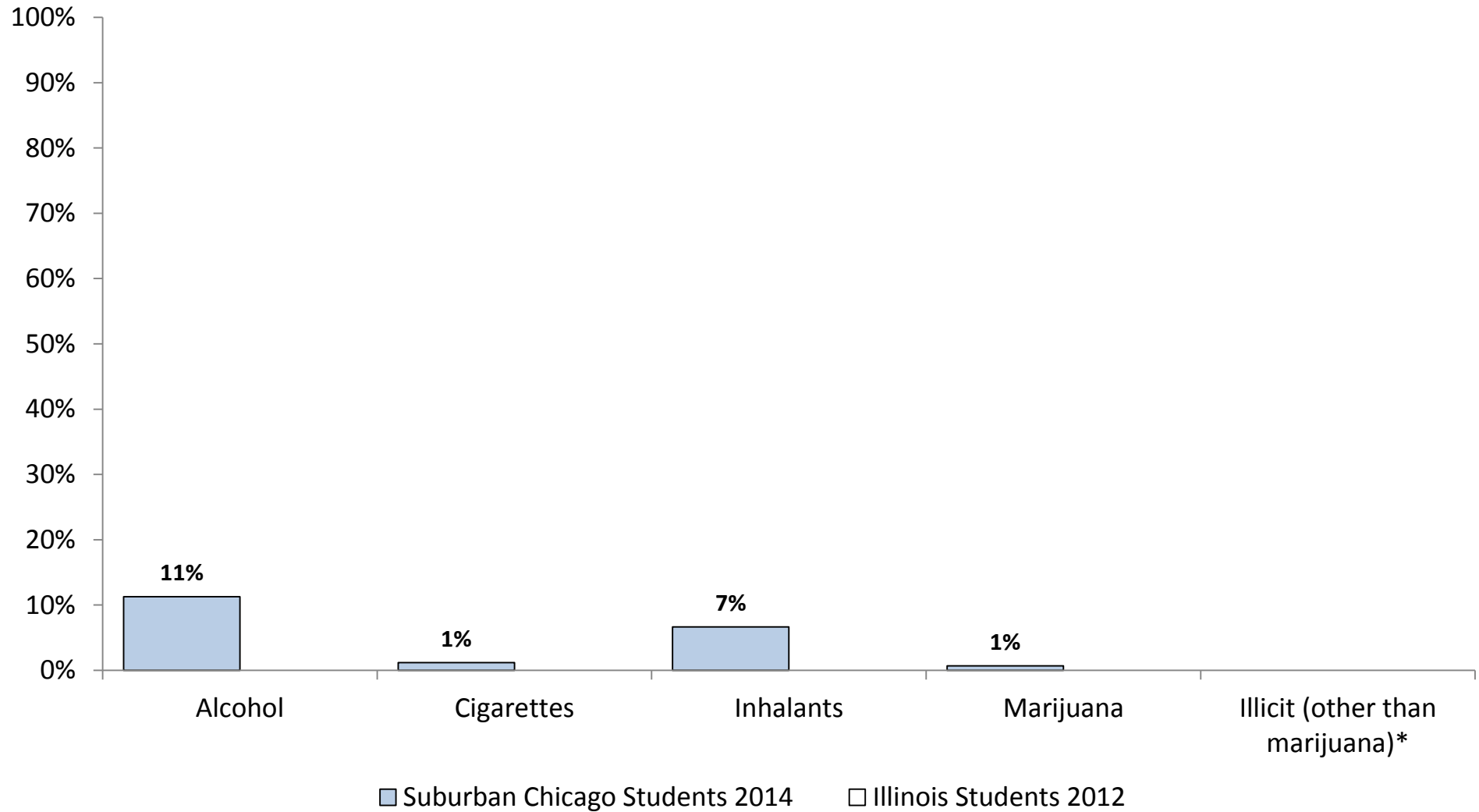

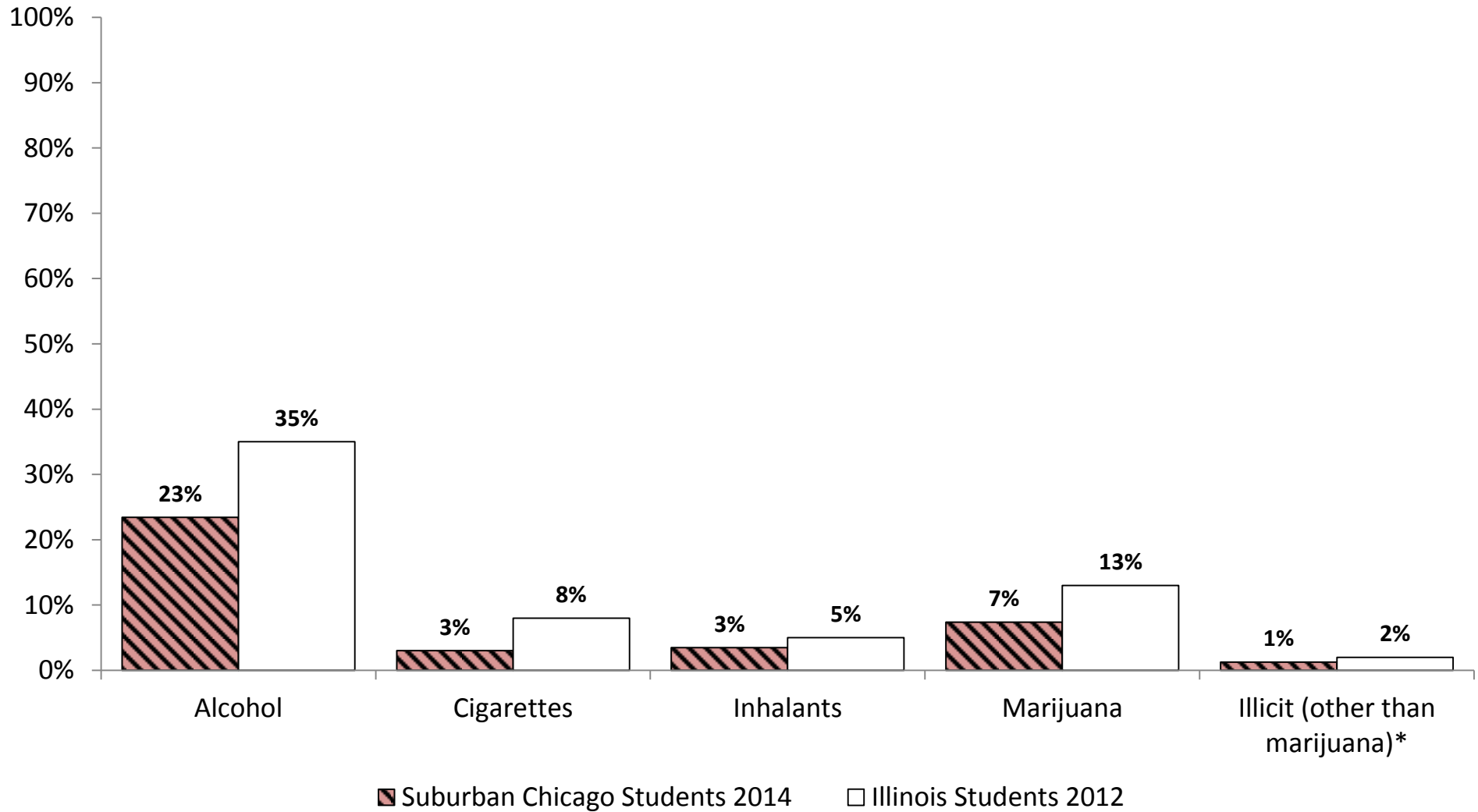

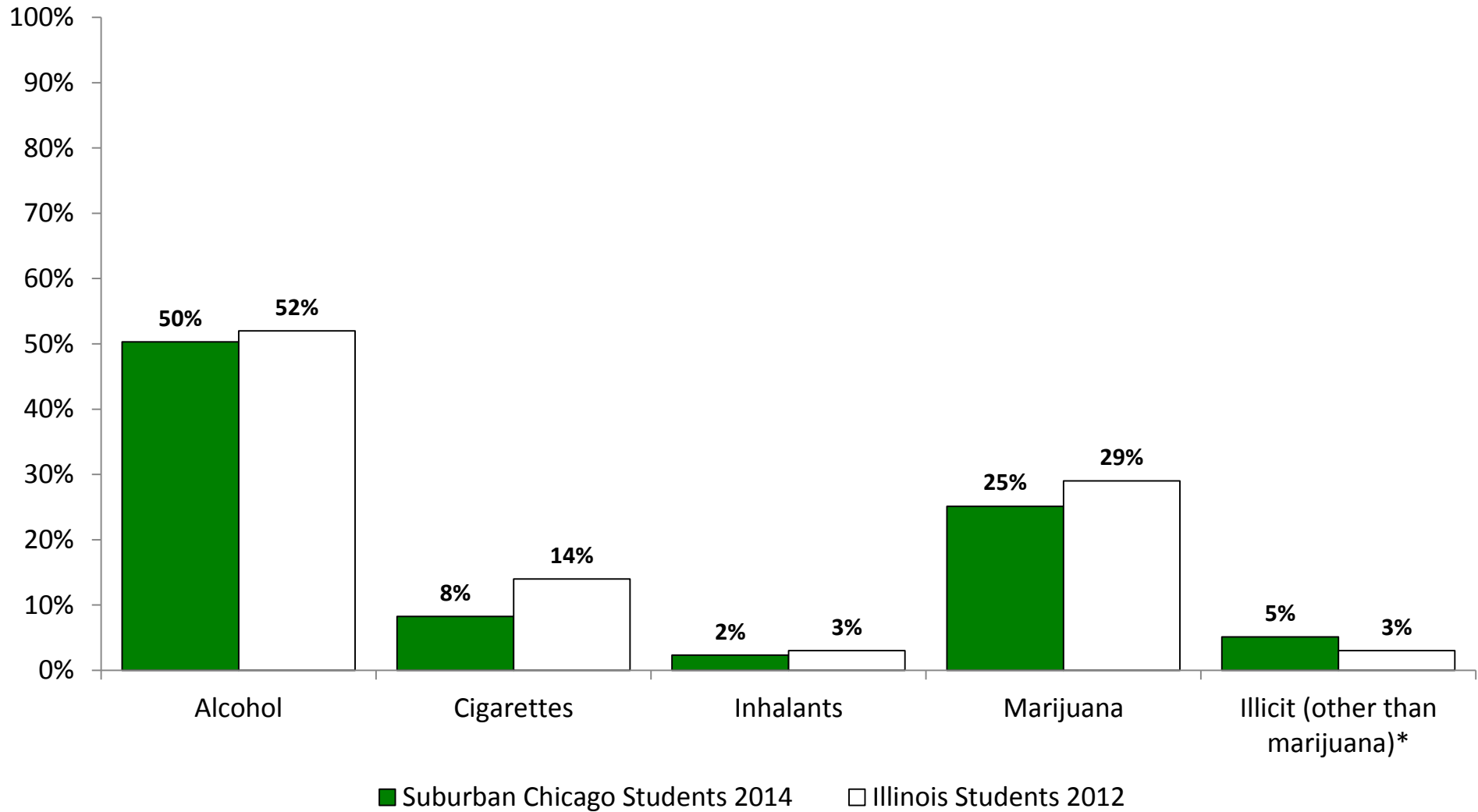
Among 8th Grade Youth

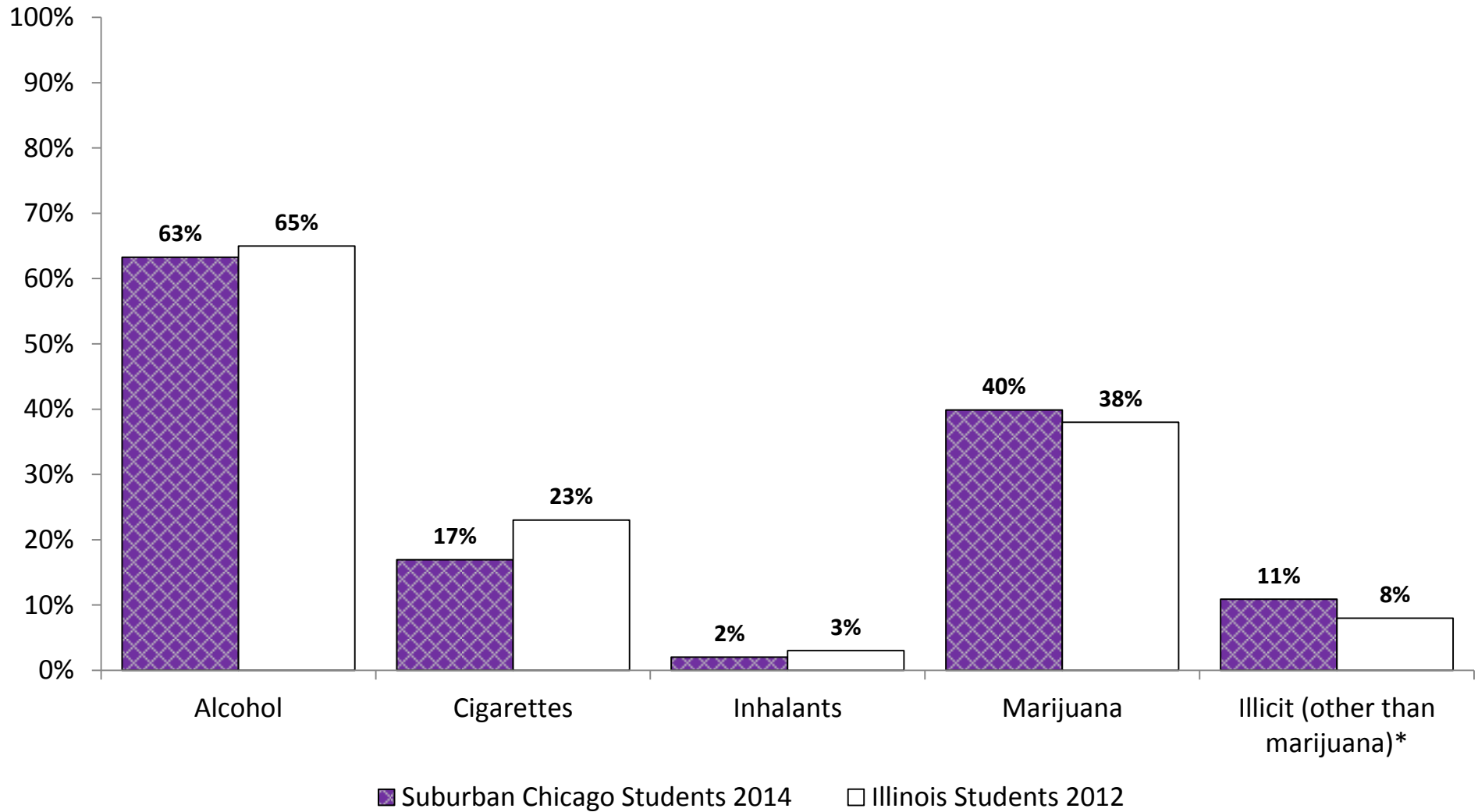
