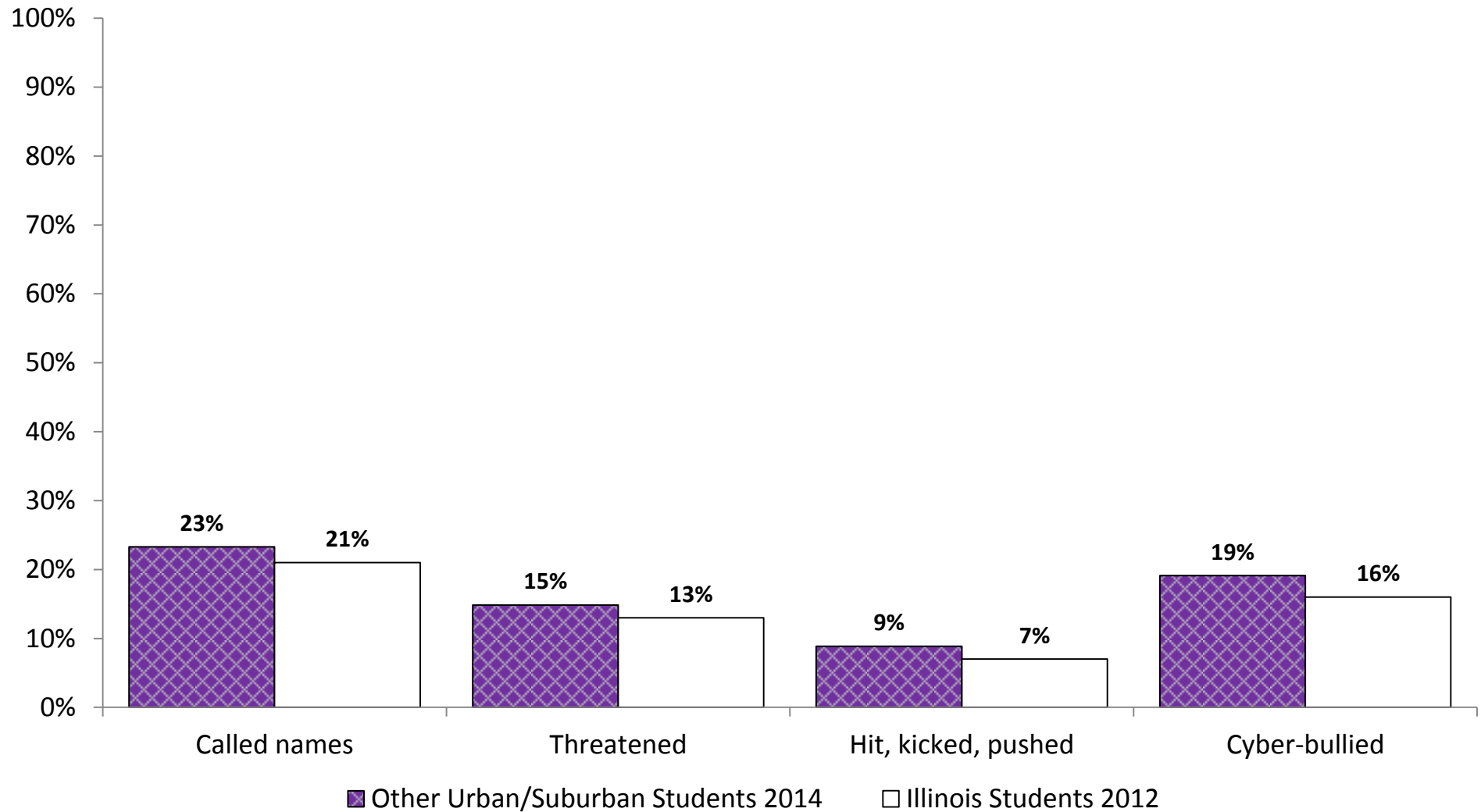

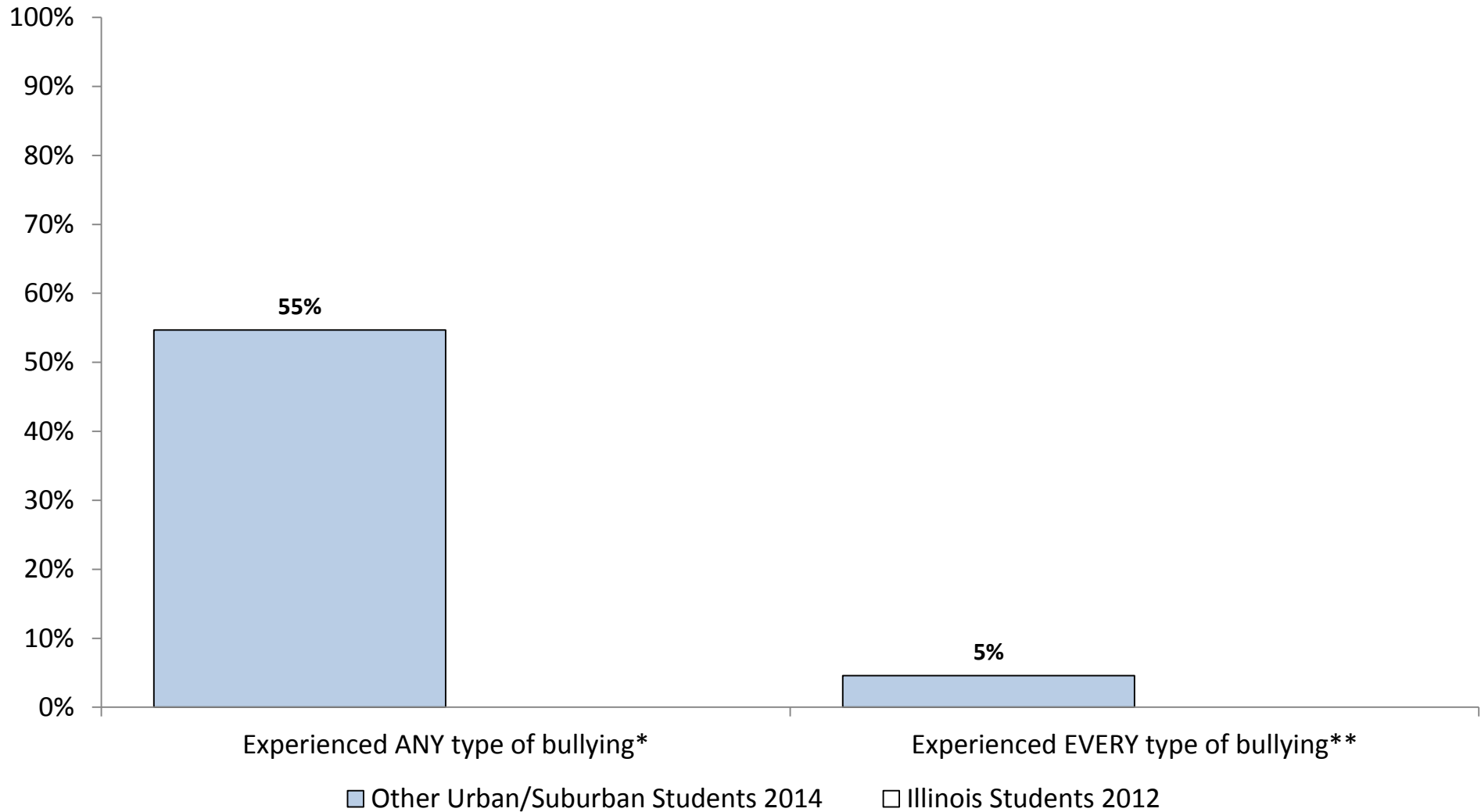

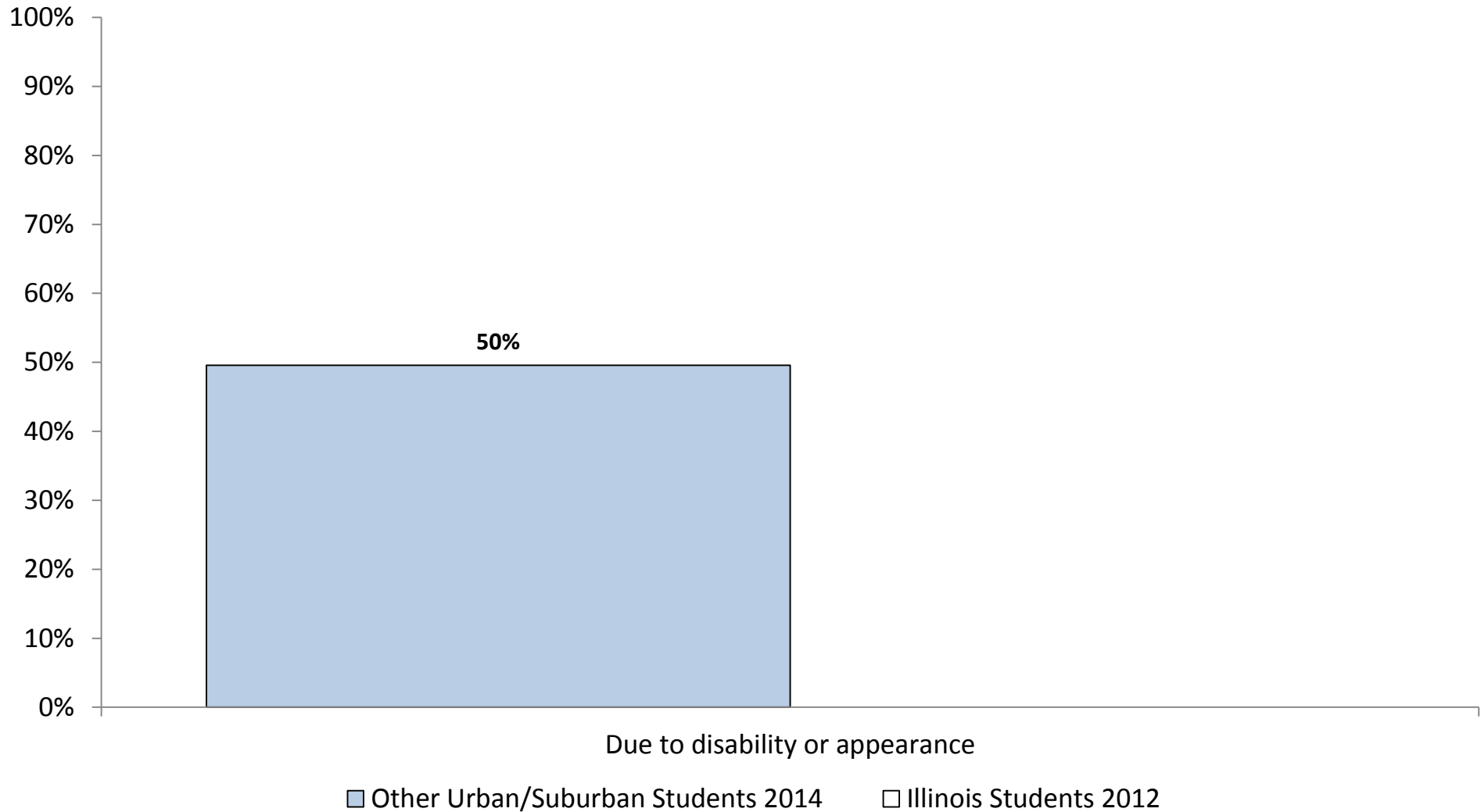

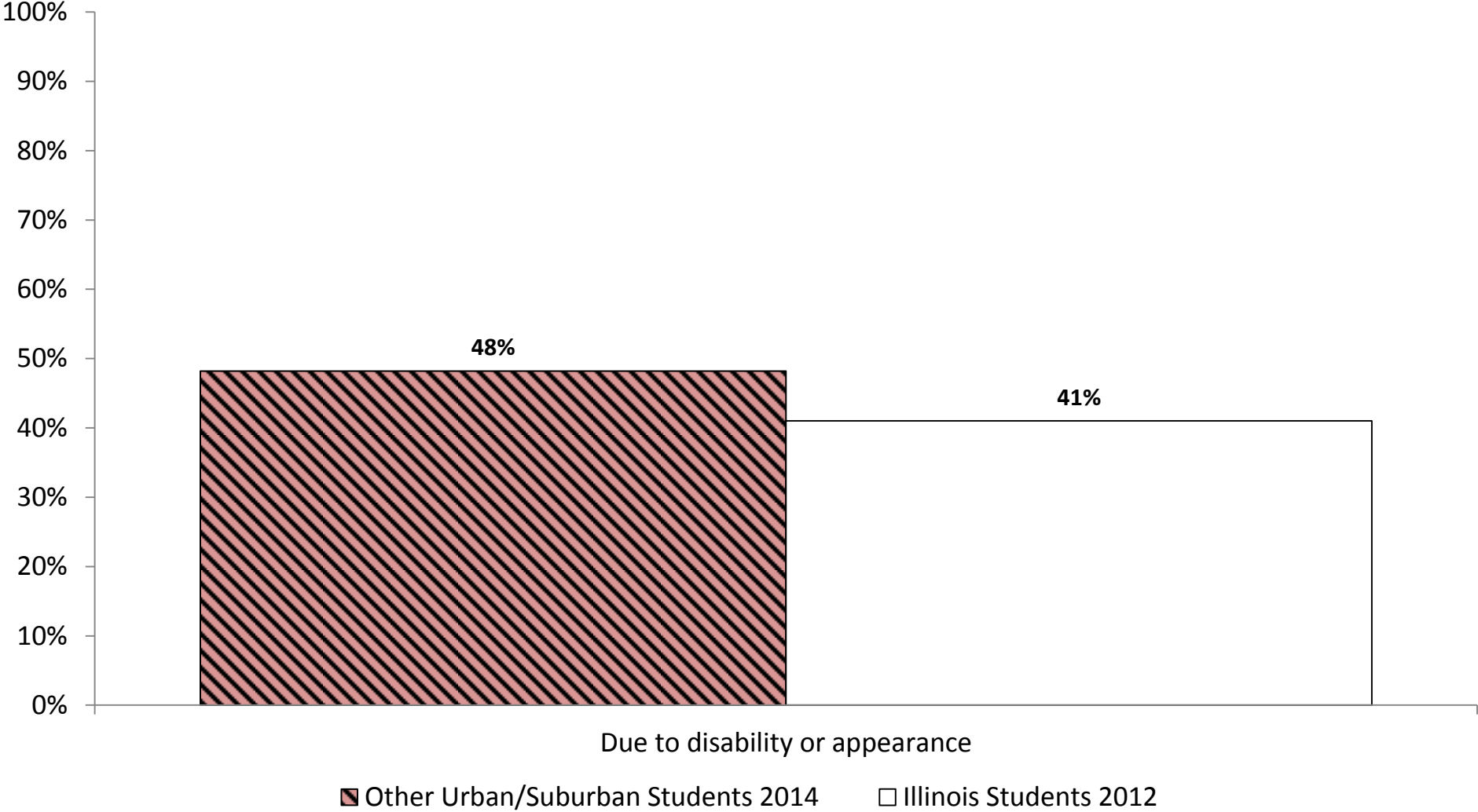