Among 10th Grade Youth

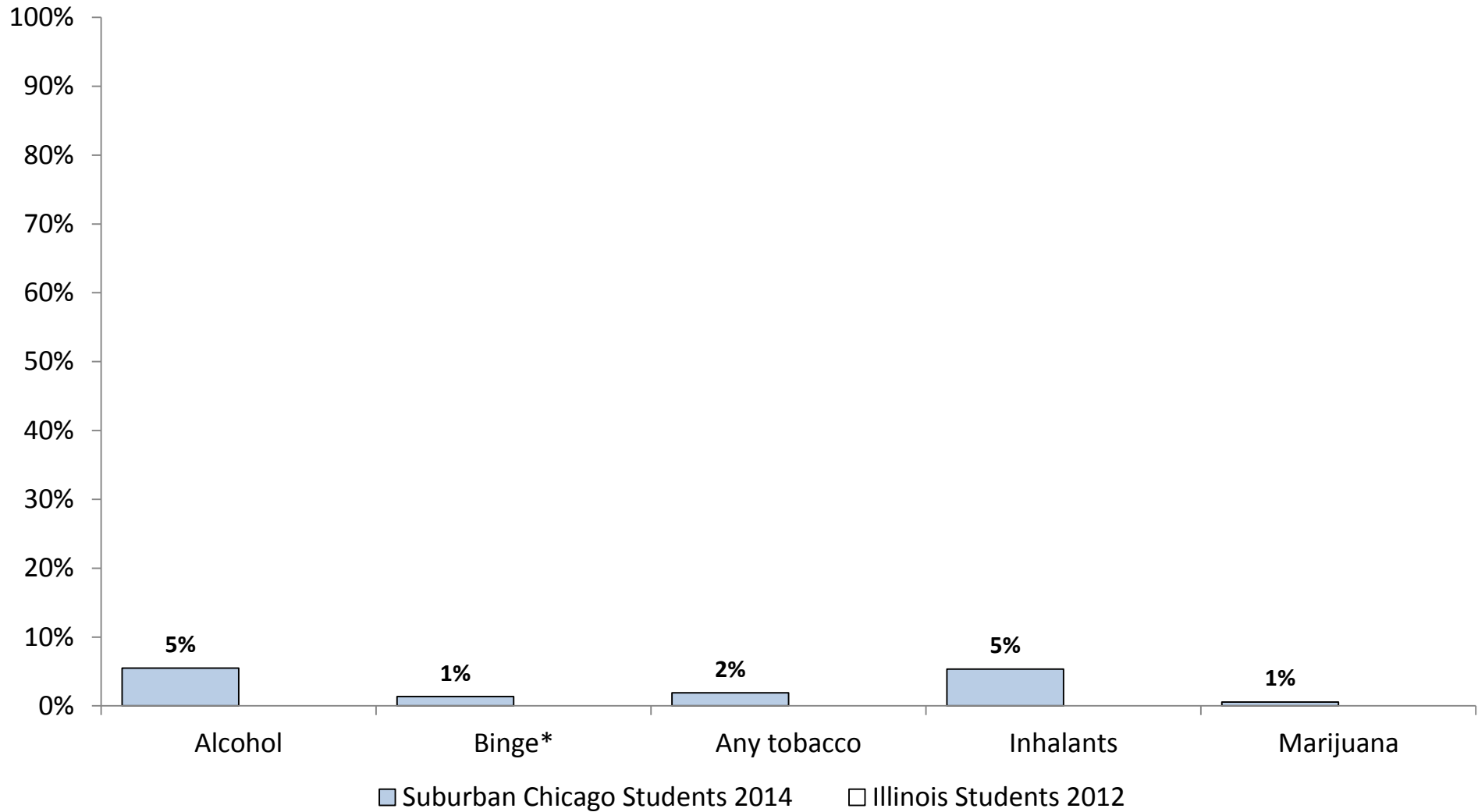

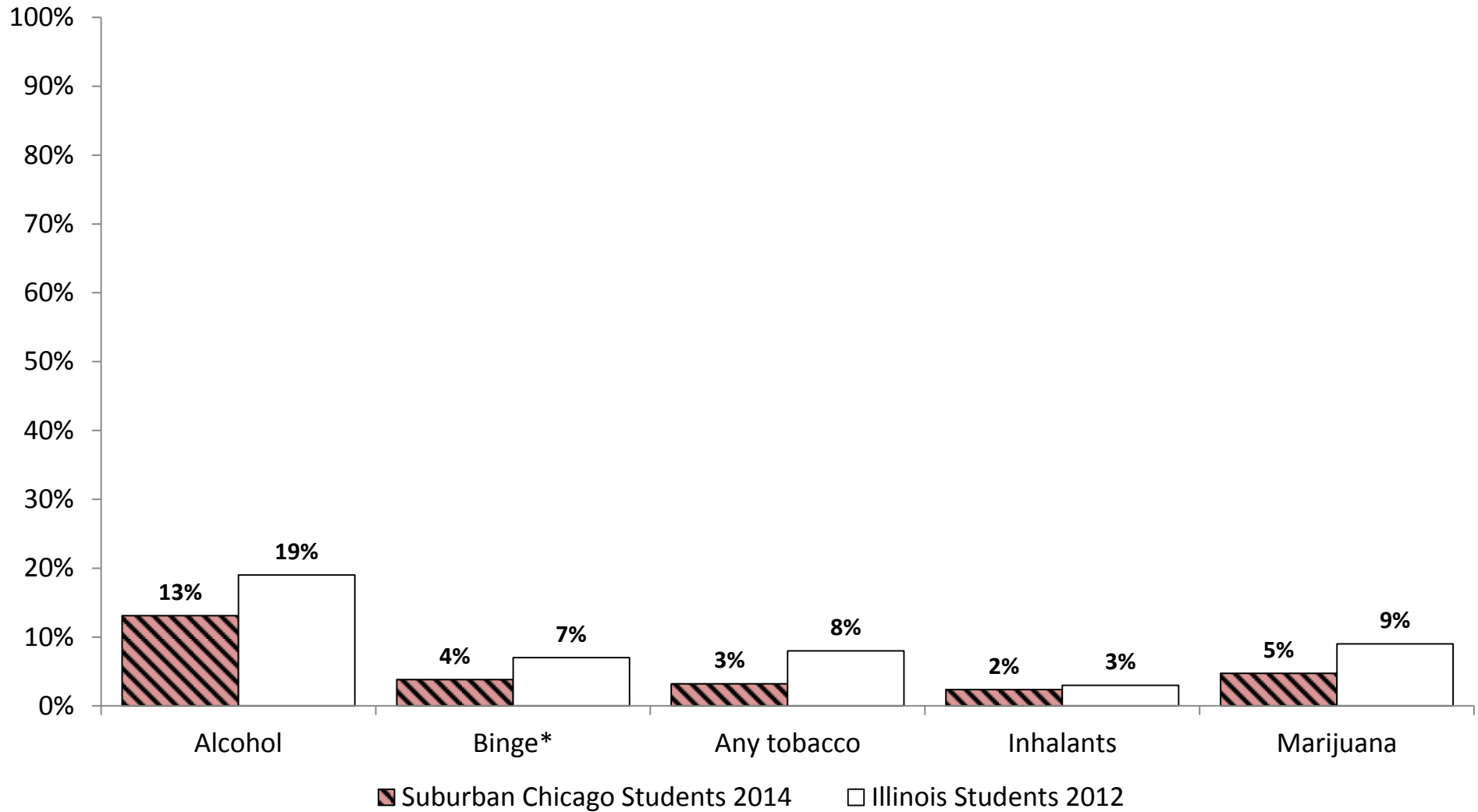
## Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 6th Grade Youth

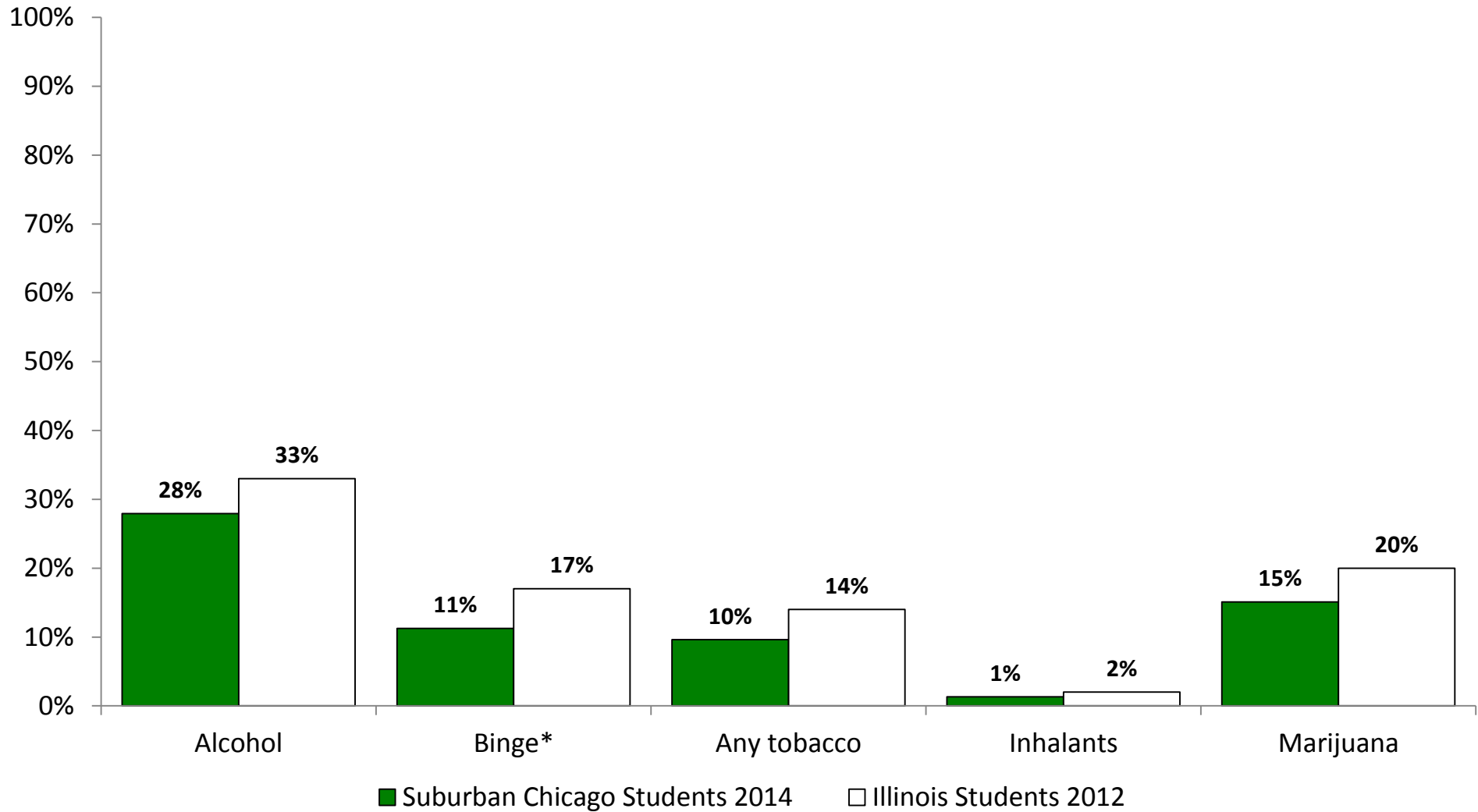
## Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 8th Grade Youth

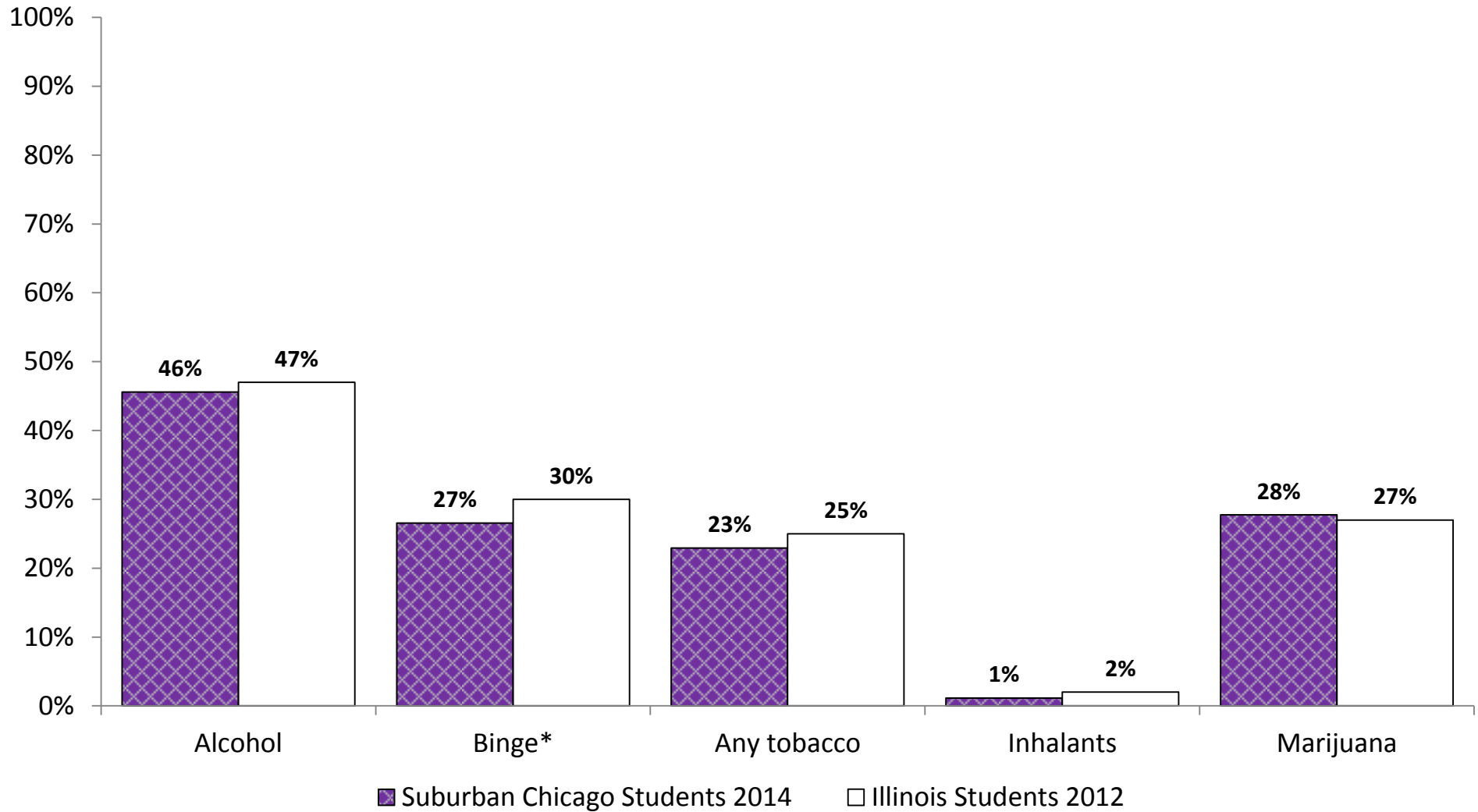
## Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 10th Grade Youth