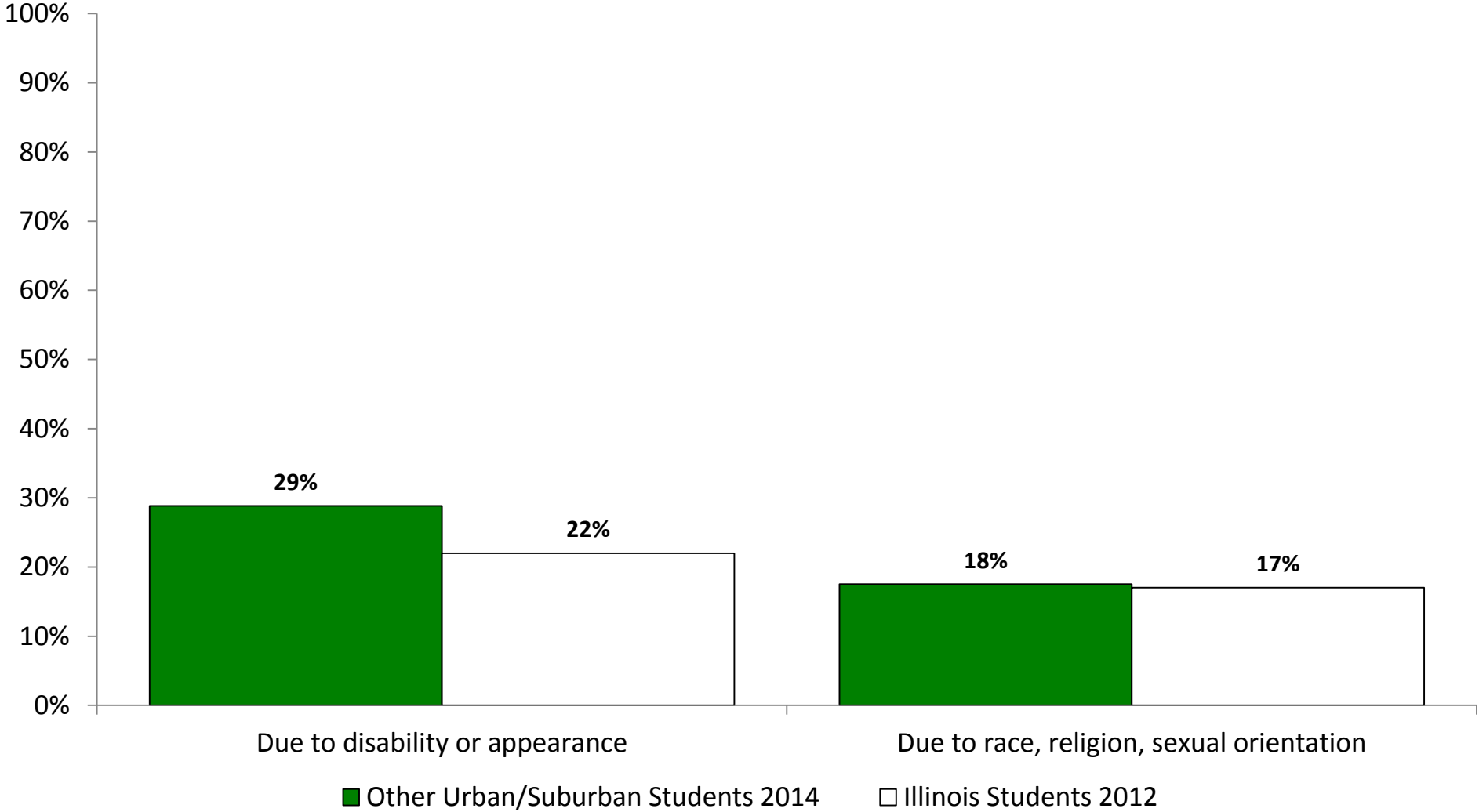

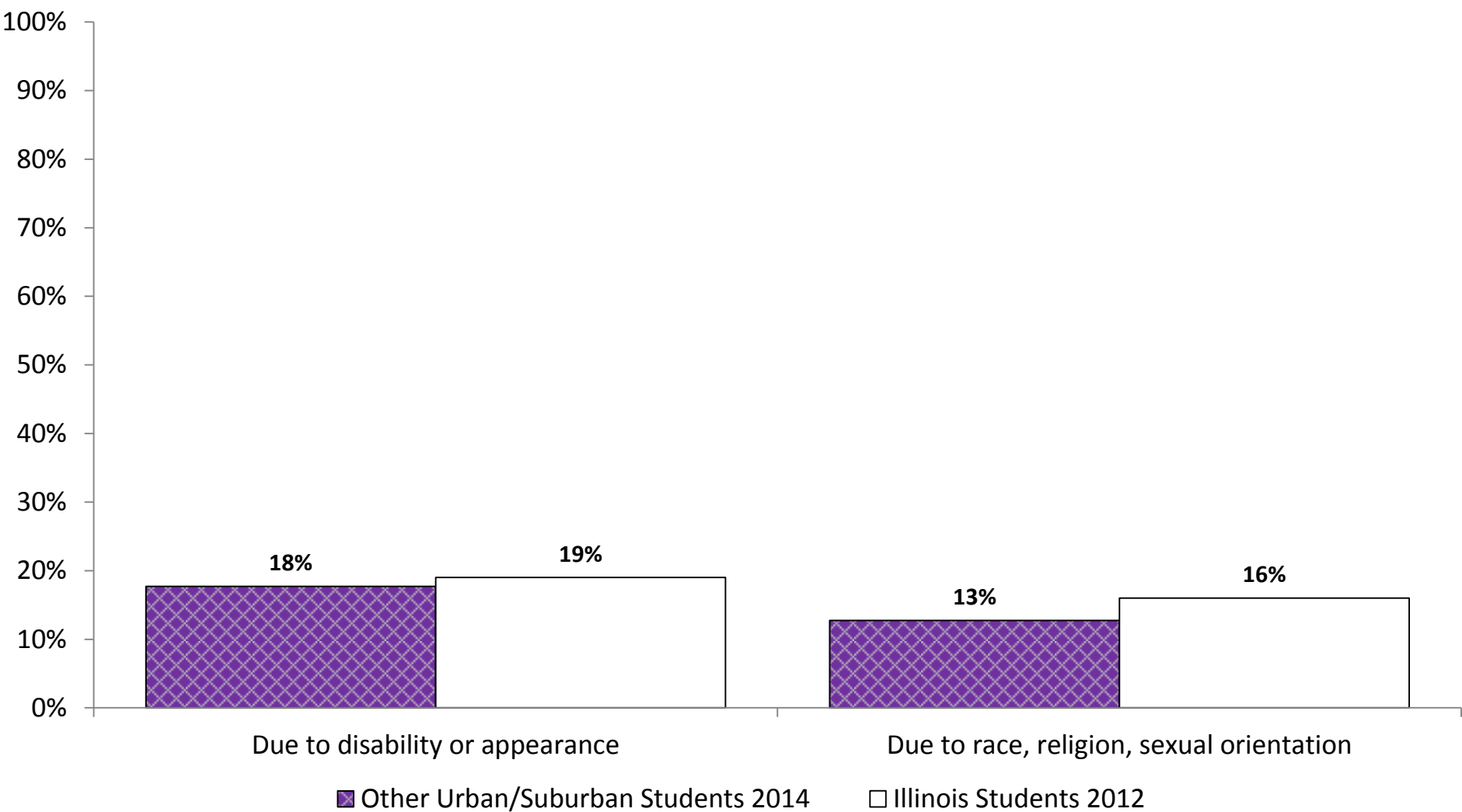

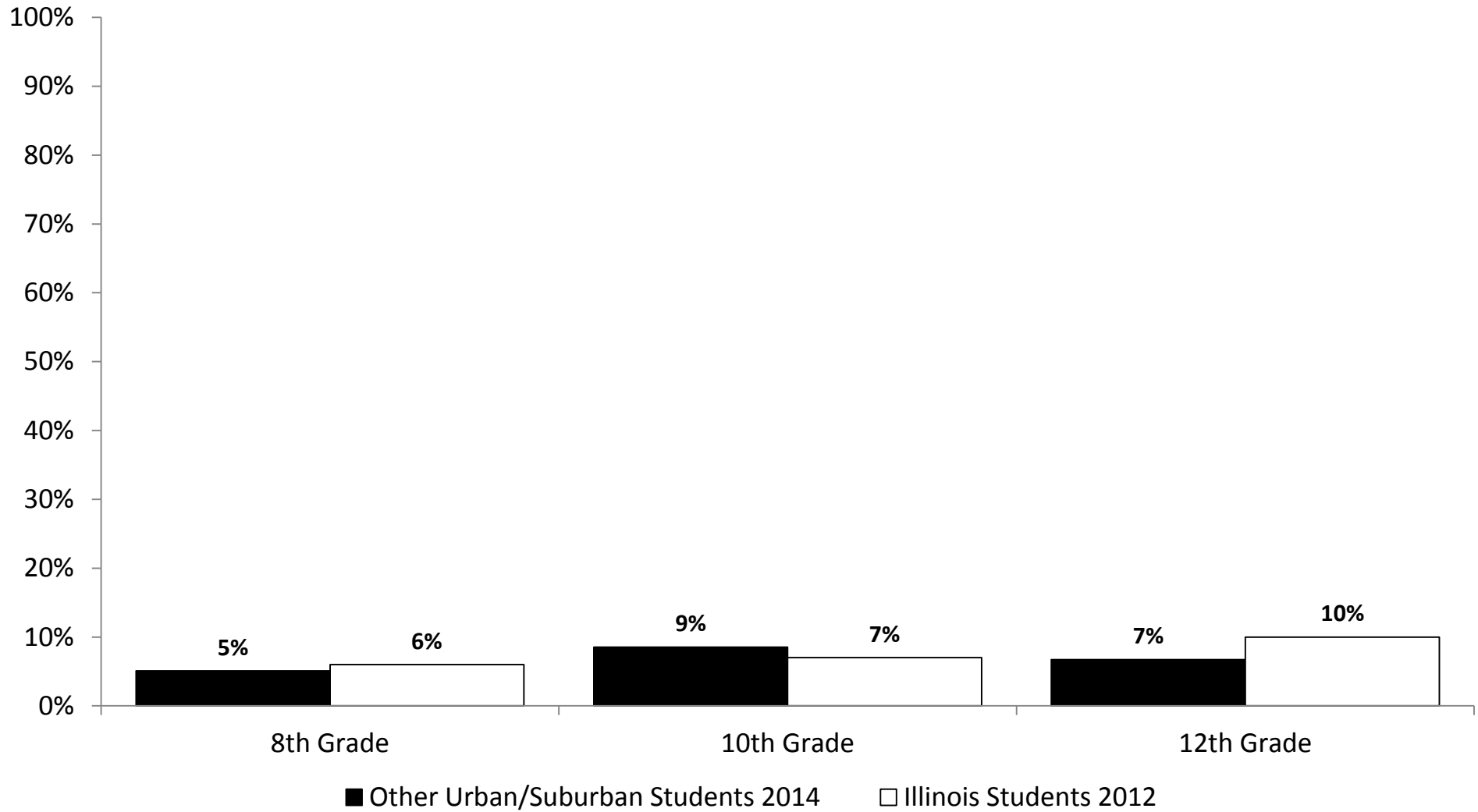