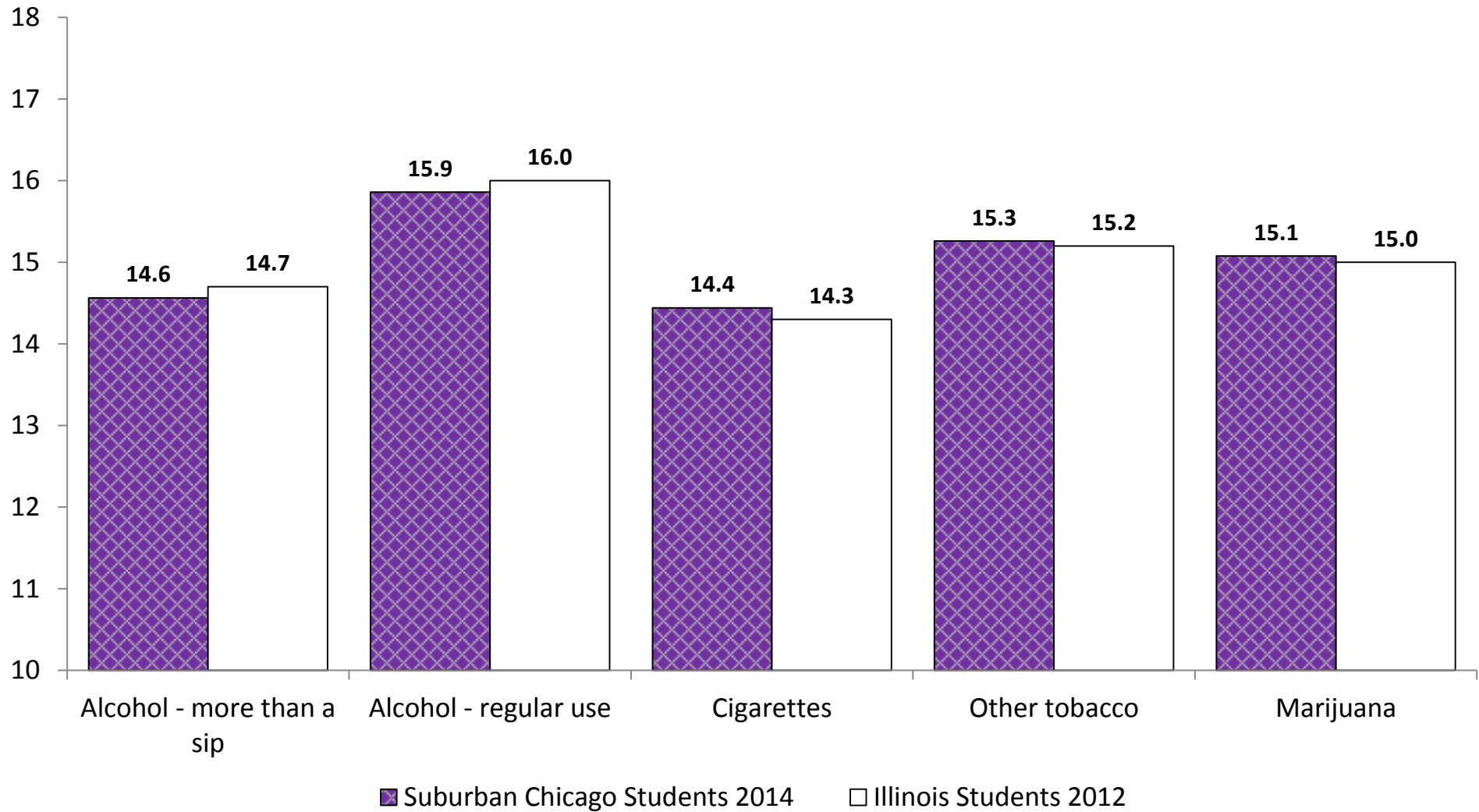

## Average Age of First Use

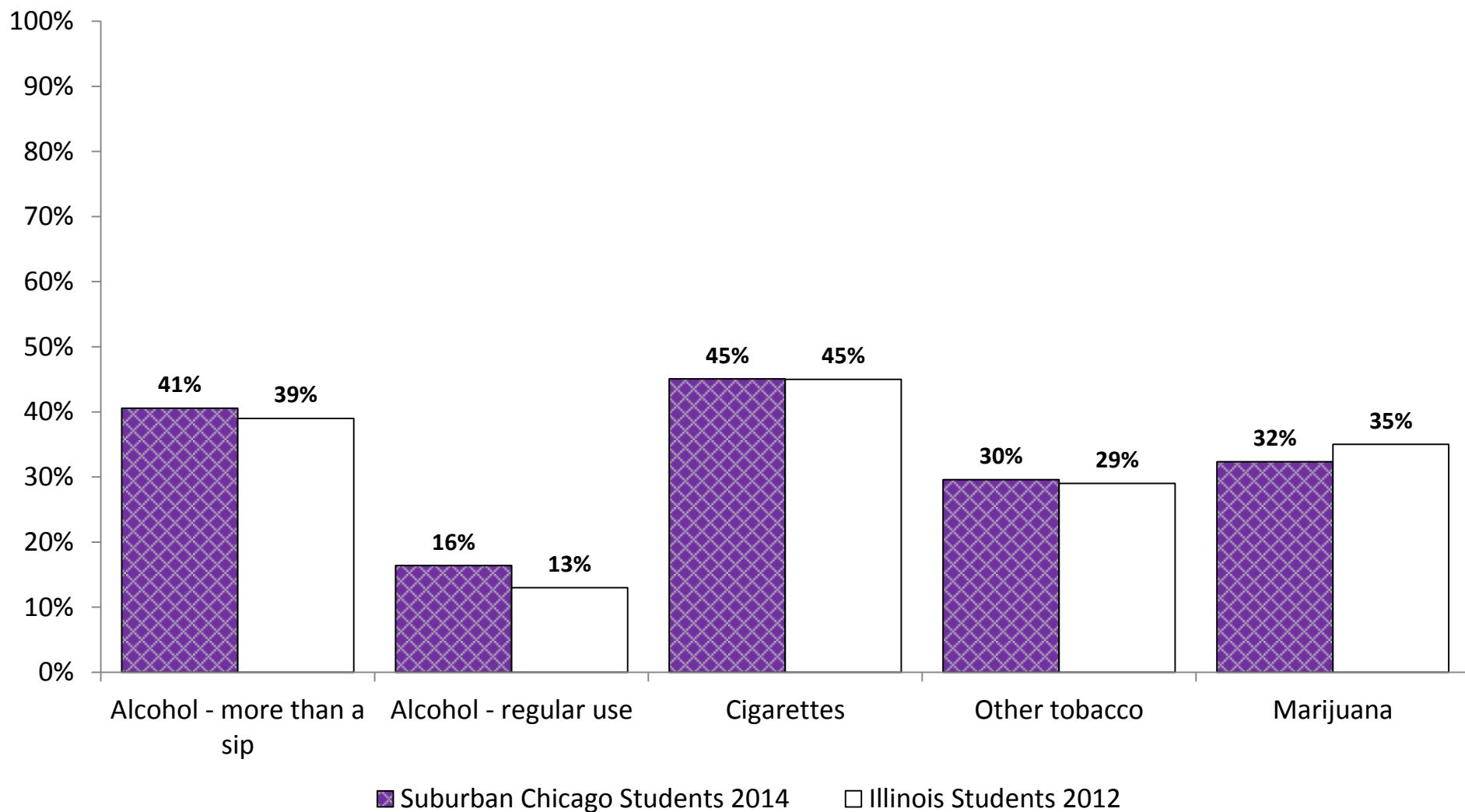

## First Use Before Age 15

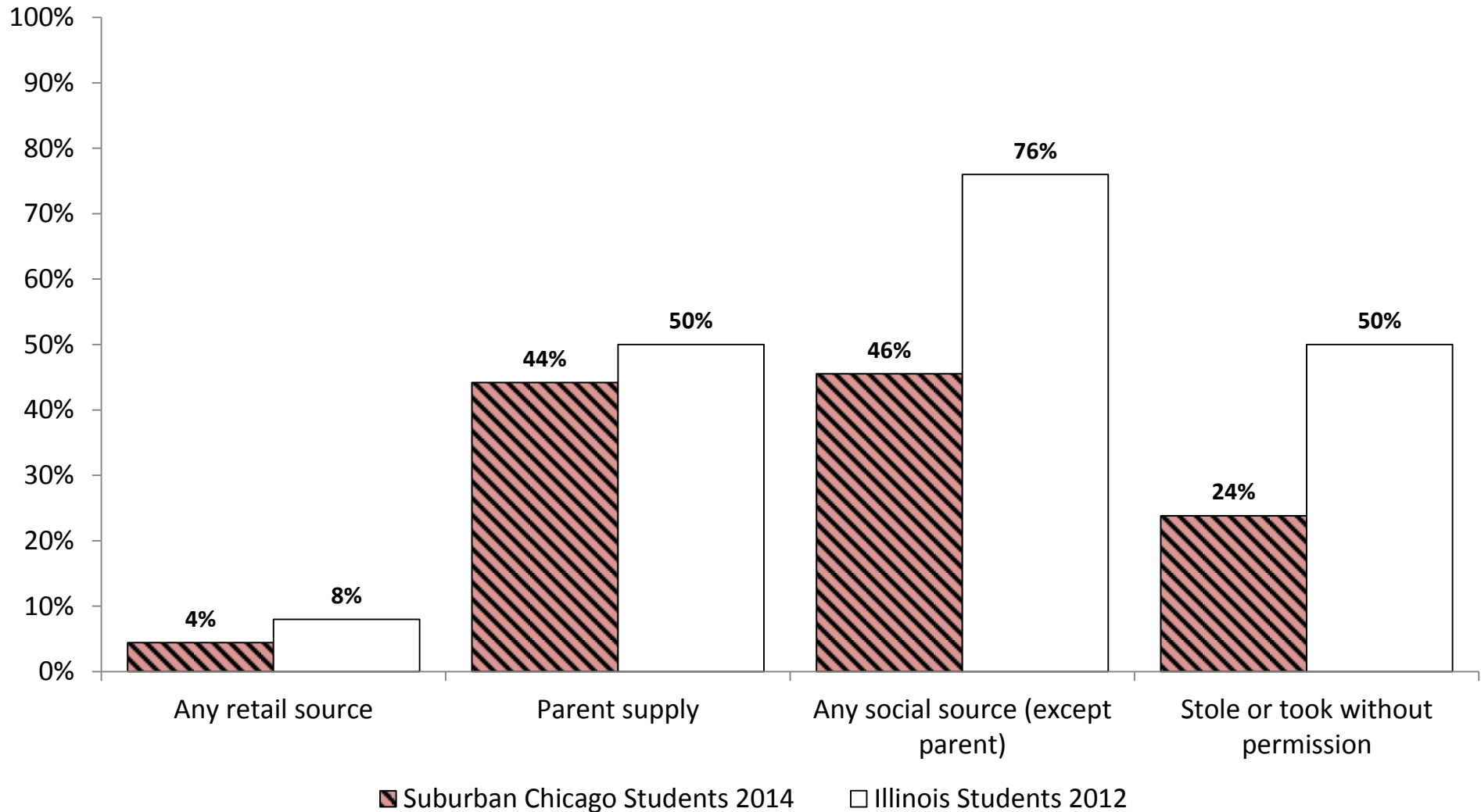

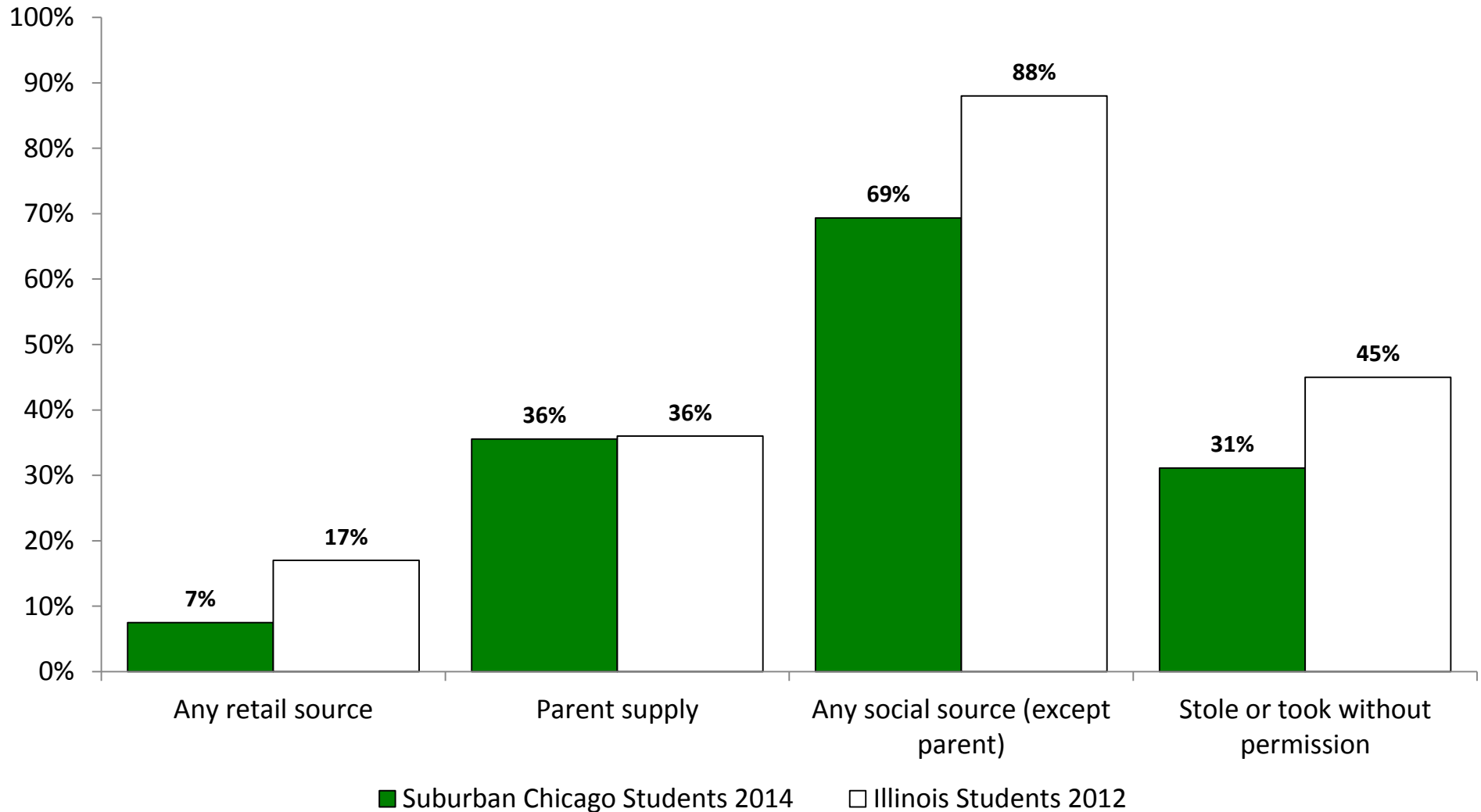

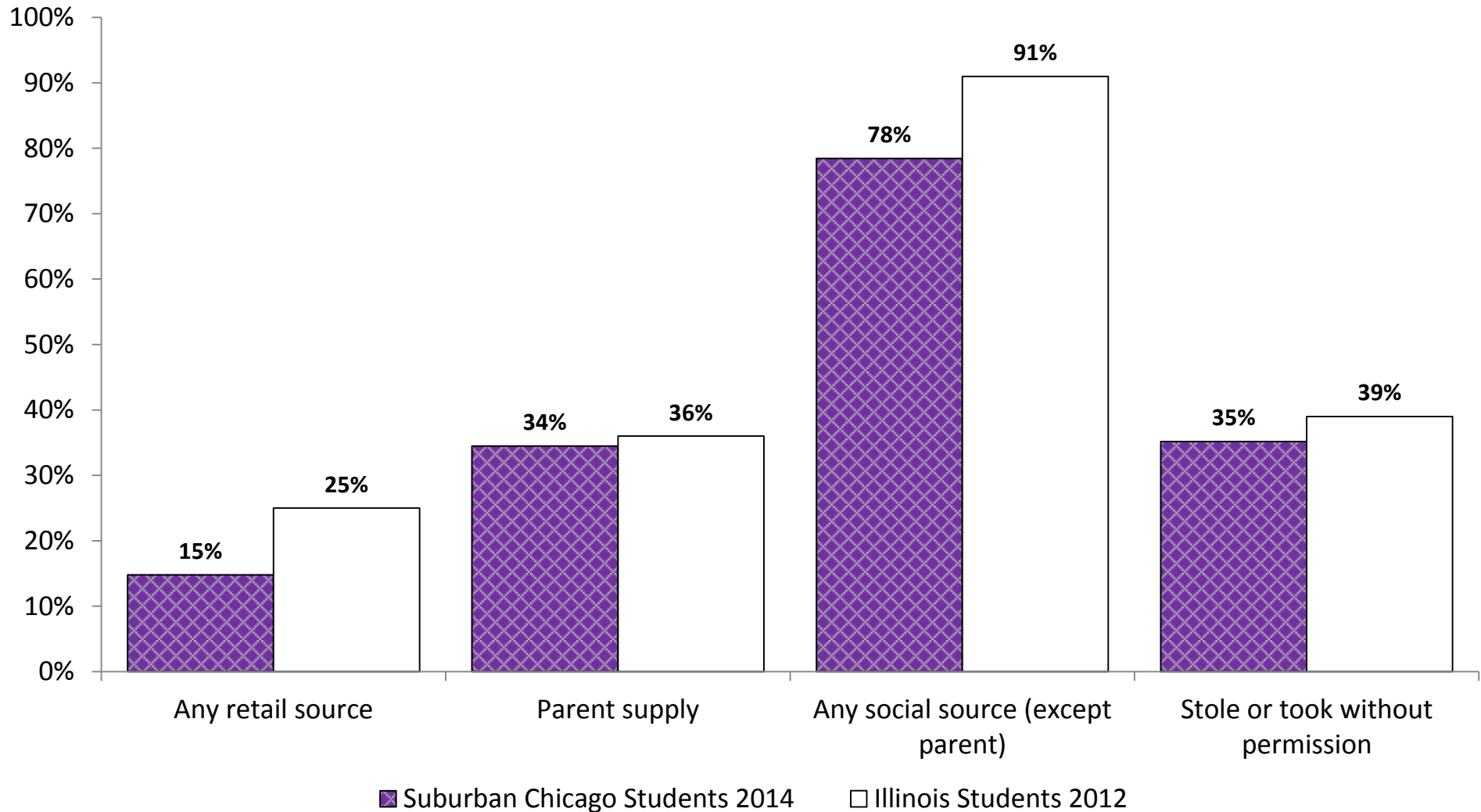

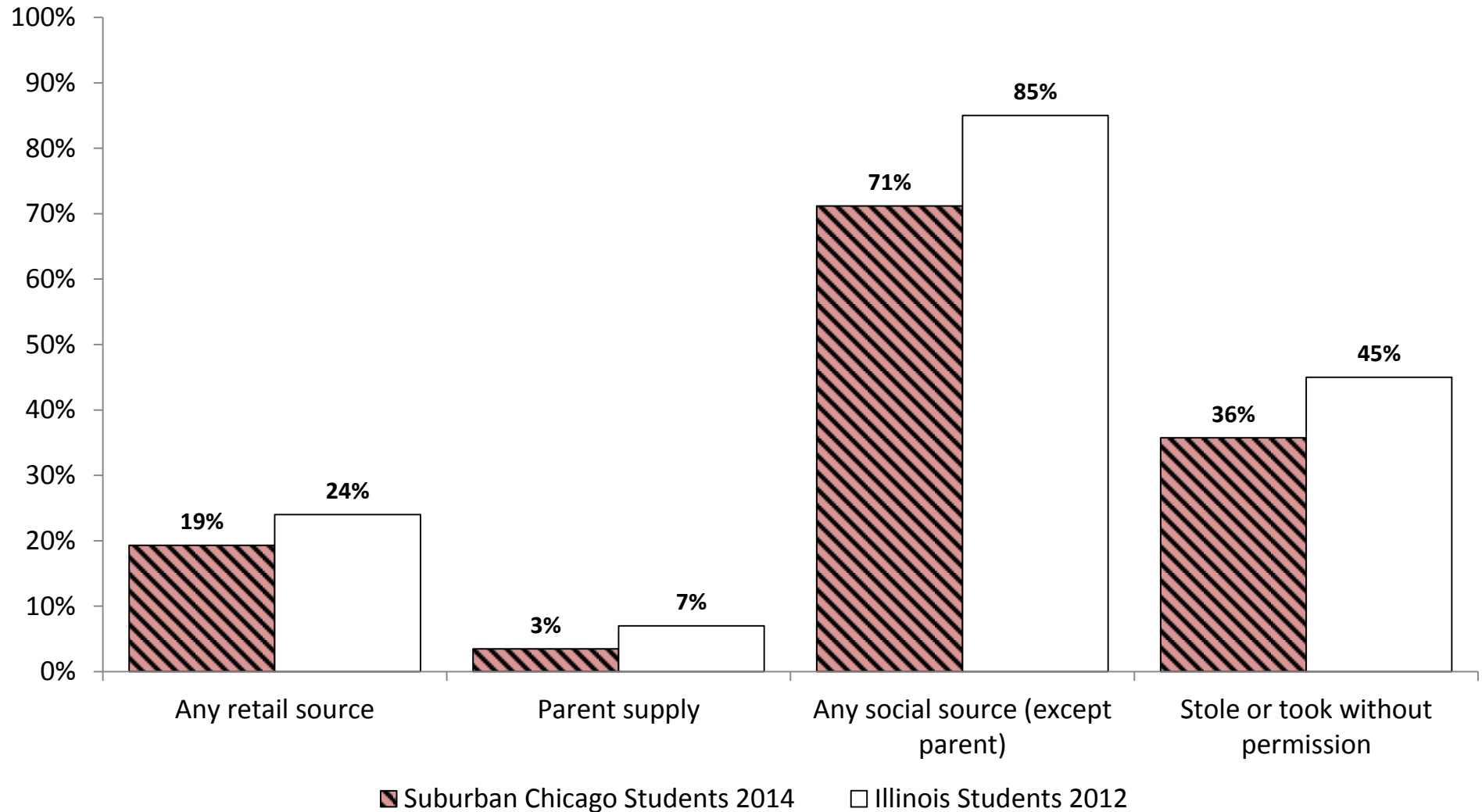