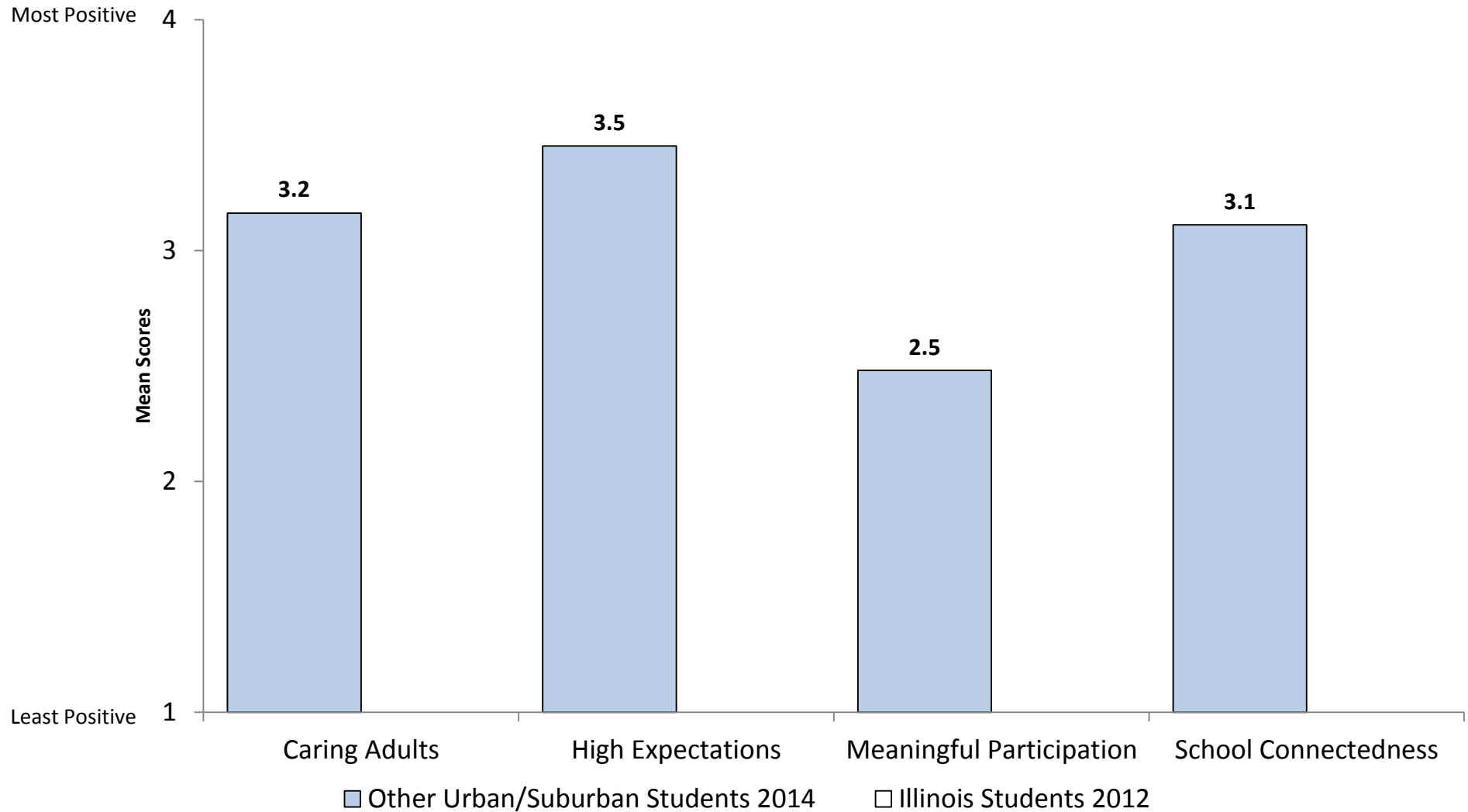

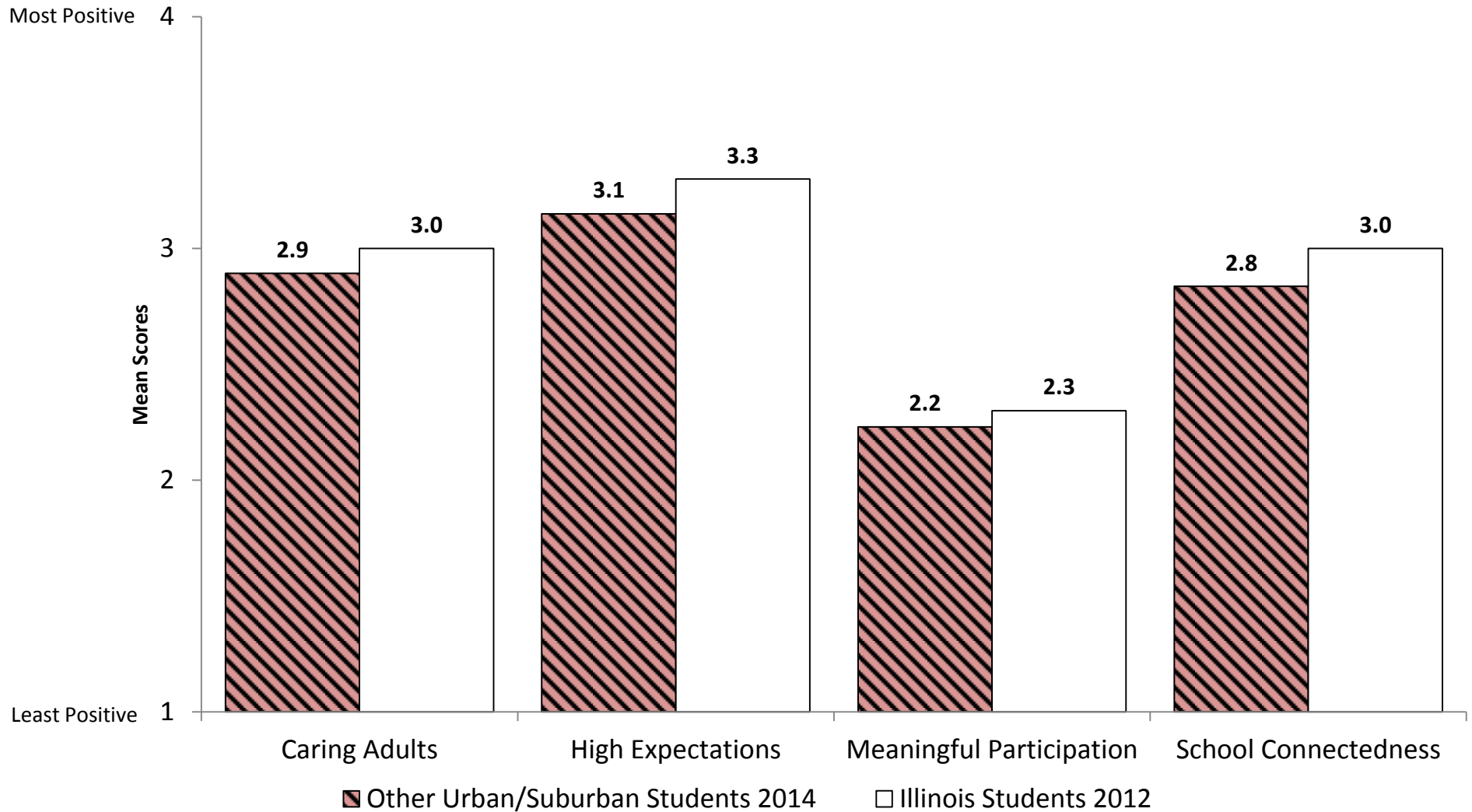
Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 6th Grade Youth

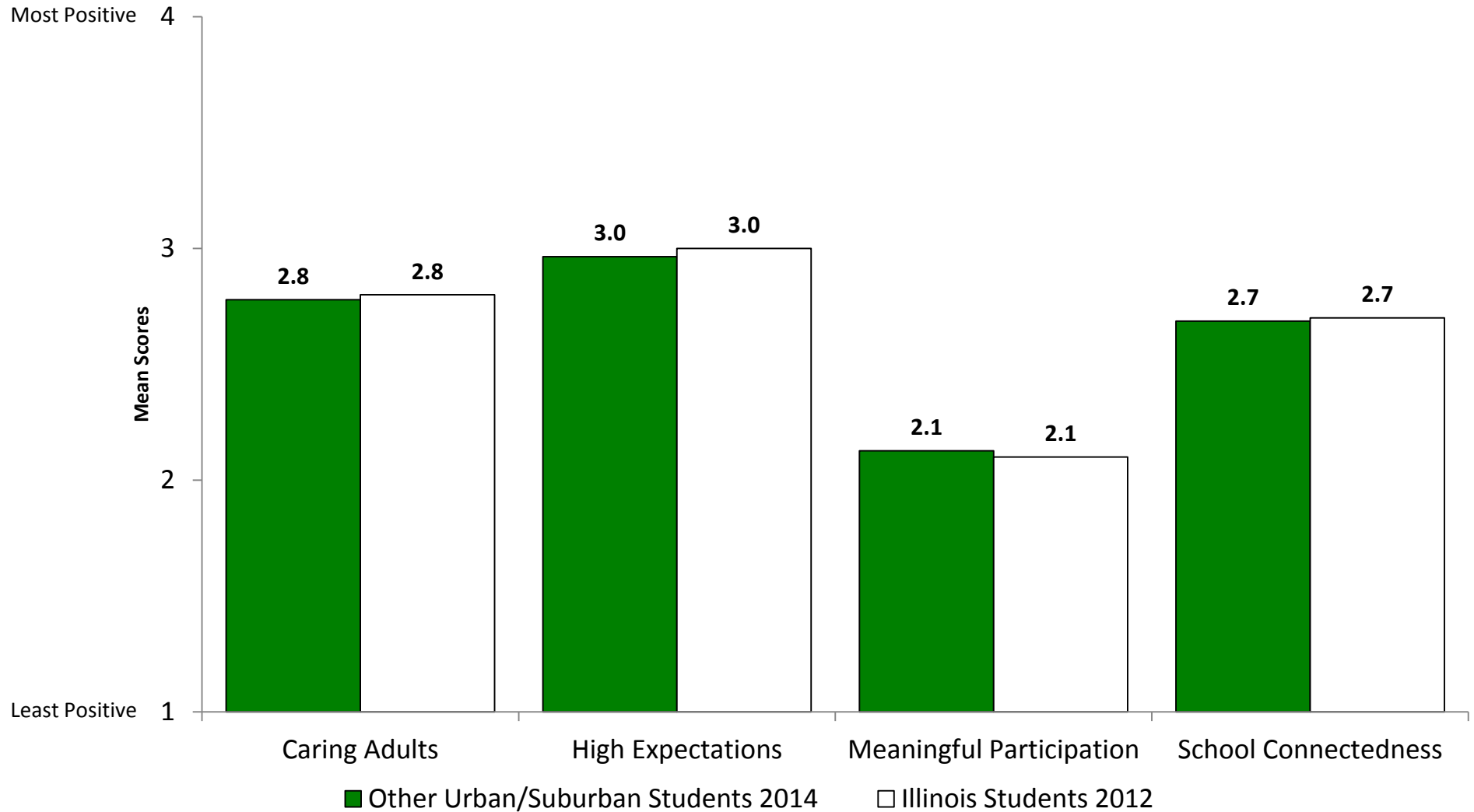

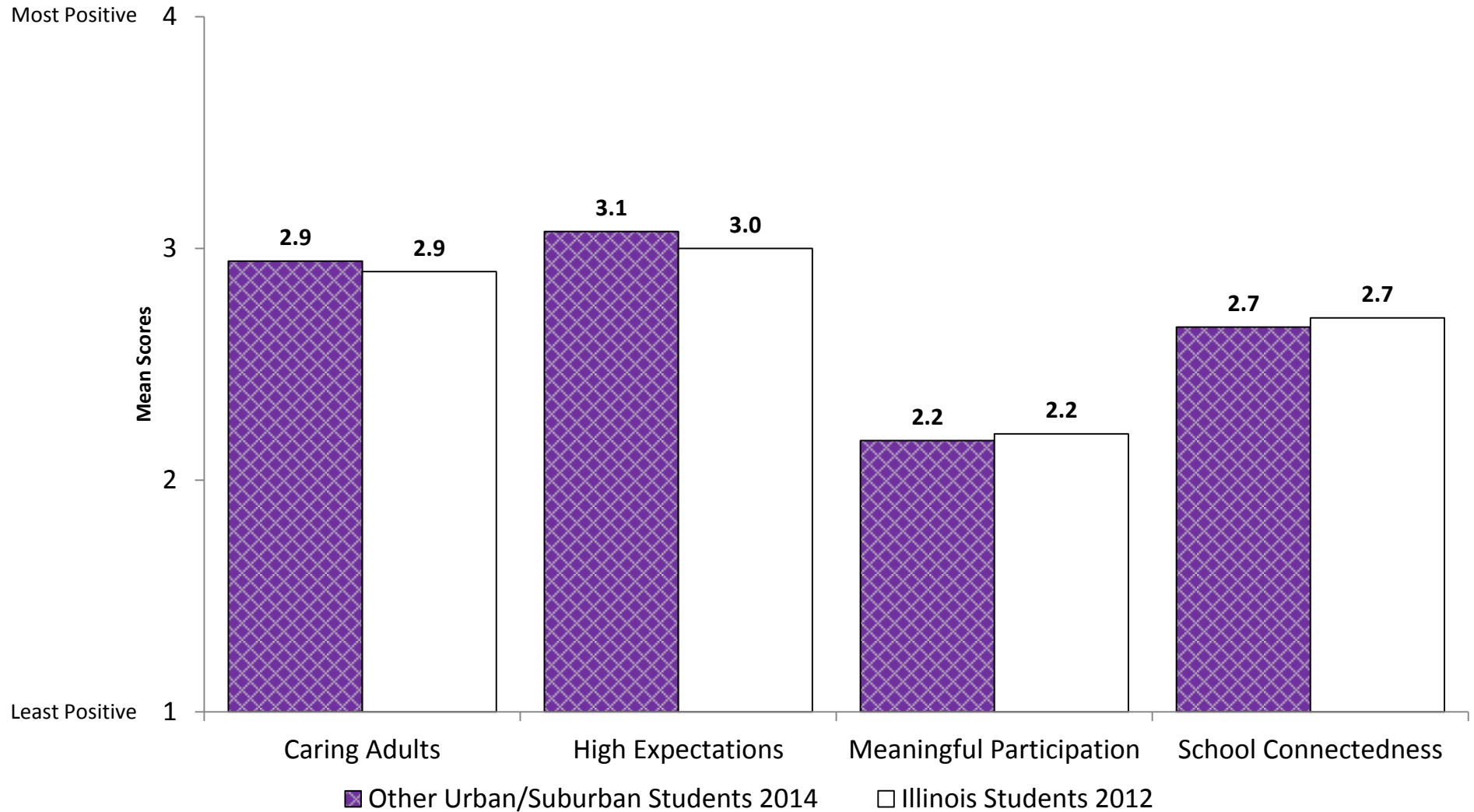

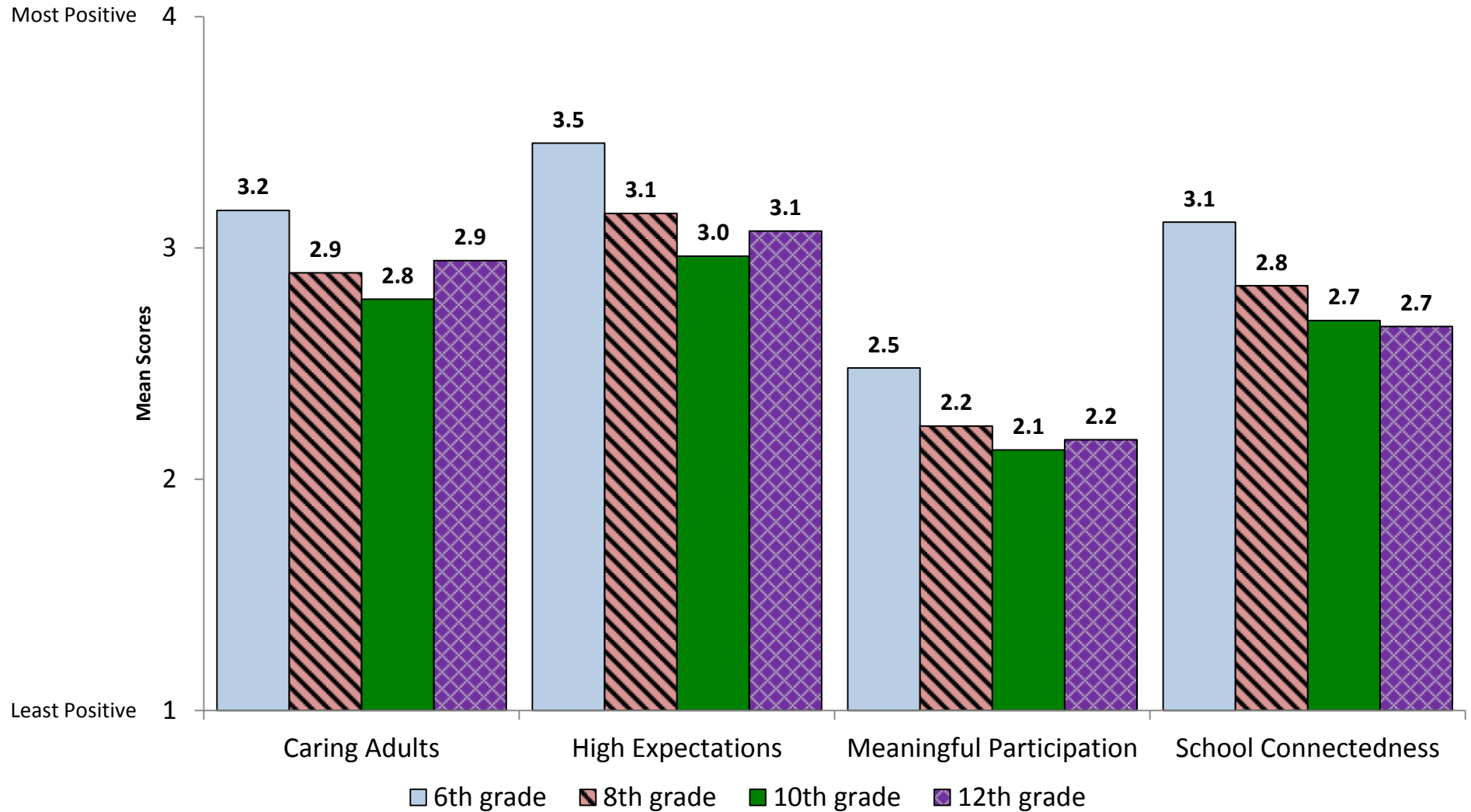

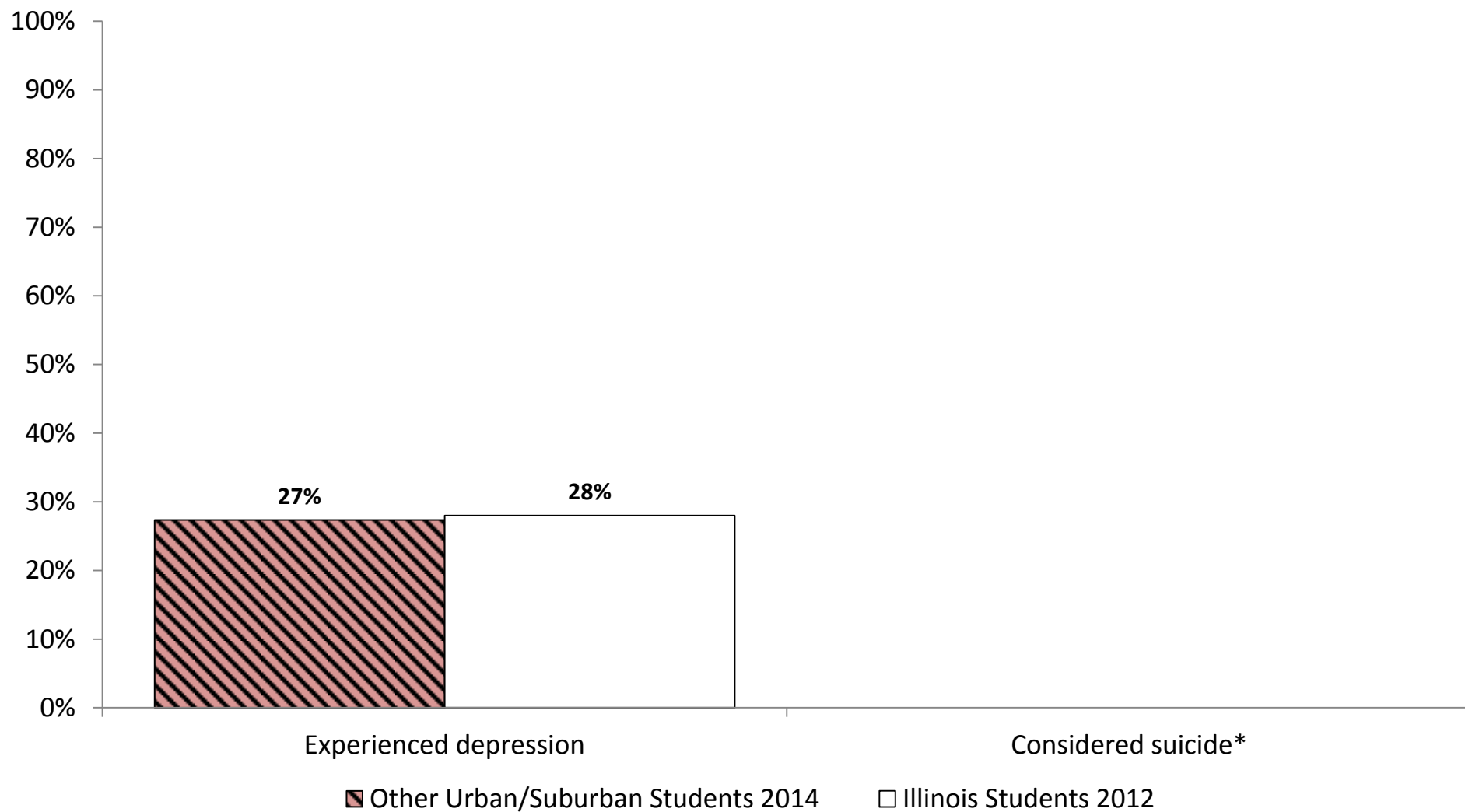