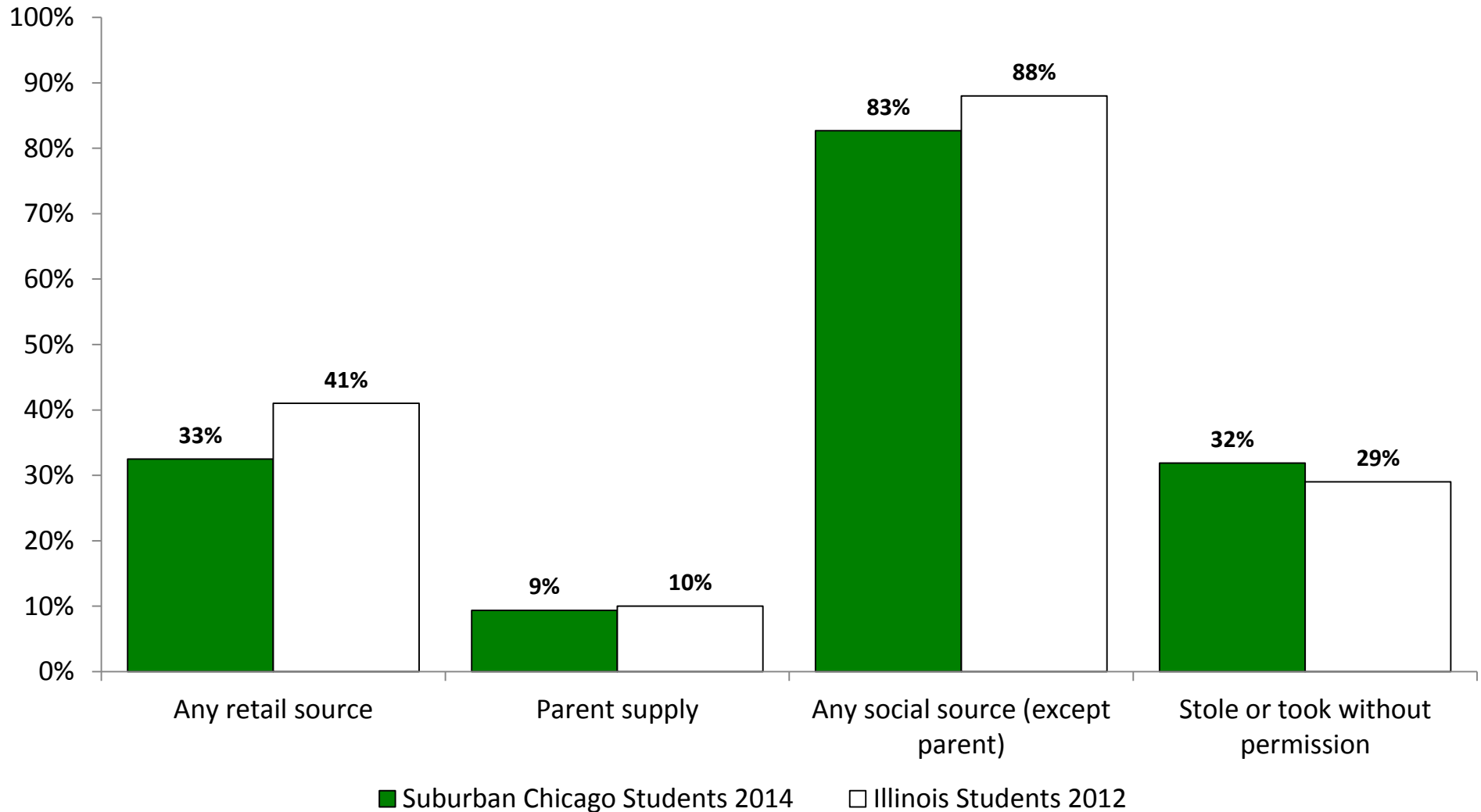

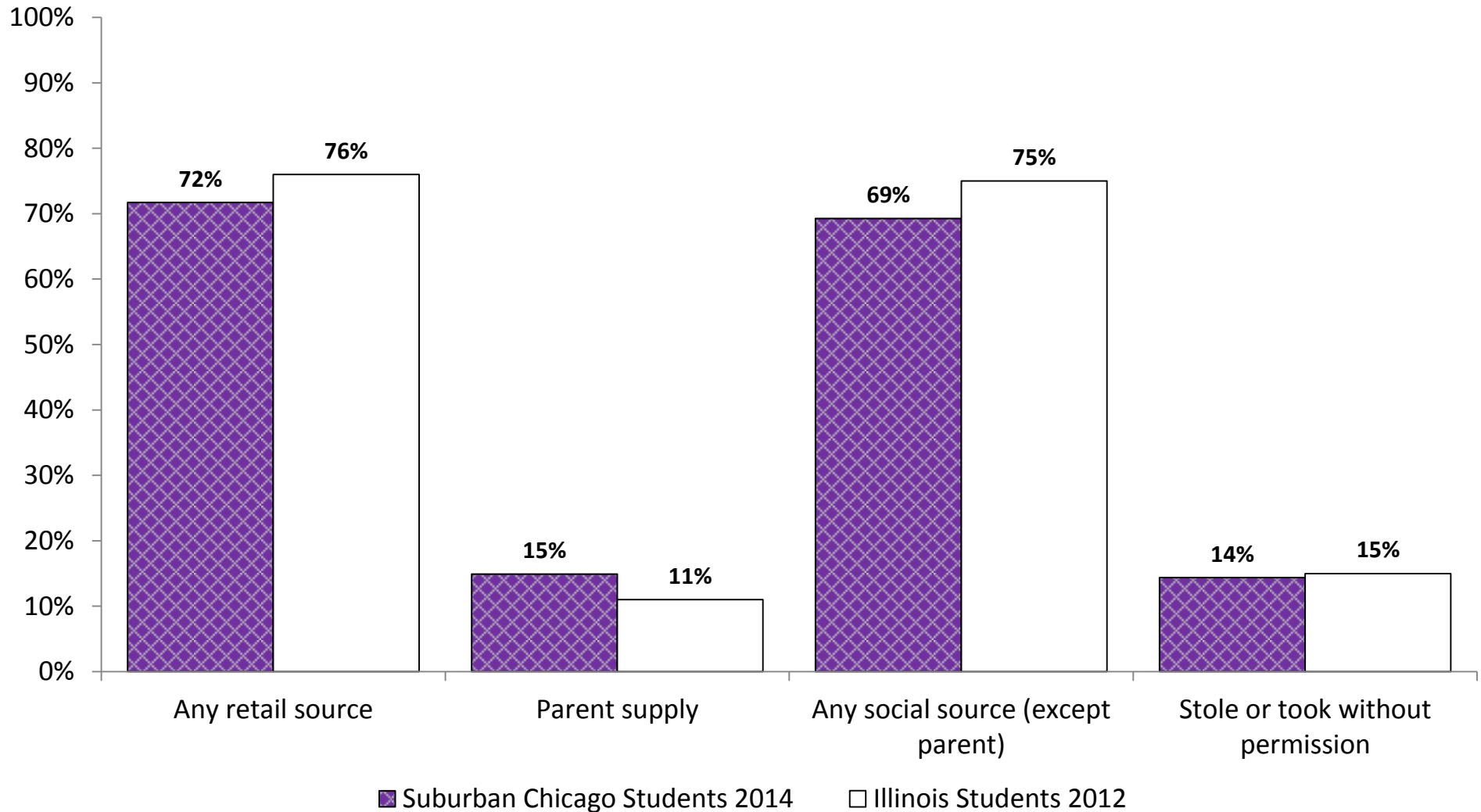

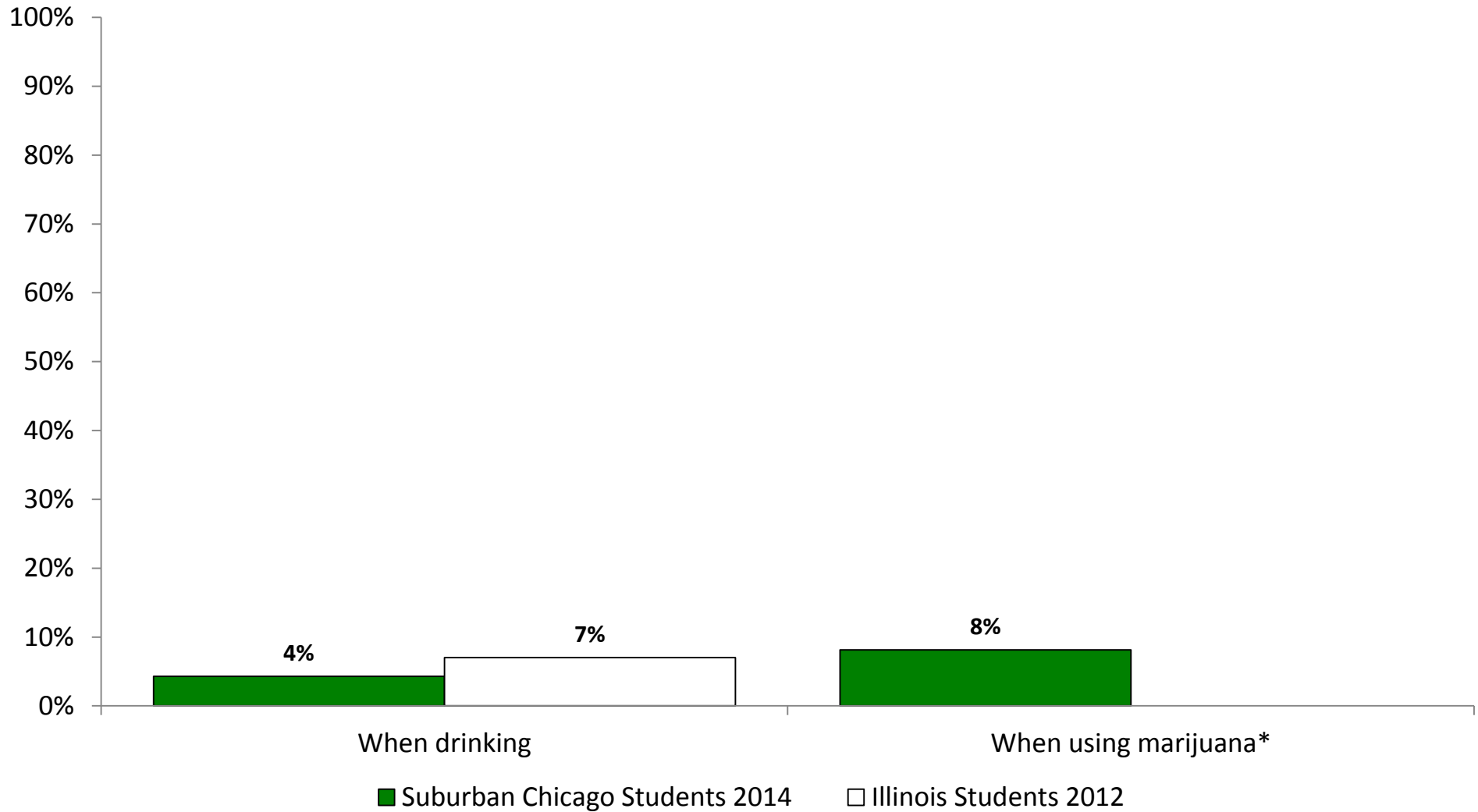
Among 12th Grade Tobacco Users\*