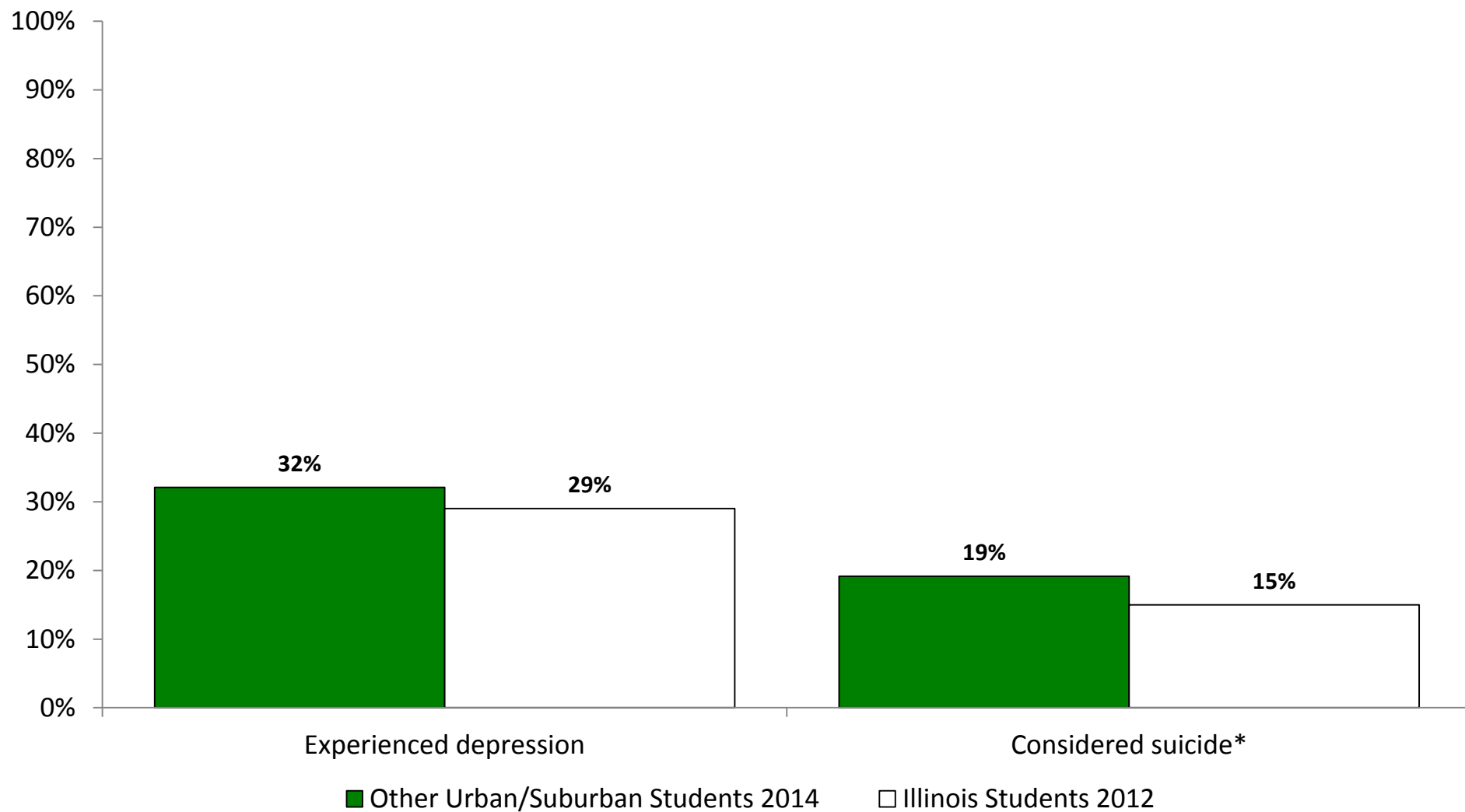

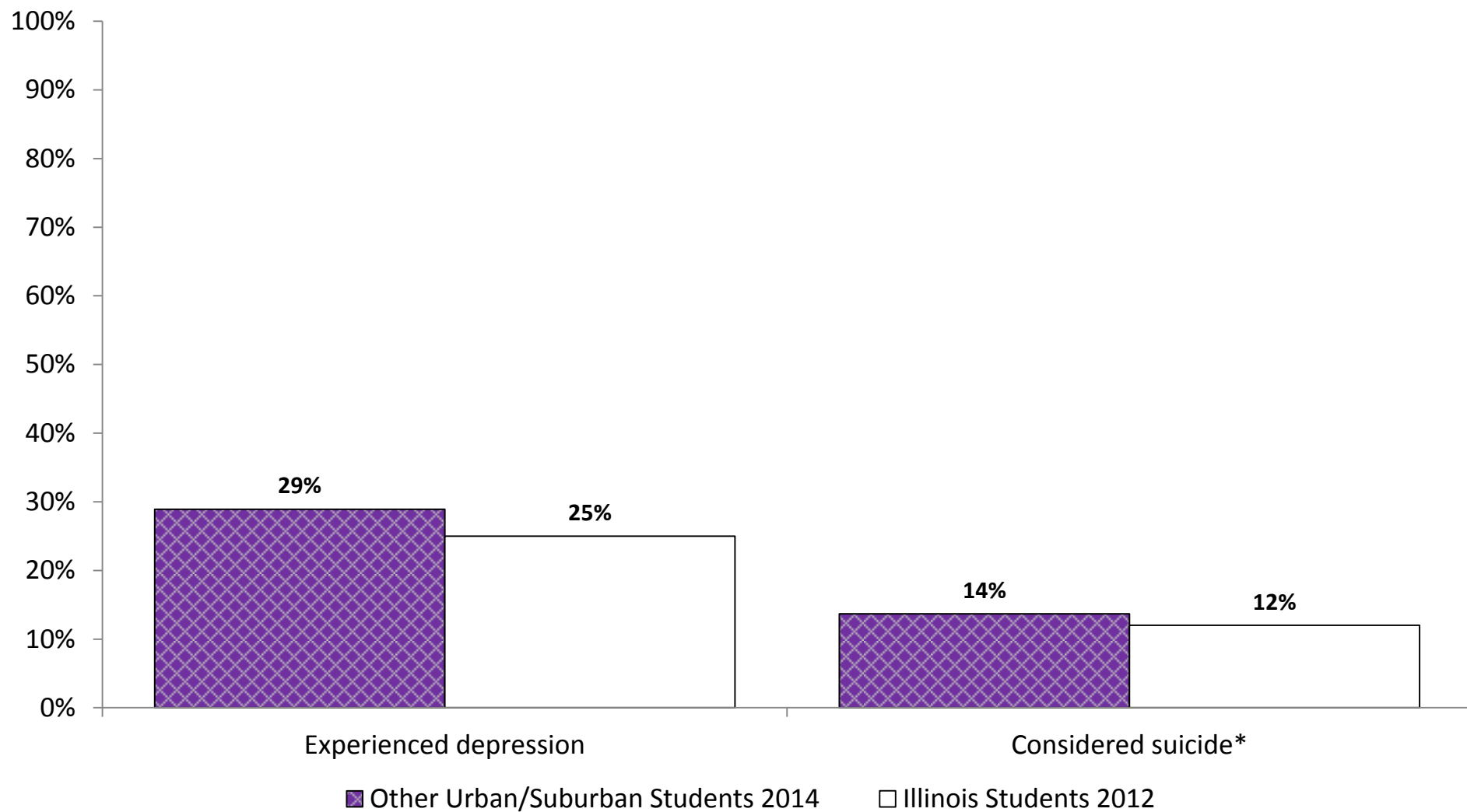

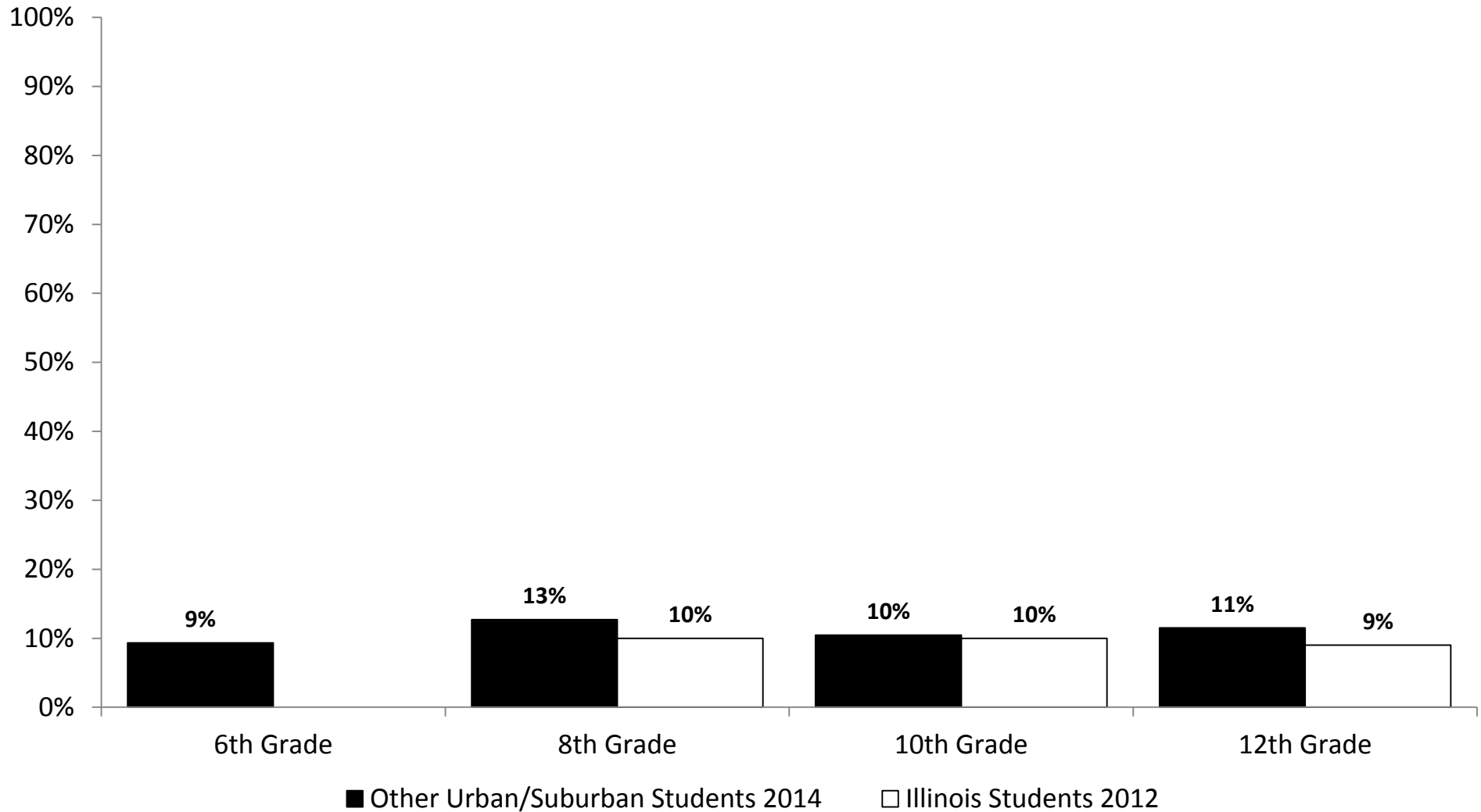