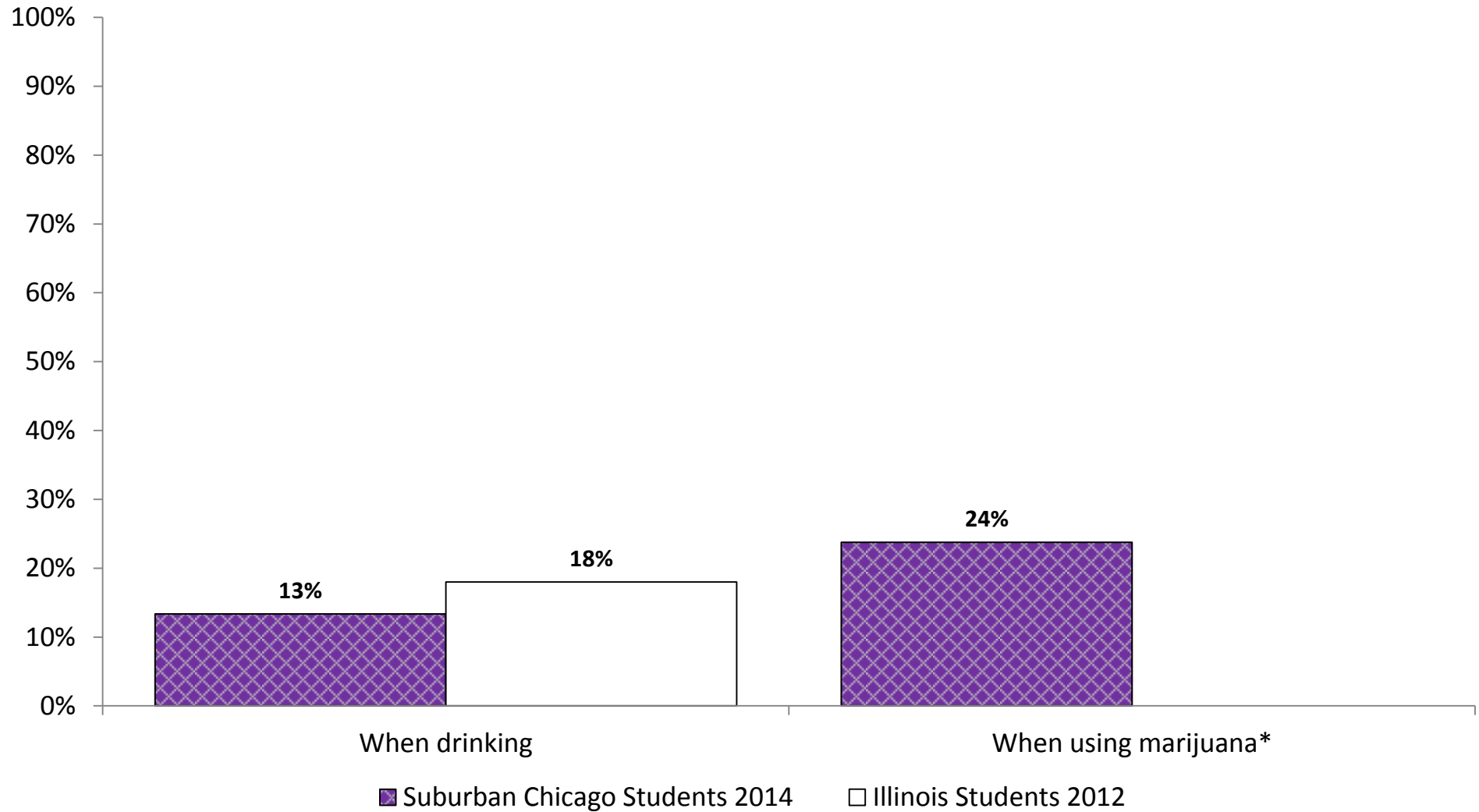
Among 10th Grade Youth

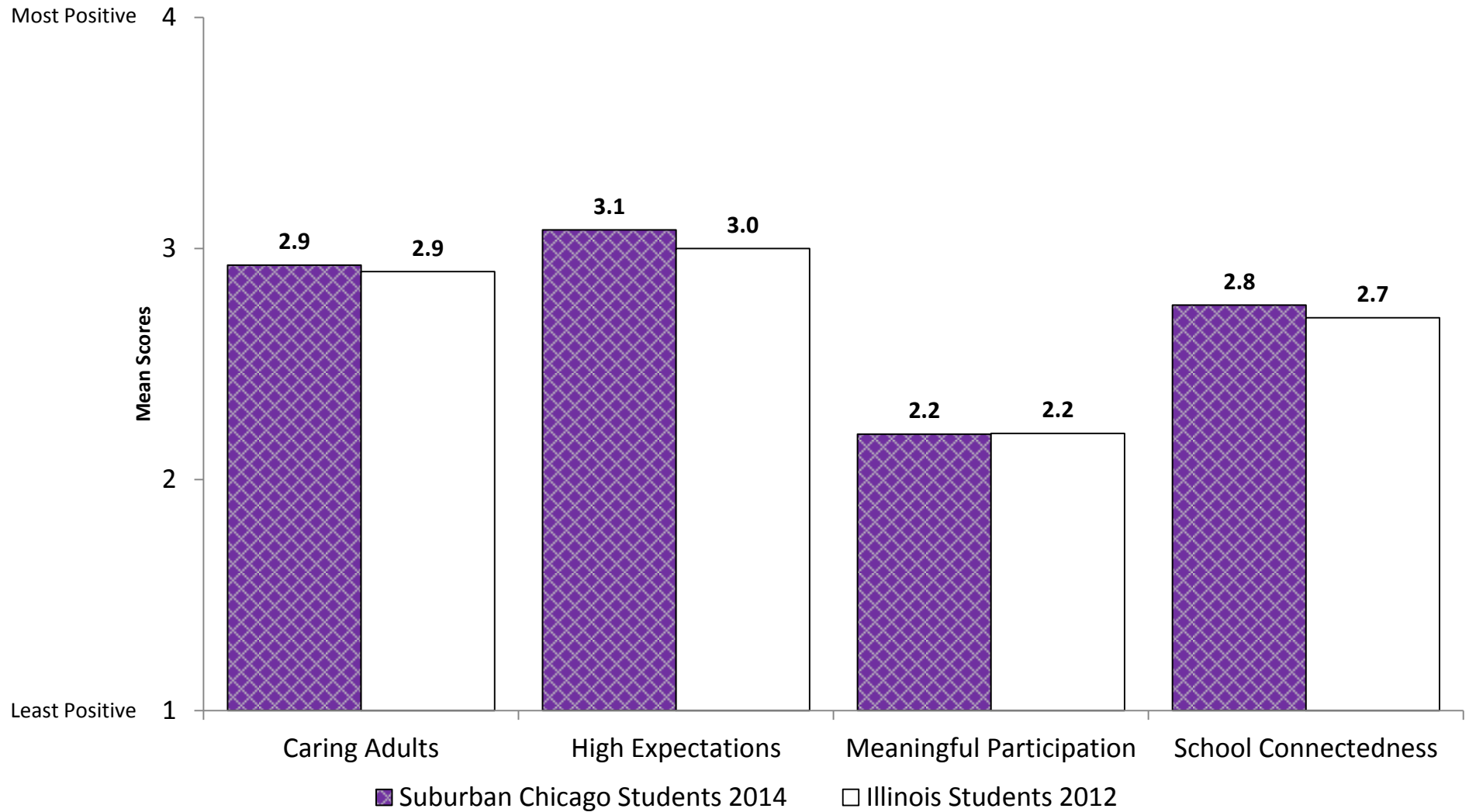

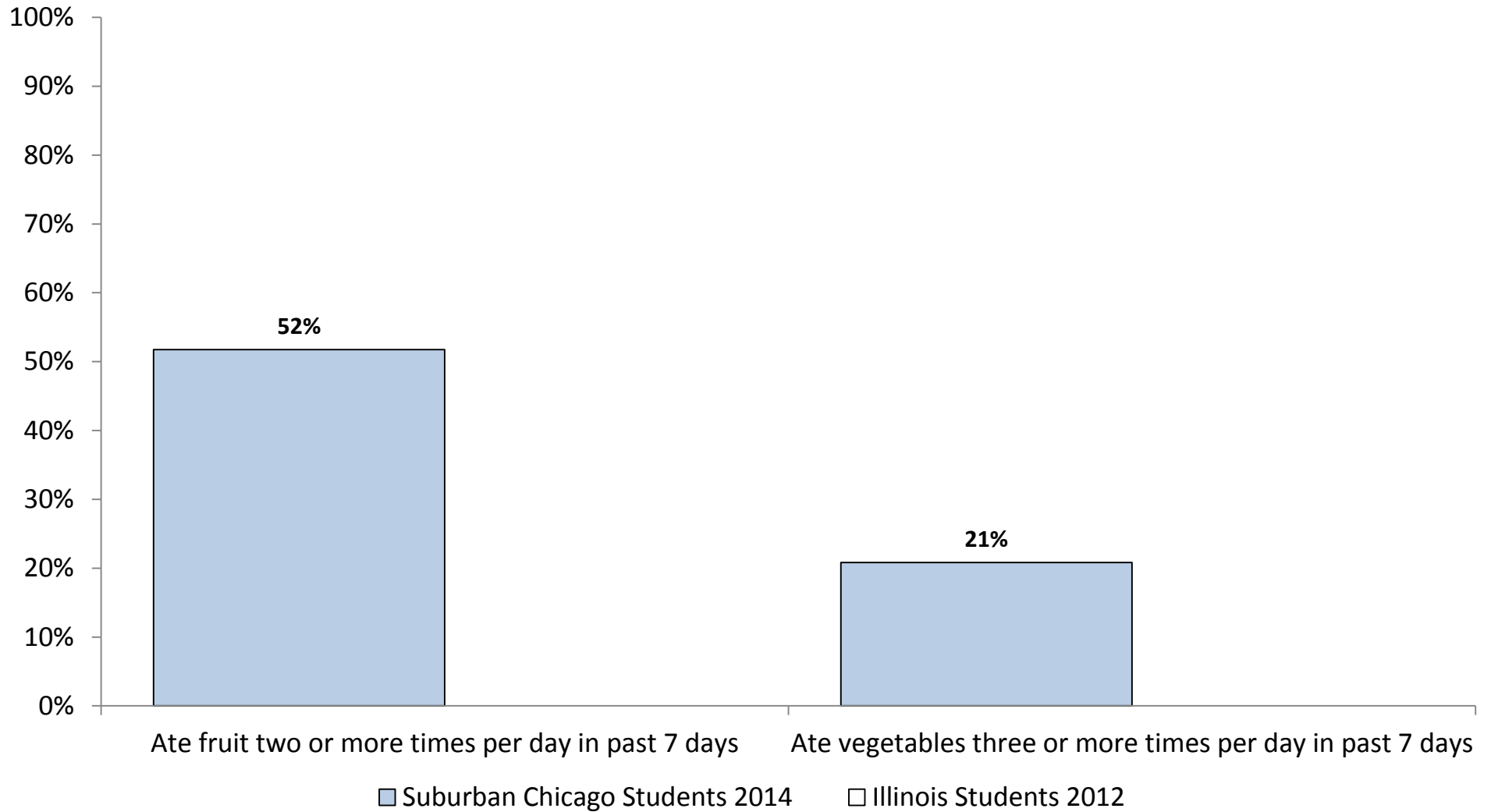