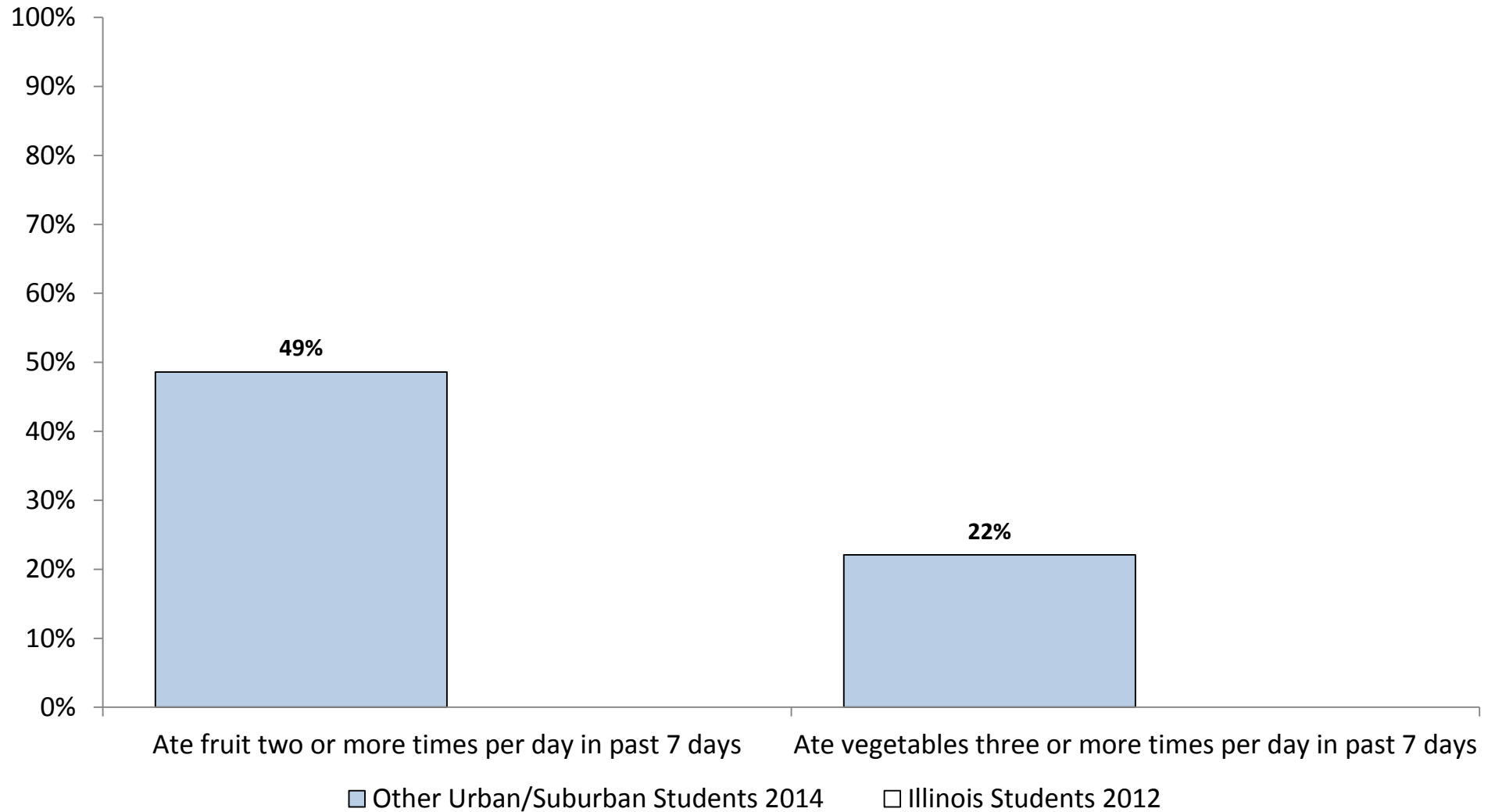

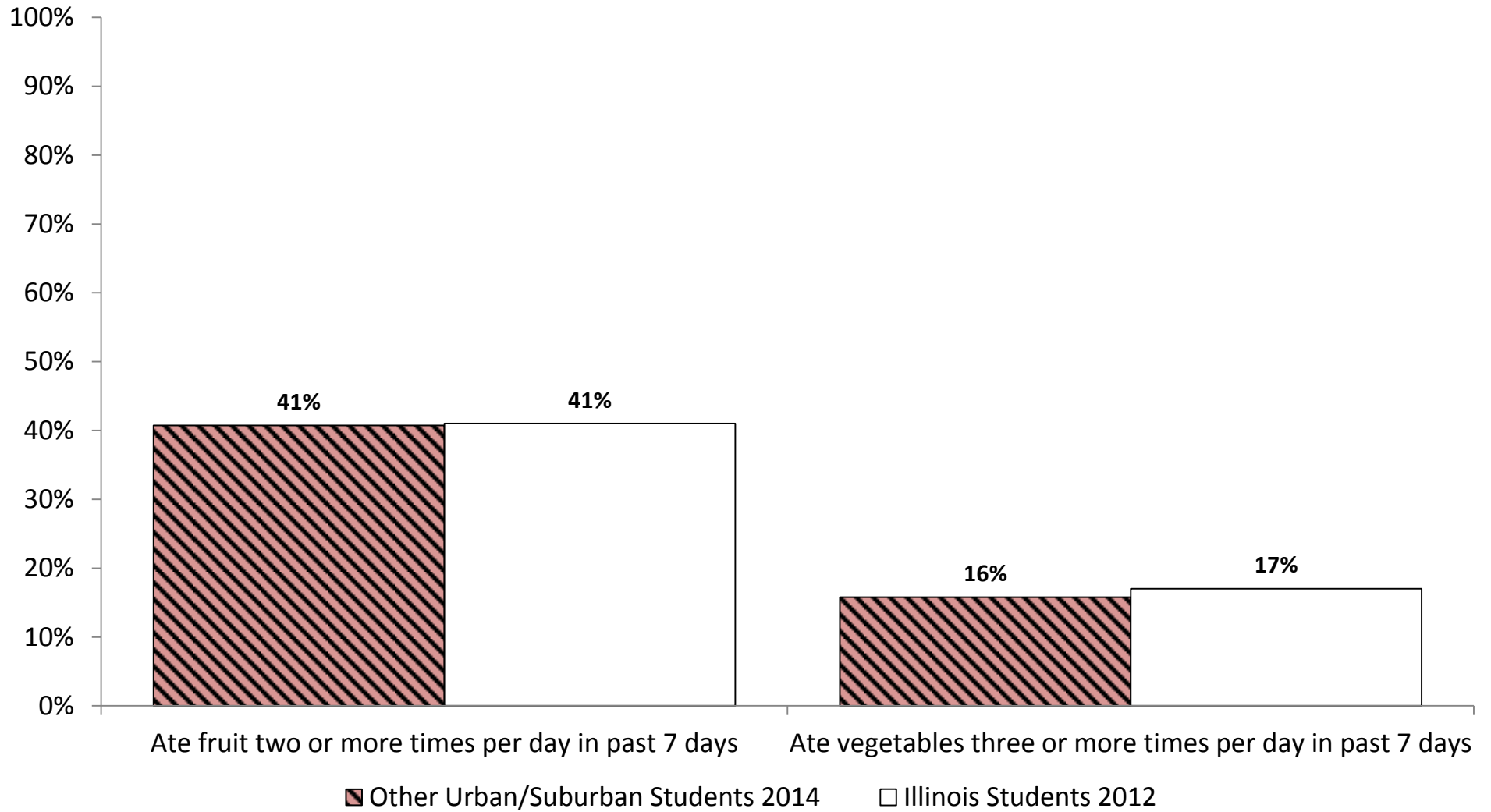

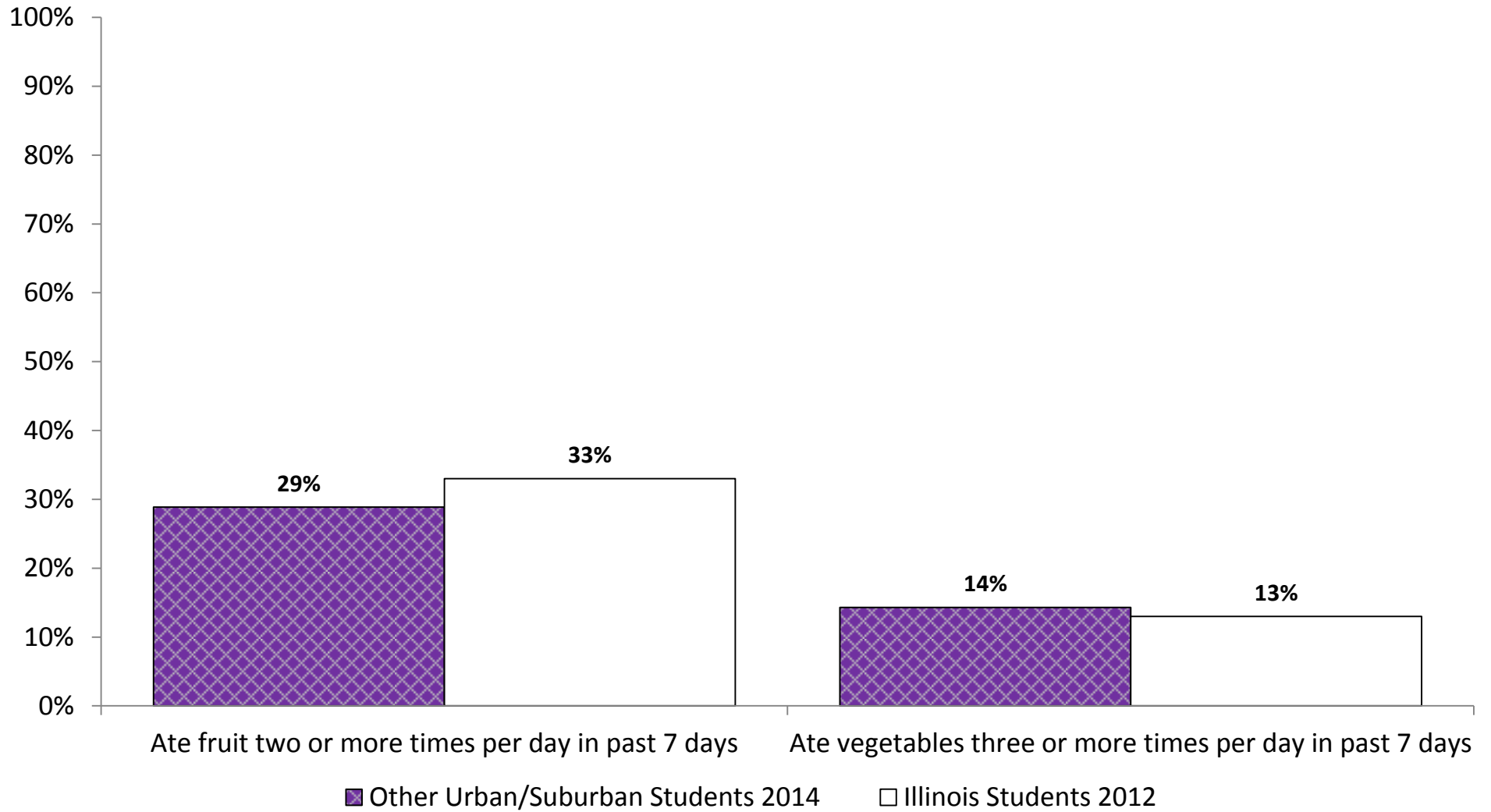

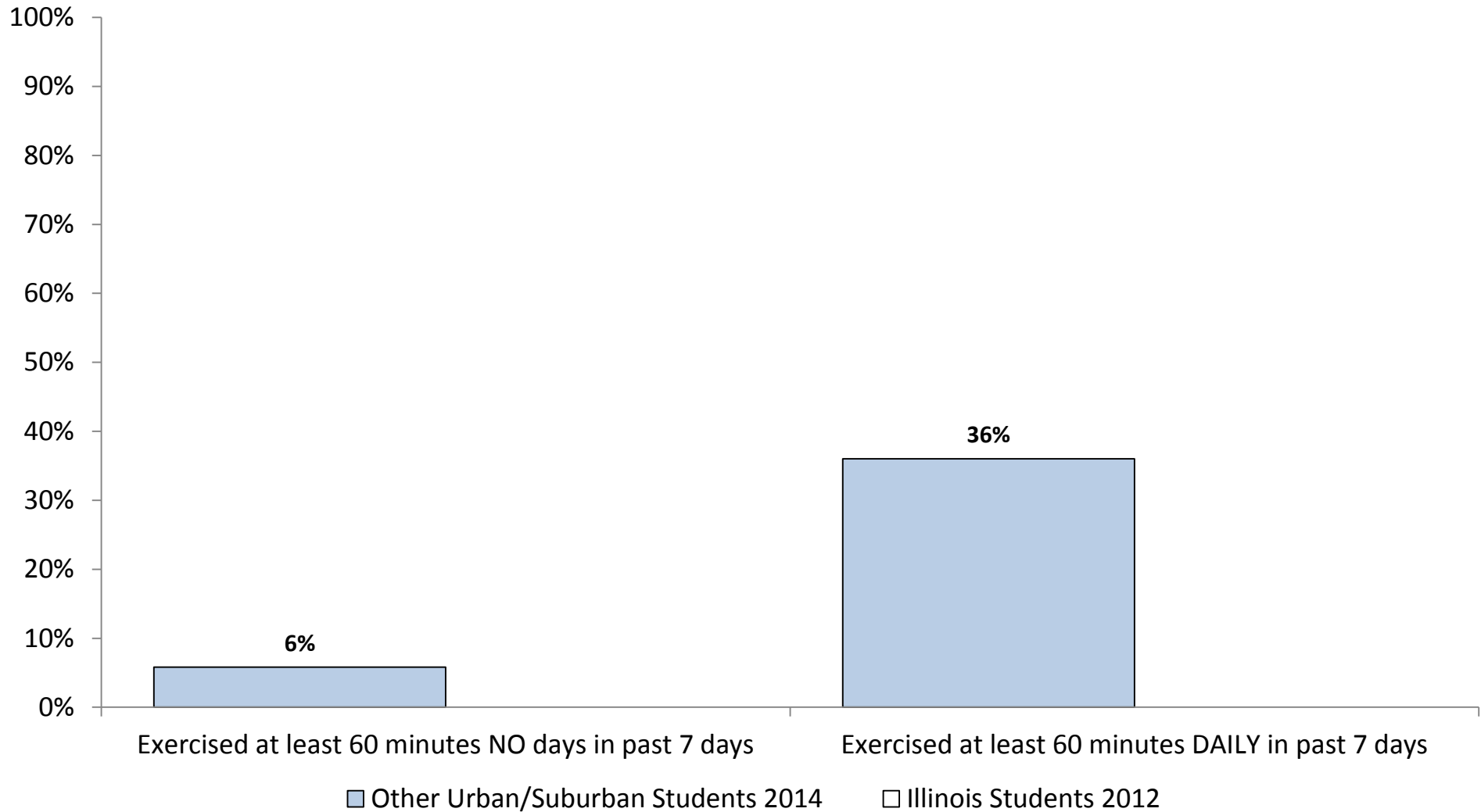

Frequency of Physical Activity

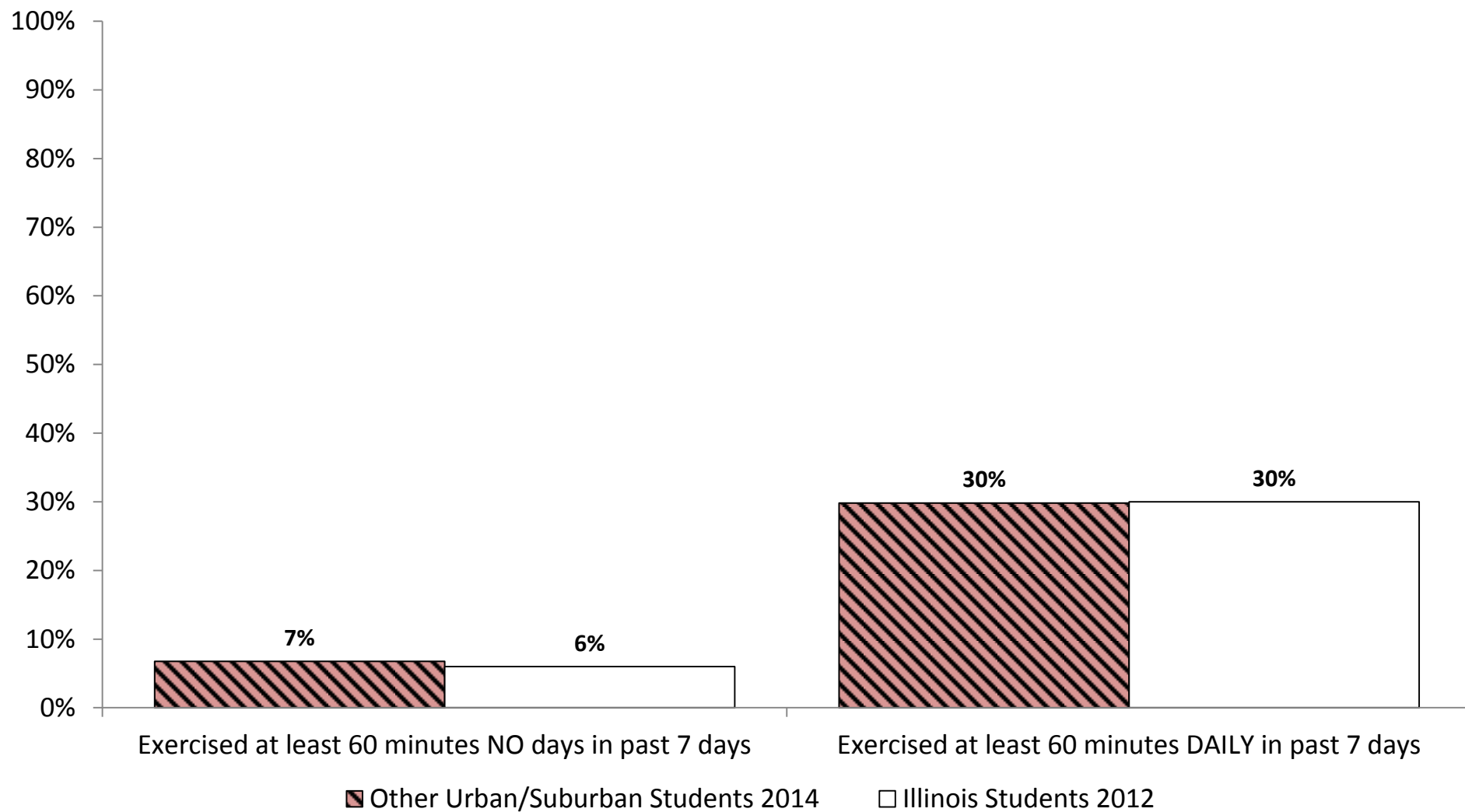

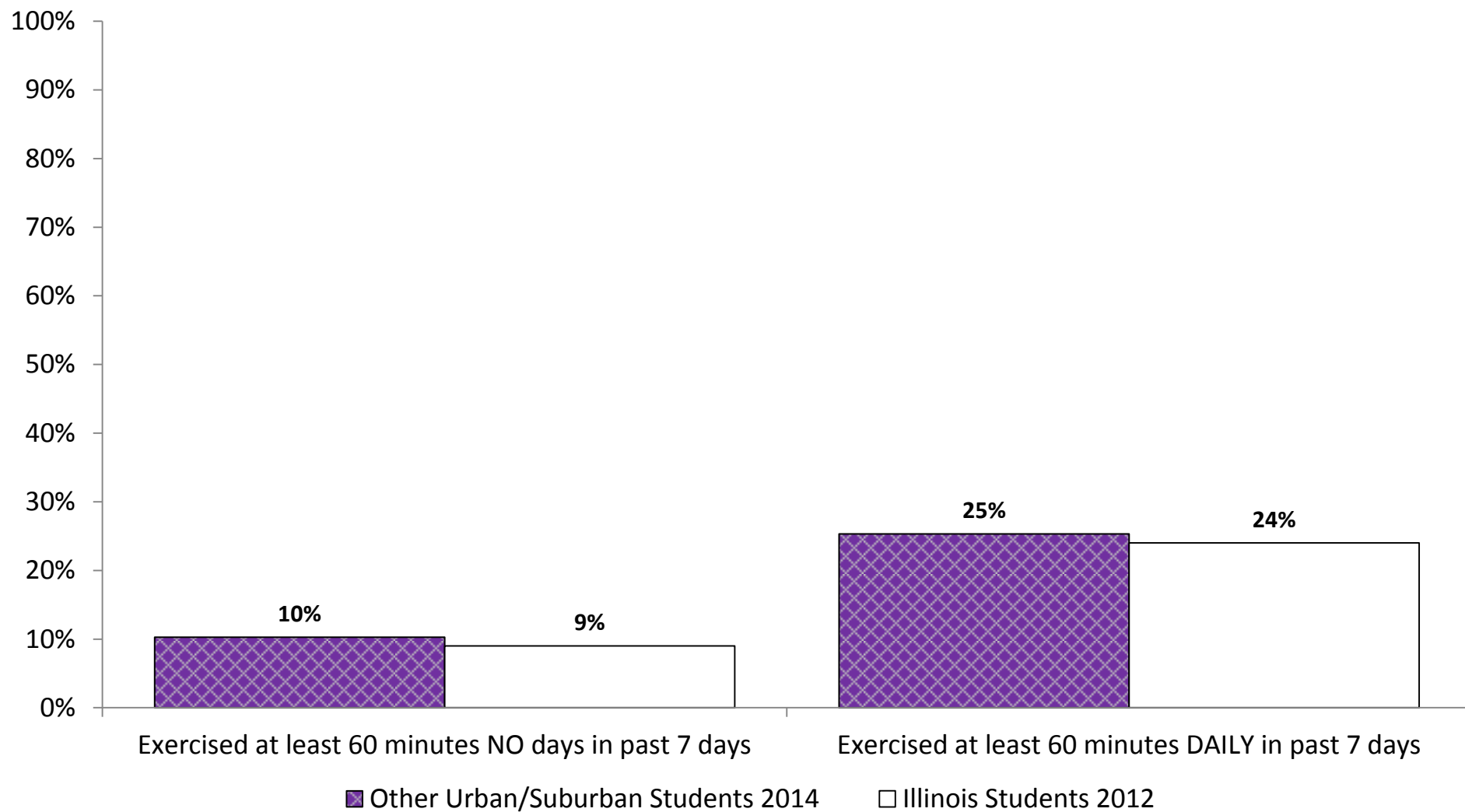