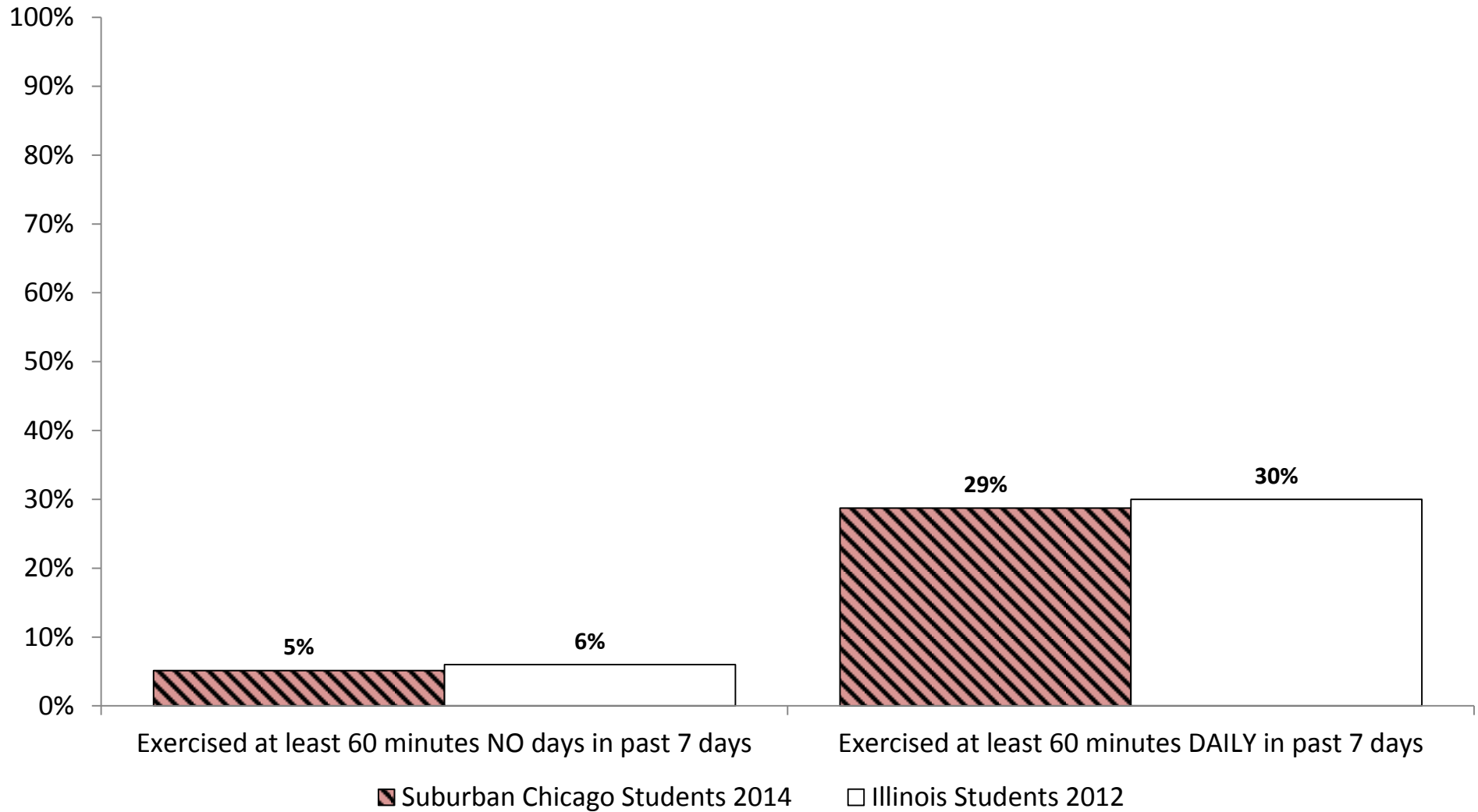


## Frequency of Physical Activity Among 6th Grade Youth



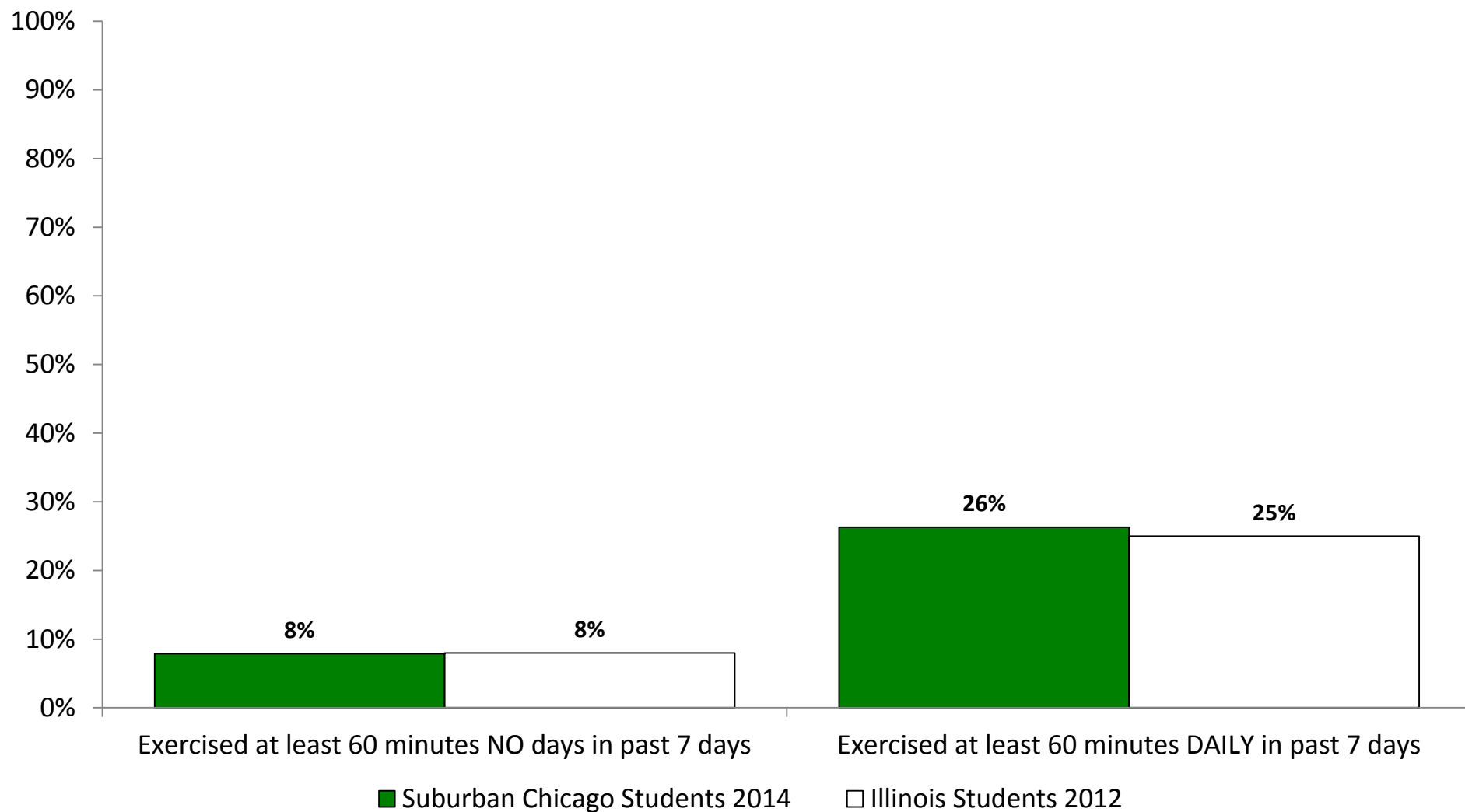