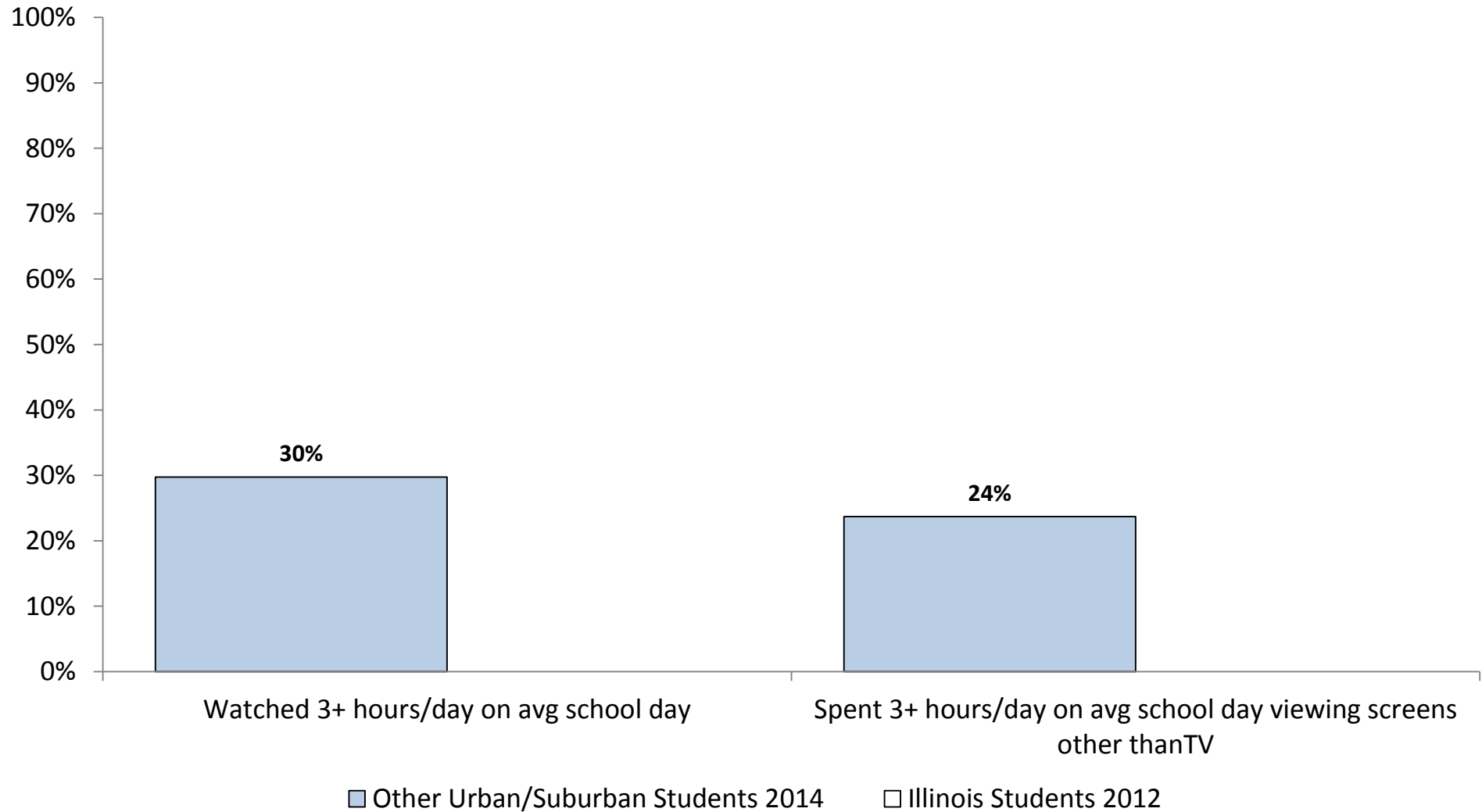

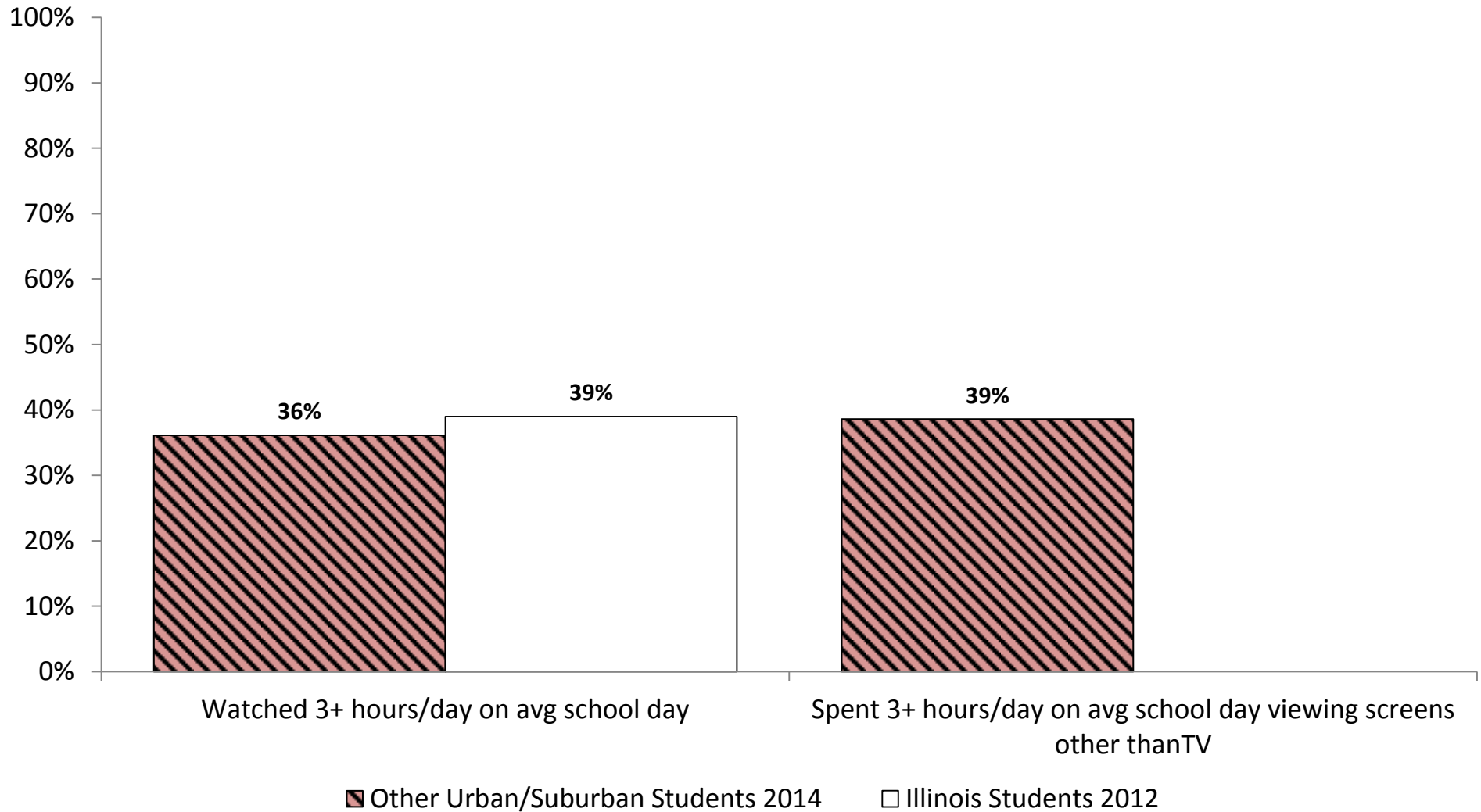


Sedentary Activity Among 6th Grade Youth

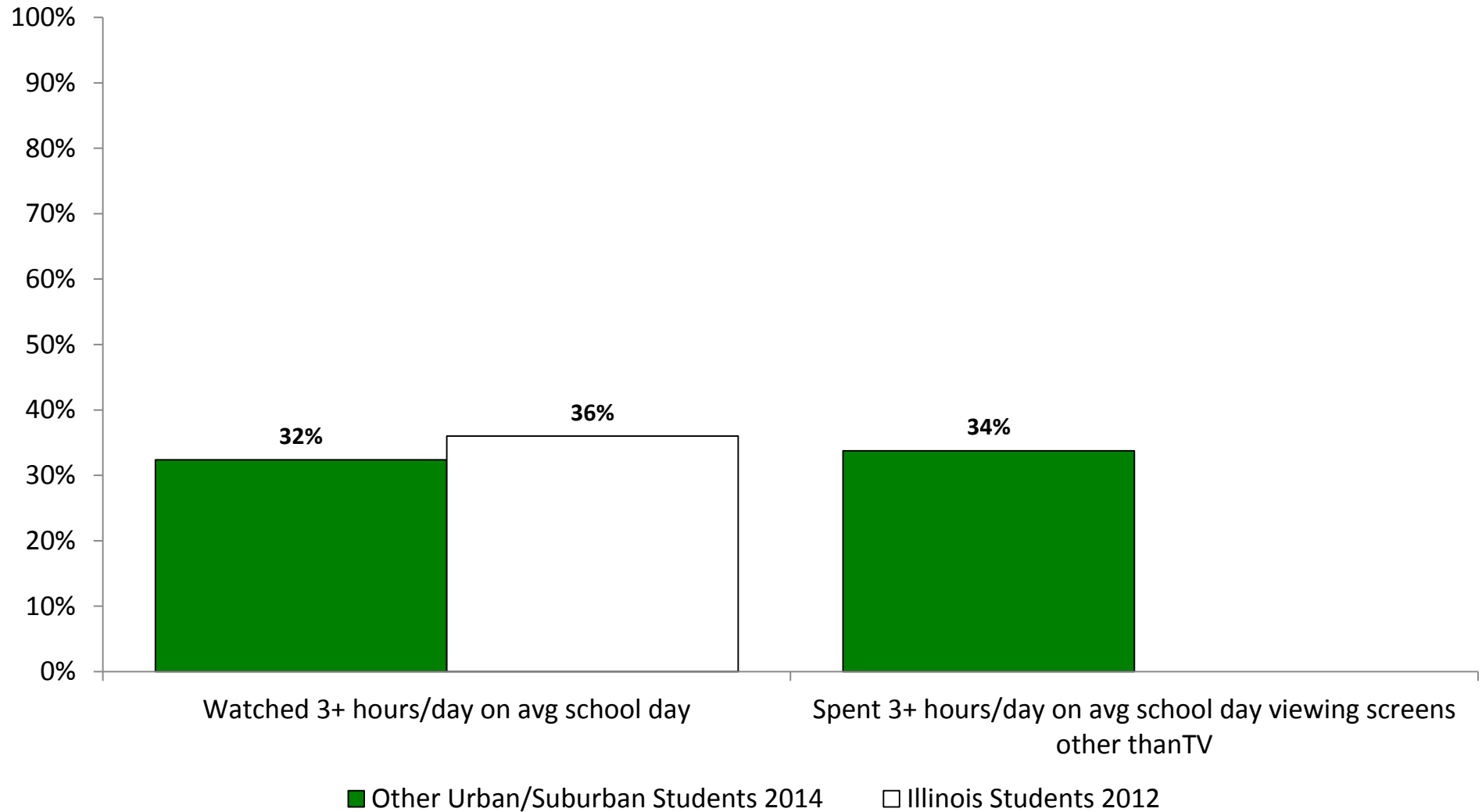
